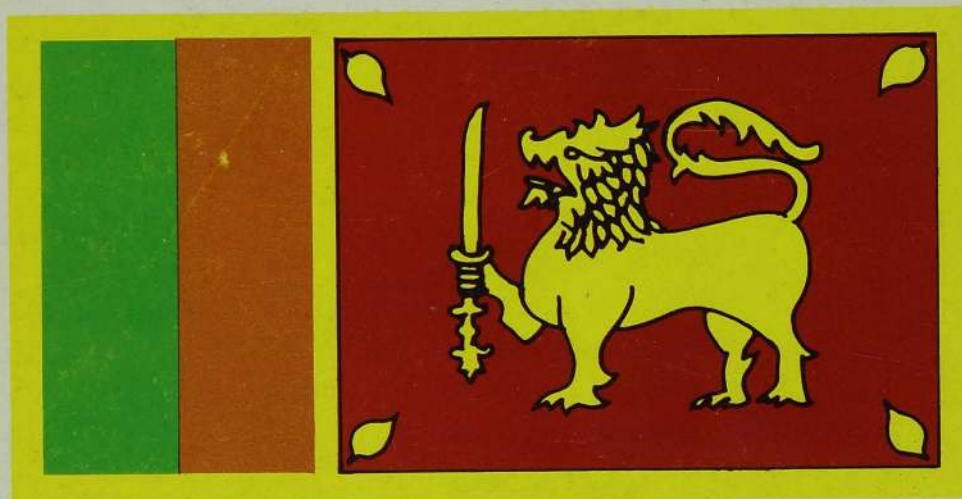

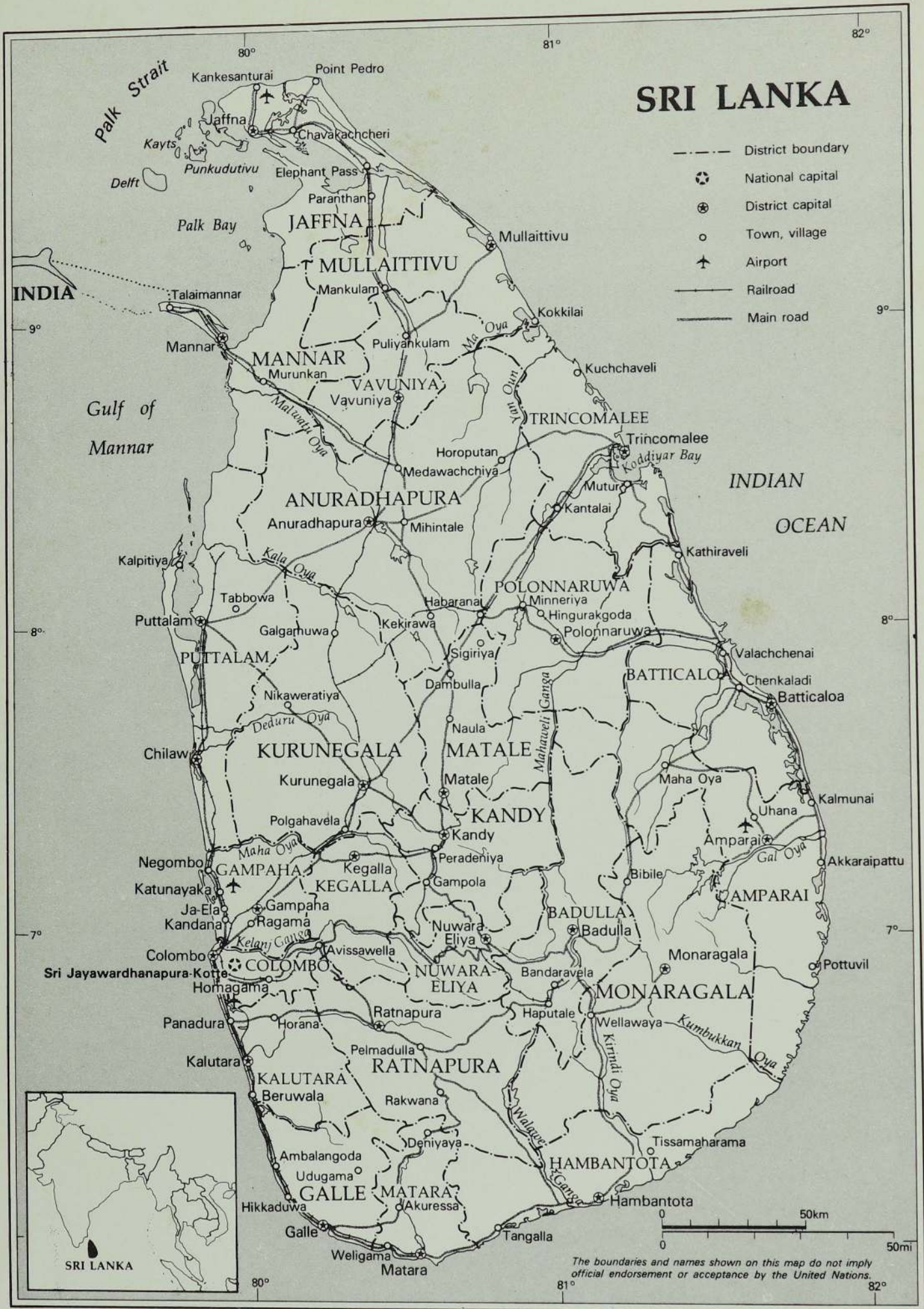

KEY DEFINITIONS

Beneficiary Institution -

The beneficiary institution is the institution receiving the assistance of the development activity. There may be several such beneficiary institutions for any one project. A recipient government department or ministry may be a beneficiary institution.

Commitment -

A commitment is a firm obligation expressed in an agreement or equivalent contract and supported by the availability of public funds, undertaken by the donor, to furnish assistance of a specified amount under agreed financial terms and conditions and for specific purposes, for the benefit of the recipient country.

Disbursements -

Disbursements represent the actual international transfer of financial resources. They may be recorded at one of several stages: provision of goods and services, placing of funds at the disposal of the recipient in an earmarked fund or account, payment by the donor of invoices on behalf of the recipient, etc.

Donor -

The origin of funds for development assistance (multilateral, bilateral and non-governmental organizations).

Grant -

A grant is the same as the provision of funds by a donor that do not require reimbursement from the recipient Government.

Loan -

The provision of resources, excluding food or other bulk commodities, for relief or development purposes, including import procurement programmes, which must be repaid according to conditions established at the time of the loan agreement or as subsequently agreed. Non-concessional loans which do not fall under the category of ODA (see below) are not included in the DCR.

Official Development Assistance (ODA) -

Official Development Assistance is defined as those flows to developing countries and multilateral institutions provided by official agencies, including state and local governments, or by their executive agencies, each transaction of which meets the following tests:

(a) ODA is administered with the promotion of the economic development and welfare of developing countries as its main objective;

(b) ODA is concessional in character and conveys a grant element of at least 25 per cent (calculated at a rate of discount of 10 per cent).

Reporting Year -

The reporting year corresponds to the year for which information is collected. The DCR collects and presents information for the preceding year. Thus, "The 1992 DCR" contains data for 1991.

Sector -

The substantive sector in which the project or activity has been classified using a standard classification system.

KEY DEFINITIONS

Types of Assistance:

- 1. Free-standing technical co-operation (FTC)** - The provision of resources aimed at the transfer of technical and managerial skills and know-how or of technology for the purpose of building up national capacity to undertake development activities, without reference to the implementation of any specific investment project(s). Free-standing technical co-operation includes pre-investment activities, such as feasibility studies, when the investment itself has not yet been approved or funding not yet secured. This category corresponds to the OECD/DAC category "technical co-operation".
- 2. Investment-related technical co-operation (ITC)** - The provision of resources directly aimed at strengthening the capacity to execute specific investment projects. Included under investment-related technical co-operation would be pre-investment type activities directly related to the implementation of an approved investment project. By definition, investment-related technical co-operation exists only if a parallel investment project exists. This category corresponds to the OECD/DAC category "technical assistance".
- 3. Investment project assistance (IPA)** - The provision of financing, in cash or in kind, for specific capital investment projects, i.e., projects that create productive capital which can generate new goods or services. Also known as capital assistance. Investment project assistance may have a technical co-operation component (in which case the code is IPT.)
- 4. Programme/budgetary aid or balance-of-payments support (PBB)** - The provision of assistance which is not cast in terms of specific investment or technical co-operation projects but which is instead provided in the context of broader development programme and macro-economic objectives and/or which is provided for the specific purpose of supporting the recipient's balance-of-payments position and making available foreign exchange. This category includes non-food commodity input assistance in kind and financial grants and loans to pay for commodity inputs. It also includes resources ascribed to public debt forgiveness.
- 5. Food Aid (FOA)** - The provision of edible human food for developmental purposes, including grants and loans for the purchase of food. Associated costs such as transport, storage, distribution, etc., are also included in this category, as well as donor-supplied, food-related items such as animal food and agricultural inputs related to food growing when these are part of a food aid programme.
- 6. Emergency and relief assistance (ERA)** - The provision of resources aimed at immediately relieving distress and improving the well-being of populations affected by natural or man-made disasters. Food aid for humanitarian and emergency purposes is included in this category. The focus of such assistance is humanitarian. Emergency and relief assistance is usually not related to national development efforts nor to enhancing national capacity. Therefore it does not constitute development co-operation.

INTRODUCTION

This Development Cooperation Report (DCR) has been prepared by the UNDP office in Sri Lanka for the third consecutive year, utilizing the computerized Development Cooperation Analysis System (DCAS) received from UNDP Headquarters. This report attempts to give an overview of the development cooperation provided to Sri Lanka by way of Official Development Assistance (ODA), Emergency and Relief Assistance, and assistance from external Non-governmental Organizations (NGOs) for the year 1991.

We believe that donors and all other users of this report will gain a more comprehensive and integrated picture of the multiple aid-flows to Sri Lanka. It should also facilitate UNDP's role in providing information on development issues, problems and prospects to all concerned users within and outside Sri Lanka.

Data for the DCR was obtained from the multilateral and bilateral donors and external NGOs by forwarding to them printed project profiles and two questionnaires, as described in the Sources and Methodology Section.

The Report consists of three major parts. The first part provides background information on the country, the second briefly discusses the trends in aid flows over the past 9 years, and the third gives summary tables and a detailed inventory of all external assistance projects.

Though we wish to present a complete and accurate picture in this report, there are unfortunately gaps resulting from the incompleteness of data. However, we wish to record that the response from the NGO community has greatly improved this year.

Finally, the UNDP wishes to acknowledge with thanks the cooperation extended by the donor community in the preparation of the 1991 DCR. We are most appreciative of the manner in which the donor agencies cooperated in spite of the difficulties they themselves experienced in providing the data in the form we had requested.

SOURCES AND METHODOLOGY

The method of data collection adopted this year was similar to that in last year. The standard questionnaire was used for the collection of data of all new projects. In respect of ongoing projects, the information currently in the database was made available to the donors so as to enable them to update and return same. A record of the total disbursements made by each donor for 1991 was obtained through the Donor Profile Questionnaire which provided a useful aggregate check on the information obtained via the standard questionnaire on external assistance.

The requests for information were sent out to 14 multilateral, and 18 bilateral donors and 26 NGOs on 14th May 1992. This was followed by letters to donors, telephone contacts and visits to local offices of donors, where required. A total of 37 donors and NGOs responded to the questionnaire.

While the majority of donors provided the information directly to UNDP, Colombo a few donors, such as Australia, Canada, Denmark and Finland opted to provide the information centrally to UNDP Headquarters. While the information on Finnish ODA received by our Headquarters consisted of only country totals the Finnish Embassy in Sri Lanka provided us with sufficient data which made it possible for us to include same in the DCR.

Some donors have provided data in their national currency. The currency exchange rates used were the official United Nations monthly weighted averages for 1991. The relevant exchange rates used in the DCR are given in Page No 5.

The classification of projects by type refers to the nature of the assistance provided and the types of assistance available in the DCAS are limited to six. Since 'social service' is not included among them, even though a major part of the NGO assistance falls under this category, we were compelled to classify such NGO assistance under the type 'Free-standing technical co-operation'. The classification of projects into different DCR sectors was also subjective in a number of cases where more than one sector was involved. Whenever the project remained unclassified, it was classified by the UNDP based on the description of the project.

While the target date for the final distribution of the DCR has been stipulated as 31st July, due to the problems we have experienced in receiving the required information on time, it was not possible for us to keep to this target date.

managed by a Chief Minister and a Board of Ministers chosen from the elected members of the Councils. The Chief Secretary functions as the principal civil officer of the Province.

At the local level, there are the 289 elected divisional councils (Pradeshiya Sabhas), elected urban local authorities (Municipal and Urban Councils), and the 14,765 village organizations (Gramodaya Mandalayas) functioning at the village level. The administrative authority of the central government is vested in a Divisional Secretary of each Division, a position which is progressively assuming the role of the former district-level Government Agent, although at a distinctly lower level of the government structure.

■ SECTION 2 - ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL FACTORS

The economic performance of Sri Lanka during the year under review was encouraging compared to the period 1987-89, though not as satisfactory as in 1990. Real output increased. Though terms of trade showed mixed results, the balance of payment was in surplus, and the country's international financial situation improved. The high rate of inflation in 1990 slowed in the course of 1991.

The slower pace of the recovery of the economy in 1991 compared to the performance in 1990 was largely due to a range of factors - such as the fall of export prices, impact of the Gulf Crisis and the effects of changes taking place in Eastern Europe and the former Soviet Union. The external factors together with the continuing conflicts in the North and East of the country between the Government and the Liberation Tigers of Eelam (LTTE) and a spate of unfavourable weather in 1991 slowed down the performance of the economy compared to 1990. Nevertheless the economy continued to grow at a commendable rate of 4.8 per cent in 1991 (as against 6.2 % in 1990) showing the resilience of the economy.

● SECTORAL PERFORMANCE

The Sector performance shows that the impetus for economic expansion came especially in the early 1980s from agriculture and through out the 1980s from manufacturing and service sectors. Over the last few years, however, the manufacturing and the service sectors have come in to sharp prominence as the leading growth sectors.

The **Manufacturing Sector** with nearly 7 per cent growth rate in 1991 was the most dynamic sector. The growth momentum has come entirely from the private sector where the output increased by 14 per cent as against the public sector which registered an output decline of 8 per cent. Factory production, especially export oriented garments and textiles, has been increasingly dominant. In spite, of the consistent favourable growth of the manufacturing sector since the late 1970s, it still accounts for only 18 per cent of the GDP and has not made a major structural change in the economy.

The **Service Sector** continues to be the dominant contributor to the GDP accounting for an average of around 50 per cent of the GDP. The most significant contribution to the sector's 6.1 per cent growth in 1991 came from the hotel services (+14.0%), banking and financial services (+7.8%),

electricity, gas, water and sanitation services (+7.8%), trade (+ 7.3%) and transportation (+5.9%).

The performance of the **Agricultural and Mining Sectors** in 1991 was relatively poor in contrast to 1990 when agriculture was the major push for the high economic performance of that year. 1991 saw a decline in the output of paddy, coconut, rubber and several minor food and export crops due largely to the unfavourable weather conditions. However, tea and sugar reached record levels of production ever achieved. The increase in tea came entirely from the private sector small holdings of the low elevation areas. The performance of minor export crops was mixed with pepper, nutmeg and cinnamon showing an uptrend, and cloves, cardamon, cocoa and cashew production declining. Considering the importance of the agricultural sector in Sri Lanka's GDP (approximately 25%), export earnings (40%) and employment (45%), the slower growth in this vital sector was a drag on the overall economic performance in 1991.

With the completion of the major public investment programmes initiated in the late 1970's, especially the Accelerated Mahaweli Development Programme - growth in the **Construction Sector** has declined after 1982. The growth rate of 2.3 per cent for the sector in 1991 is the highest since 1982.

● EXTERNAL TRADE

The trend observed during 1988-90 when the trade deficit showed continuous improvements was reversed in 1991 due to a sluggish growth of exports and a large increase in imports. The value of merchandise exports grew only marginally by 2 per cent in 1991 as compared with an impressive growth of 20 per cent in 1990. Outlay on imports rose by 13 per cent. The trade deficit deteriorated by 48 per cent to SDR 747 million.

Over the last 15 years, the export trade saw a major shift away from traditional agricultural exports such as tea, rubber and coconut products and towards industrial exports (14.7% in 1978 to 60.1% in 1991) especially textiles and garments. Tea's dominant position of exports gradually dropped from 48.5 per cent in 1978 to 21.1 per cent by 1991. Textiles and garment exports increased significantly from 3.6 per cent of total exports in 1978 to 39.4 per cent in 1991. Even after an almost one decade of liberalization, there has however been little diversification. The range of products is narrow and is dominated heavily by garments. However, because of the high import content of textile and garments, tea continues to remain as the highest foreign exchange earner for Sri Lanka. Sri Lanka continued to be the highest tea exporter in the world in 1991.

Among the imports the consumer goods declined slowly, whilst the intermediate and investment goods took an uptrend after the liberalization of the economy since 1977-78. In the consumer category, traditional food imports, especially rice, flour and sugar underwent a sharp decline, whilst the consumer durables such as televisions and radios increased. Of the intermediate goods, the highest increase was seen in textiles and clothing to feed the growing garment industry. The share of investment goods increased significantly in the early years after the liberalization, but declined in the years after 1982 with the completion of the major construction projects under the Accelerated Mahaweli Development Programme. In 1990, for the first time since 1982, the investment imports rose and the trend continued in 1991. The major share of this increase comprised transport equipment and machinery.

● PRIVATIZATION

The country places increased emphasis on the private sector, and the government pursues its policy of divesting itself of the ownership and management of commercially-oriented state enterprises. In 1988 roughly 40 per cent of the manufacturing value-added came from public enterprises. However, by the late 1980s most of these enterprises needed restructuring; they also found it difficult to survive in the liberalized economy without substantial tariff protection and state subsidies. To resuscitate them, the government embarked on a privatization programme in mid-1989. In the transport sector, bus depots have, with the exception of those in the North and East, been fully privatized. In the plantation sector, the government has taken measures to privatize the management. Twenty two companies have been allocated the management of 449 estates covering 189,500 hectares hitherto managed by state corporations. There are currently 60 state enterprises listed by the government to be privatized, of which the privatization has been completed in respect of 16 enterprises as at the end of April 1992.

● FOREIGN PRIVATE CAPITAL

The main thrust of investment policy during the next five years is towards increasing the inflow of foreign private capital to complement domestic savings. The government has granted a wide range of incentives by relaxing most rules pertaining to foreign investment.

In pursuance of the policy of actively promoting foreign investment, the Greater Colombo Economic Commission (GCEC), established in 1978, functions as a "One Stop Investment Promotion Centre" with the principal objective of encouraging and regulating foreign investment inflows in export-oriented activities, especially within demarcated Export Processing Zones (EPZs) in Sri Lanka.

The value of projects approvals of the GCEC rose from SDR 41 million in 1990 to SDR 250 million in 1991, with a marked increase in the average size of the project. The level of actual foreign investment also rose from SDR 31 million in 1990 to SDR 74 million in 1991. Though these levels are still small, they are encouraging.

Of the 153 enterprises, 72 were in the Katunayake Investment Promotion Zone (KIPZ), 28 in Biyagama Investment Promotion Zone (BIPZ), 2 in Koggala Investment Promotion Zone (KPIPZ) and 51 in various other parts of the Island.

In 1991, employment and gross export earnings from EPZs increased by 20 per cent and 26 per cent respectively over 1990. Textile, wearing apparel and leather products dominated, accounting for 66 per cent of the employment and 65 per cent of the total GCEC exports. 78 per cent of the workforce is female. Foreign investors came principally from Japan, Hongkong, Australia, South Korea, Holland and India.

● TOURISM

Tourism showed a remarkable recovery in 1990 and continued to expand in 1991. The total tourist arrivals increased by 7 per cent over 1990 to 317,703. The main sources were Western Europe (60.5 %) and Asia (30%). The tourist arrivals from Australia and North America were in the range of 3 per cent from each source. The total employment provided by the tourist industry in 1991 has been estimated at about 64,000 which is 8 per cent higher than 1990.

● BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

The striking improvement in the balance of payment position recorded in 1990 with a surplus of SDR 130 million (Rs. 6,998 million) as against large deficits in the preceding five years saw a further uptrend in 1991.

There was a sharp deficit in the current account balance due largely to the heavy trade deficit. But a highly favourable increase in the capital account helped to offset the deficit in the current account, leaving a surplus balance of payment of SDR 150 million.

The increase in capital account was largely due to the substantial in flows of private foreign capital and the increased disbursements of foreign loans to the government. Balance of Payment surplus helped to increase the country's total gross external assets from SDR 602 million at the end of 1990 to SDR 809 million at the end of 1991 - a level sufficient to finance 4.2 months of imports projected for 1992. The gross official international reserves were sufficient to finance 1.5 months of merchandise imports in 1989, 1.9 in 1990 and 2.7 months in 1991.

● EXTERNAL DEBT AND DEBT SERVICE PAYMENTS

Sri Lanka's total outstanding external debt at the end of 1991 was estimated at SDR 4,598 million showing an increase of SDR 476 million. The bulk of the increase was reflected in the medium and long term debt of the government, which rose from SDR 3,190 million to SDR 3,601 million. Most of the increase was in the category of long-term concessional loans to the government, mainly from Japan, the World Bank and the ADB.

There was a substantial improvement in the country's debt service ratio in the years 1990 and 1991. As a percentage of the total receipts from export of goods and services, it declined to 17.8 per cent in 1990 - the lowest since 1978, and marginally increased to 18.1 per cent in 1991. As a percentage of receipts from exports of goods and service plus private transfers it was only 15.4 per cent in 1990 and moved up slightly to 15.5 per cent in 1991.

● EMPLOYMENT

Employment in state sector dropped by 3.3 per cent in 1991 due largely to the public sector restructuring programme. The privatization of several government institutions and the scheme introduced in October 1990 providing incentives for early retirements from the public service were the main reasons for the decline. Employment opportunities recorded an increase in 1991 in the private sector and the Export Promotion Zones. Despite the temporary set-back to foreign employment opportunities in West Asia during early months of 1991 due to the Gulf crisis, the latter part of the year saw a sharp increase of workers going abroad on employment. By the end of 1991 a total of about 65,000 persons had obtained employment through licensed agencies and the Sri Lanka Foreign Employment Bureau - registering a significant increase of 52.5 per cent over 1990.

Government continued to place emphasis on the generation of self-employment opportunities by the poverty alleviation programme and the provision of credit facilities etc. Nevertheless, overall unemployment estimates continued to be high with a 15.2 per cent unemployment rate in 1991 (16.2 in mid 1990), which was largely the outcome of the slowing down of growth in the bleak years of 1987-89.

● PRICES AND WAGES

Price movements in Sri Lanka are measured at the level of the consumer market by the Colombo Consumer Price Index (CCPI) and, at the primary market level by the Wholesale Price Index (WPI). Both indices registered a lowering of the rate of price increase compared to 1990, though the indices remain still high in absolute terms.

The reduction in the administrative prices of bread and wheat flour in January 1991, a satisfactory supply positions of several agricultural commodities, especially vegetable and pulses, stable international prices for basic food items such as sugar and wheat flour and a more moderate depreciation of the exchange rate are reported as having contributed significantly to slower the rate of price increases in 1991.

These favourable trends were however offset by large increase in the prices of fish and chillies; shortfall in the supply of coconuts; and the impact of the increase in the price of kerosene effected in 1990 - all contributing to show a significant increase of 12.2 per cent of the CCPI.

It is noteworthy that the Sub Index of prices of the WPI for the Domestic Group shows the highest increase (11.9%) as against the Import Group (6.1%) and the Export Group (7.5%).

In the public sector, the nominal wage rose by 12.1 per cent in 1991 (13.0% in 1990) and in the organized private sector by 14.4 per cent (16.9% in 1990). However, due to the lower rate of increase in prices in 1991 compared with 1990, the Central bank of Sri Lanka reports that there was no significant change in the real wage levels in the year 1991. This is a noteworthy change from 1990 when the real wage eroded despite substantial increases in nominal wages, due to the rapid rise of prices in that year.

● SOCIAL PROGRESS

Sri Lanka is a low-income country ranked by the World Bank as the 120th in terms of per capita GNP which stood at US\$ 417 in 1990. However, in terms of welfare levels and physical quality of life of Sri Lankans, the country is far superior to countries at comparable levels of development. The Human Development Index (HDI) in the 1992 UNDP Human Development Report accords Sri Lanka a rating of 0.651, ranking the country as the 76th and coming within the category of countries having a medium human development level.

Sri Lanka's impressive social progress over the last several decades is seen in the following welfare indicators -

These achievements were made possible by the several social welfare policies consistently pursued by successive governments in Sri Lanka since independence in 1948. The welfare programmes which were heavily directed at widening access to basic needs and improving the living standards of the masses included provision of free education, free health services and food at subsidized prices to the entire population irrespective of income levels. With the growth of the population and deterioration of the country's balance-of-payments situation, commitment to a large scale welfare budget became an increasing burden in the 1970s. Since the late 1970s, emphasis has been shifted from provision of subsidies and other welfare expenditure towards enhancing capital outlays and also for better targeting of the welfare programme for the poorer segments of the population. A Food Stamp Scheme aimed at a target population, has now replaced the earlier Food Subsidy Scheme which had universal coverage.

● POVERTY ALLEVIATION

Poverty alleviation has become a priority of government policy, and a range of measures - the Food Stamp Scheme, the Janasaviya Programme and the Schools Midday Meal Programme - have been introduced to help cushion the impact of economic reforms on the poor and vulnerable sections of the population, who are estimated to comprise 25-30 per cent of the population. Between 4.25 and 5.1 million Sri Lankans are probably living in poverty. Poverty alleviation programmes in the past had been aimed at providing sustenance to the poor. The unique feature of the Janasaviya Programme (JSP), launched in 1989, is that it seeks to link those in poverty to the production process and ensure that at least one member of a poor family achieves the means to obtain a sustainable income. The programme covers nearly 50 per cent of the population - the present food stamp holding families.

The Janasaviya Programme intends to alleviate mass poverty and remove dependency of the poor, on food stamps and poor relief doled out by the state. It envisages to mobilize and harness the physical strength and mental capacity, intelligence, skills and education of poor groups and bring about an improvement in their income earning capacity in a short span of time of two years. During these two years, the beneficiaries of the Janasaviya Programme are given public assistance amounting to Rs.1,458/- per month to procure their food needs. The Janasaviya Programme also includes an investment component of Rs. 1,042/= a month which adds upto Rs.25,000/= in savings within a period of two years. Once the Janasaviya Programme is completed it is expected that all the beneficiaries will be graduating to self-sustaining economic positions and that they will no longer require food stamps or poor relief. With this intention the Janasaviya Programme also includes organizational support schemes such as counselling services and guidance after the two year period of financial assistance enabling all the beneficiaries to raise their economic conditions further. The banking sector has formulated a number of schemes in order to cater to the credit needs of the Janasaviya beneficiaries who are in the process of improving/starting and managing self-employment activities and small enterprises.

The implementation of the Programme takes place in 11 rounds and accordingly 279 Assistant Government Agent (AGA) Divisions in the island are grouped into 11 rounds on the basis of the extent of poverty in each AGA Division. The first round of Janasaviya was launched in October 1989 and completed in September 1991. It included 28 AGA Divisions covering 156,000 beneficiary families. The second round covering 30 AGA Divisions

and 105,000 families was launched in December 1990. The third round covering 31 AGA Divisions and 100,000 families was launched in February, 1992.

Under the Janasaviya Programme the government has also established the Janasaviya Trust Fund (JTF) which provides credit and other facilities to Janasaviya beneficiaries for self-employment and small enterprises. The requisite credit is provided through refinance for lending by Participating Credit Institutions, which include banks and local non-governmental organisations. Moreover, JTF will provide funds for productive community development projects, training of beneficiaries and officers and for nutritional programmes.

■ SECTION 3 - ECONOMIC POLICY AND TRENDS

After nearly two decades of very stringent controls a major shift towards economic liberalization commenced in 1977. In November of that year, a series of important economic reforms was introduced which constituted a fundamental policy change designed to facilitate the long-run transformation of the economy. The reforms aimed at the liberalization of the economy, shifting resources from consumption to investment, increased mobilization of foreign resources and furthering economic rehabilitation and development in general. The restrictions on external trade and payment were relaxed; the exchange rate was devalued and unified; a floating exchange rate system was introduced, the interest rates were reformed; controls on most commodities were abolished; government monopolies in production and distribution were eliminated consumption subsidies were progressively withdrawn, fiscal incentives were offered to both domestic and foreign investors, and foreign banks were encouraged to establish branches in Colombo. In general, efforts were made to create an atmosphere in which economic advancement would take place under private sector initiative.

In the years immediately after 1977 further policy initiatives were made to maintain the momentum of the liberalization of the economy, ensure adequate incentives for productive sectors, shift the mix of policies to support an export-led growth strategy, and significantly accelerate output and employment growth by mobilizing domestic and external resources in support of a higher level of investment. Meanwhile, large infrastructure development projects, such as the Accelerated Mahaweli Development Programme which was aimed at expanding the agriculture frontier through large irrigation/settlement projects and the country's power generation capacity, were initiated with external assistance.

The Central Bank of Sri Lanka points out that reforms introduced and the policies that followed after 1977 resulted in a rapid increase in economic growth and a decline in the rate of unemployment. The rate of growth of GDP which averaged about 2.9 per cent during the 1970-77 period increased and approximated to 6 per cent during the 1978-85 period. Following a surge in public and private sector investments, the unemployment rate, which had previously being at over 20 per cent of the workforce fell to 14 per cent. The structure of the economy started changing away from traditional agriculture towards manufacturing and services. Meanwhile, the primary product base of the export sector began to give way to a more diversified export structure and the share of the three plantation crops of tea, rubber

and coconut in total exports declined from 75 per cent in 1977 to 49 per cent in 1985. Correspondingly, the share of industrial exports rose from 14 per cent to 39 per cent between the two years. Liberalization policies also enabled a diversification of the country's foreign exchange earnings. Encouraged by generous tax incentives, tourism boomed. Tourist arrivals increased from 150,000 in 1977 to 400,000 in 1982. Meanwhile, exports of garments increased from a negligible level prior to 1977 to some US\$ 440 million in 1987. Workers' remittances home grew from US\$ 20 million in 1977 to US\$ 350 million in 1987.

The post-1977 economic liberalization programme enabled a large volume of foreign resources to be mobilized for Sri Lanka's development effort. The ratio of national savings to GDP which averaged about 12.7 per cent during the period 1970-77 increased to an average of about 16 per cent between 1978 and 1984. Meanwhile, the Gross Domestic Investment as a proportion of GDP increased from about 16 per cent during the period 1970-77 to an average of about 27 per cent during the period 1978-84. The difference between domestic investment and national savings was met by foreign capital flows largely from official sources.

The momentum created by rapid investment and high economic growth could not be maintained after 1985. During the period 1986-88, the average rate of GDP growth declined to 2.8 per cent. Meanwhile, the favourable trends observed in the employment front during the early 1980s reversed and the rate of unemployment once again started to rise. The balance-of-payments position deteriorated, the current account deficit reaching 8 per cent GDP by 1987. The net official reserves fell to their lowest level in the decade and the debt service ratio was close to 30 per cent. The problems on the economic front were compounded by a worsening of civil disturbances in the North and the emergence of an insurgency in the South. These developments placed additional strains on the Budget and created uncertainties that discouraged private sector production and investment.

In order to redress the emerging economic problems, the government adopted a stabilization programme and a round of further economic liberalization with a view to eliminating structural constraints to growth. The economic adjustment programme was aimed at reversing the deterioration in the economic situation through the adoption of prudent demand management policies and the revitalization of the structural reform process. This programme was specifically aimed at increasing the growth rate, reducing the inflation rate and lowering the current account deficit of the balance-of-payments. The Government in 1987 approved the reports and

recommendations of three high level committees - the Administrative Reforms Committee, the Presidential Tariff Committee and the Industrial Policy Committee. The economic liberalization measures were heavily centred on further relaxation of the remaining restrictions in order to create an environment for the private sector to operate efficiently. The reforms revolved round modification of industrial policies and further incentives to foreign investment, rationalizing foreign investment approval procedures, changes in government administrative structure and staffing levels, relaxation of restrictions on foreign travel and additional foreign currency banking facilities, further easing of licensing requirements with respect to trade and industry and reform of the tariff structure. These measures were aimed at increased integration of the Sri Lankan economy with the world economy by encouraging capital flows and facilitating foreign travel and enhanced banking facilities.

With the implementation of these measures, the economy started bouncing back to its pre-1985 growth path. The real GDP growth in 1990 was 6.2 per cent and in 1991 was 4.8 per cent. The manufacturing sector has emerged as a leading growth sector in the economy, the private sector providing the main lead. The balance-of-payments has shown considerable resilience contributing to an improved external assets position - the current level of gross external assets covering over four months imports. Meanwhile, the debt service ratio has recorded a sharp drop, declining from 28 per cent in 1988 to 17 per cent in 1990, further improving the outlook for balance-of-payments. Significant progress has been made in easing the unemployment problem. With the relaxation of conditions for foreign investors' participation in the local capital market and the privatization drive of the government owned business enterprises, Sri Lanka's capital market is getting expanded and activity in the Colombo Stock Exchange is brisk. The local exporters are being gradually allowed access to foreign financial markets for funds.

The government has declared that in the future structural adjustment and stabilization measures will be further strengthened, and that the price distortions, including those arising from high tariffs, taxes, subsidies, over-valued exchange rates, and state ownership, as well as bureaucratic controls, will be progressively eliminated, and that a more rational incentive structure will be developed.

■ SECTION 4 - PLANNING AND AID CO-ORDINATION

The first efforts in planning in Sri Lanka began soon after Independence with the Six-Year Plan in 1950 which incorporated the first two Budgets of Independent Sri Lanka. Among the plans drawn up in the latter years were the Six-Year Programme of Investment - 1954-55 to 1955-60; the Ten-Year Plan - 1959; the Three-Year Implementation Programme - 1962-64 and the Five-Year Plan 1972-76. The preparation of overall national economic plans ceased altogether following the economic reforms of 1977 and thereafter planning was confined to the preparation of public sector investment programmes.

Thus since 1979 the Government has been working on the basis of a "rolling" medium terms **Public Investment Programme** with a five year perspective of investments to be made by the public sector. This Programme is reviewed each year, dropping the year completed and adding one year. The Programme is organized along sectoral lines and sets out policy and development perspectives for each sector within the macro framework for the economy. This approach has enabled the Government to review and revise the Programme every year taking into account changes in the availability of resources and national priorities and objectives. Thus the revised development priorities for the year 1991 are clarified in the Public Investment Programme for 1991-1995.

The Public Investment Programme projected a 5.2 per cent GDP growth for 1991 and the maintenance of an average of about 5.8 per cent in the five-year period (1991-1995). The Programme (1991-1995) points out that even though increased emphasis is placed on the private sector, there is an important role to be played by the public investment programme in the emerging policy environment. Public investment is expected to concentrate on building the economic and social infrastructure that is vital to an expanding private sector.

The aim of public investment is to play a supportive role. Public investment will concentrate on vital sectors such as irrigation, roads and highways, power and energy, telecommunications, and human resources development. This is reflected in the sectoral allocations of resources in the Public Investment Programme, 1991-1995.

Education and Health - two major branches of human resource development - are considered primarily the responsibility of Government, while the private sector is encouraged to share an increasing portion of this

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responsibility. The Government has decided to gradually increase the allocation of resources for health and education, to be accompanied by improvements in their management.

Increasing attention is being paid by the Government to achieving the aim of sustainable development. Environmental concerns and conservation measures are therefore treated as integral components of the development effort. A Ministry of Environment has been set up and all public sector projects are required today to go through environmental impact assessment procedures, while the private sector is being discouraged from investment in areas which cause environmental problems.

The Public Investment Programme (1991-1995) states that the benefits of higher economic growth must be shared by all sections of the population, if development is to be meaningful. Moreover, the stabilization and structural adjustment measures being adopted to improve economic efficiency and growth will invariably involve certain social costs. Since enhanced incomes and employment opportunities will become available only after time lag, immediate measures, which are not in conflict with the long term goals, are required to alleviate poverty and to protect the most vulnerable groups against adjustment costs. This is the rationale of the Government's poverty alleviation policy that has been given expression in the Janasaviya Programme, the Food Stamp Programme, and the School Midday Meal Programme.

A further important facet of the Government's development strategy is regional development. The Government intends to strengthen the role of the Provincial Councils and local authorities and to forge better links and cooperation between these entities and the Government.

The Government has launched a strategy to develop the Southern Province. It will also launch a similar programme to develop the North and the East as soon as political conditions permit it. Meanwhile, every effort is being made to promote economic activity in those areas in the North and the East which are relatively peaceful, and to provide relief to the long suffering people in those areas.

The Public Investment Programme for the period 1991 to 1995 has set out the following planning targets -

◆ Production and Investment

- The growth rate of Gross Domestic Product: increases at an average rate of 5.8 per cent per annum.
- The Gross Domestic Capital Formation: reaches an average of 27 per cent of GDP in the five year period.
- National Savings: increases to about 21 per cent of GDP over the five years.
- Shares of public and private investment in Gross Domestic Capital Formation: 37:63
- The inflation rate as reflected in the movement of the Colombo Consumers' Price Index slows down to an annual rate of about 6 per cent by 1995.

◆ Balance-of-Payment

- The deficit in the Current Account: declines from 6.2 per cent of GDP (1991) to 5.7 per cent (1995).
- The medium and long term external debt outstanding declines from 65.8 per cent of GDP (1991) to 54.7 per cent (1995). Debt Service Ratio in 1995: approximately 15 per cent.
- Gross Official Reserves increase from the equivalent of 2.0 months of imports (1991) to 3 months of imports (1995).

◆ Government Budget

- Revenue: maintained in the range 19 to 20 per cent of GDP.
- Overall Deficit: declines from 10.0 per cent of GDP (1991) to 7.1 per cent (1995).
- Net Domestic Borrowing: declines from 3.9 per cent of GDP (1991) to 1.2 per cent (1995).
- Capital Expenditure and Net Lending: maintain at approximately 9 per cent of GDP.

● AID CO-ORDINATION

The principal institution responsible for the procurement of external assistance for Sri Lanka is the External Resources Department which controls and monitors the disbursement of all aid funds and co-ordinates the activities relating to aid disbursement through the Ministry of Policy Planning and Implementation and the line Ministries. The task of monitoring the progress of projects and the utilization of aid funds is done by the Ministry of Policy Planning and Implementation through quarterly reports obtained from the respective government departments and institutions handling aided projects.

Funds to meet the capital expenditure of respective government departments and institutions are allocated within the framework of the Public Investment Programme of the Government and are provided for by the annual budget. The process of planning within the government machinery for the procurement of external assistance begins at the time of the formulation of the annual budget for the forthcoming budget year.

At the beginning of each year the government departments and institutions first present their project proposals to their respective line ministries. The proposals are studied by the line ministries in relation to the Public Investment Programme and the projects approved for inclusion in the annual budget are presented by the line ministries to the Ministry of Policy Planning and Implementation. This Ministry analyses the project proposals in the light of national priorities and the Public Investment Programme. The proposals are next submitted to the Budget Division of the Ministry of Finance which studies the proposals in consultation with the line ministries concerned and the Ministry of Policy Planning and Implementation. The proposals are next referred to the Committee of Secretaries. Proposals approved by the Committee are referred to the Cabinet of Ministries upon whose consideration and approval, the proposals are included in the annual budget.

The capital resources needed for the projects are analysed by the Department of External Resources; and the Department determines the donor country to which each of the proposals needing external assistance should be forwarded.

PART I : COUNTRY BACKGROUND

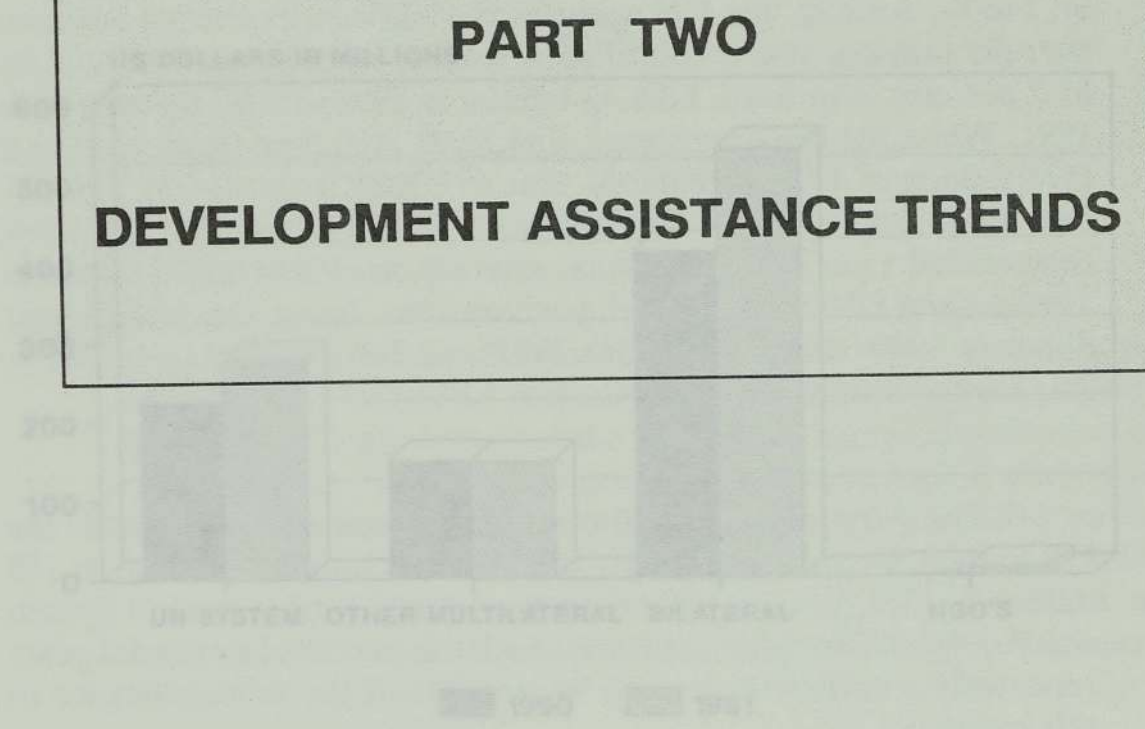
The Sri Lanka Aid Group (Aid consortium) has met every year in Paris since 1965. Bilateral aid is given to Sri Lanka directly on a government-to-government basis by the donor countries of the Sri Lanka Aid Group. These meetings are convened by the World Bank. The Bank prepares reports for the use of the donor countries on the state of the economy of Sri Lanka and the major adjustment and corrective measures being taken and or recommended to be taken by the Sri Lanka Government. The Government of Sri Lanka presents its report on the aid requirements and its proposals on aid utilization.

SECTION 1 - EXTERNAL ASSISTANCE IN 1991 AND 1990

There was a significant increase in Official Development Assistance to Sri Lanka in 1991 compared to the previous year. The total aid quantum disbursed in 1991 exceeded the total for 1990 by 23.4 per cent and the annual average for the three preceding years of 1988-1990 by 7.5 per cent. The gross funds received by the donor agencies stood at US\$ 972.6 million in 1991 compared to US\$ 789.2 million for 1990 and an annual average of US\$ 905 for the period 1988-1991.

The Sri Lanka government has been receiving aid since 1965. This aid has been in the form of government-to-government aid, through the Colombo Plan Group. These meetings are held annually and reports for the year of the aid are submitted to the Lanka and the aid is administered through the aid commission recommended to be taken by the government. The utilization of Sri Lanka present aid program is very high and the aid utilization is high.

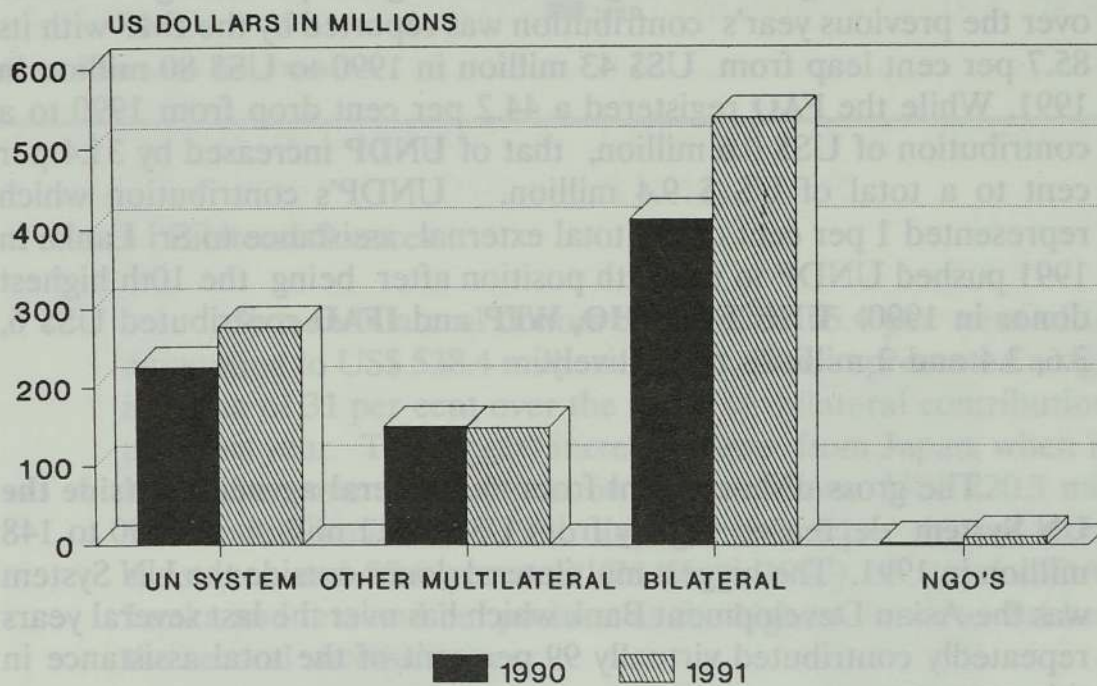
FIGURE 2: TOP TEN DONORS

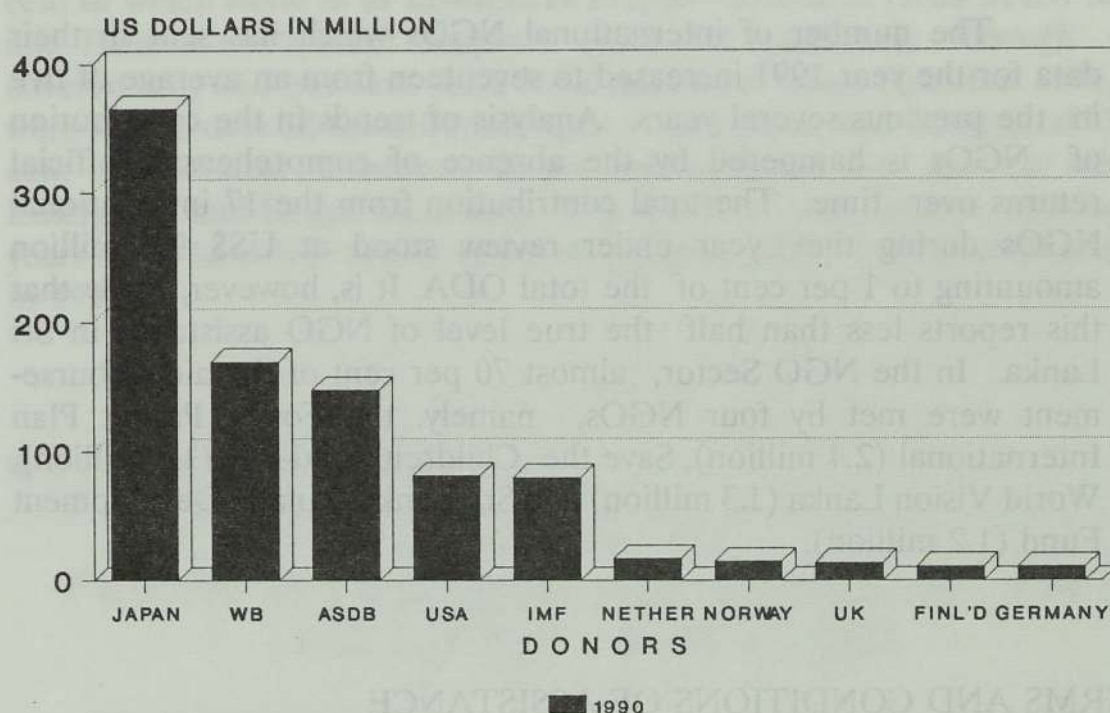
◆ Multilateral Sources :

As a share of the total ODA to Sri Lanka, the contribution from Multilateral Sources dropped from 47.5 per cent in 1990 to 43.6 per cent in 1991. The gross value of multilateral assistance however represented an increase of about US\$ 49.9 million or 13 per cent over that of 1990.

Of the total value of multilateral assistance, almost 65 per cent amounting to US\$ 276.4 million was contributed by the **agencies in the UN System**. The biggest donor within the UN System - the World Bank - contributed US\$ 169.5 million or 17.4 per cent of the total ODA in 1991 and retained its position as the second highest donor to Sri Lanka. Among the UN agencies the highest percentage increase over the previous year's contribution was reported by the **IMF** with its 85.7 per cent leap from US\$ 43 million in 1990 to US\$ 80 million in 1991. While the **FAO** registered a 44.2 per cent drop from 1990 to a contribution of US\$ 0.6 million, that of **UNDP** increased by 31.4 per cent to a total of US \$ 9.4 million. **UNDP's** contribution which represented 1 per cent of the total external assistance to Sri Lanka in 1991 pushed **UNDP** to the 11th position after being the 10th highest donor in 1990. **UNICEF, WHO, WFP** and **IFAD** contributed US\$ 6, 3.6, 3.4 and 2 millions respectively.

The gross disbursement from multilateral **agencies outside the UN System** decreased slightly from US\$ 149.1 million in 1990 to 148 million in 1991. The biggest multilateral donor outside the UN System was the Asian Development Bank which has over the last several years repeatedly contributed virtually 99 per cent of the total assistance in this category.

◆ **Bilateral Sources :**

Sixteen bilateral donors contributed 55.4 per cent of total aid amounting to US\$ 538.4 million in 1991. This represented a significant increase of 31 per cent over the value of bilateral contribution in the previous year. The biggest increase came from Japan, when it raised her disbursements by almost 66 per cent from US\$ 220.3 million in 1990 to 365.4 million in 1991. Japan met 67.9 per cent of all bilateral assistance and 37.6 per cent (28 % in 1990) of total ODA to Sri Lanka and retained her position as the highest donor to Sri Lanka for the second successive year.

The other notable source of bilateral assistance was USA which increased its 1990 share by 29.2 per cent in 1991 to a total of US\$ 81.4 million. Contributions from Germany (-57.4%), Netherlands (-26.3%), UK (-9%) Finland (-7.6%) and Norway (-2.6%) dropped. Striking percentage increases are seen in respect of Canada from US\$ 5.9 million in 1990 to 9.8 million in 1991 recording a 66.7 per cent increase and Sweden from 4.5 million to 6.8 million - an increase of 50.4 per cent.

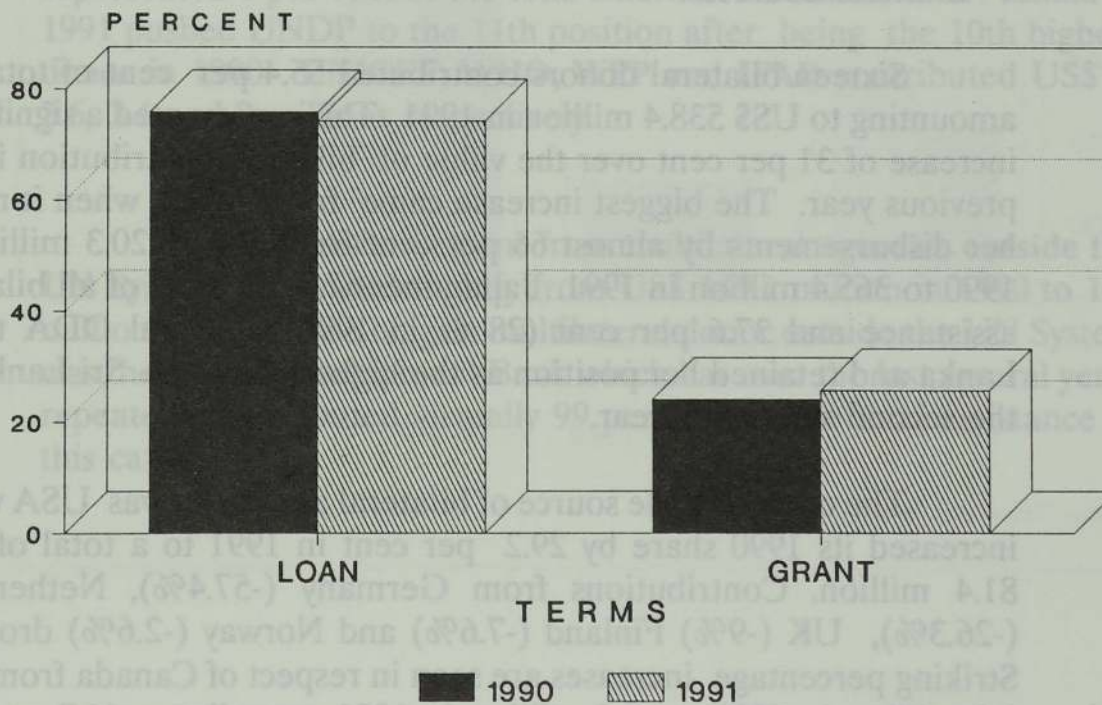

◆ NGO Sources :

The number of international NGOs which has sent in their data for the year 1991 increased to seventeen from an average of five in the previous several years. Analysis of trends in the contribution of NGOs is hampered by the absence of comprehensive official returns over time. The total contribution from the 17 international NGOs during the year under review stood at US\$ 9.7 million amounting to 1 per cent of the total ODA. It is, however, likely that this reports less than half the true level of NGO assistance in Sri Lanka. In the NGO Sector, almost 70 per cent of the aid disbursement were met by four NGOs, namely, the Foster Parent Plan International (2.4 million), Save the Children Fund-UK (1.8 million), World Vision Lanka (1.3 million) and Sri Lanka Canada Development Fund (1.2 million).

SRI LANKA - 1990 & 1991



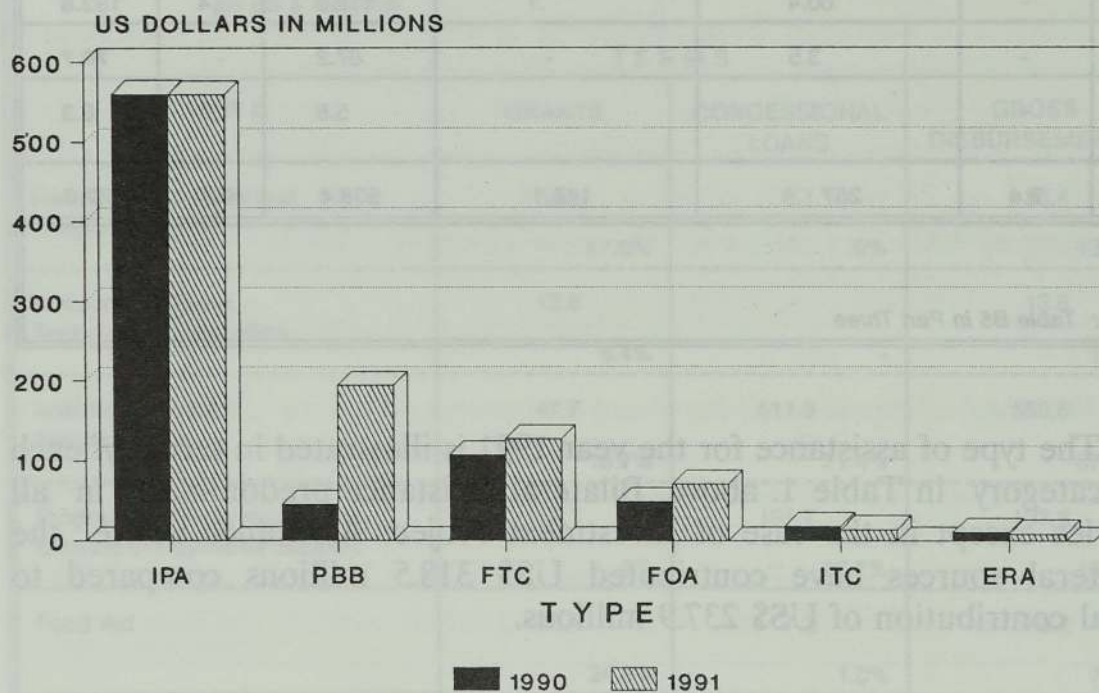

During the year under review, three fourths of all external assistance were disbursed in the form of loans totalling US\$ 717 million; almost 98 per cent of which came in as Investment Project Assistance (US\$ 511.9 million) and Balance-of-Payment Support (US\$ 191.7 million). Though grants covered only 26.3 per cent (US\$ 255.6 million) of total ODA for 1991, these were spread over all the different types of assistance, and comprised 95.6 per cent of Technical Assistance, 90 per cent of Food Aid and the whole of Emergency and Relief Assistance. The trend in loans: grants ratio over the years stood heavily in favour of loans - 70:30 in 1989, 76:24 in 1990 and 74:26 in 1991.

An analysis of the disbursements by type of assistance shows a significant increase of aid in respect of Balance-of-Payment Support by almost 333 per cent (+US\$ 149 million) in 1991 over the previous year. Noticeable increases were also seen in respect of Food Aid (+45% or US\$ 22 million) and Free-standing Technical Co-operation (+19% or 20 million). Although Investment Project Assistance was slightly lower in 1991 than 1990, IPA continued to receive strikingly high share of development assistance - 71 per cent of ODA in 1990 and 57.5 per cent in 1991.

The type of assistance for the year 1991 is illustrated in terms of each donor category in Table 1. above. Bilateral assistance predominates in all categories except in the case of Investment Project Assistance where the multilateral sources have contributed US\$ 318.5 millions compared to bilateral contribution of US\$ 237.9 millions.

◆ Technical Co-operation (TC)

Technical Co-operation was the most widespread type of external assistance in terms of donor participation, with 37 out of the 48 donors contributing to TC either in the form of Free-standing Technical Cooperation or Investment-related Technical Co-operation. The gross disbursement for TC was US\$ 140.2 million or 14.4 per cent of all aid to Sri Lanka in 1991 registering an increase of 16.1 million over the quantum of TC aid in 1990.

The bulk of the increase for Technical Co-operation came in for **Free-standing Technical Co-operation (FTC)** which category increased its share by 18.7 per cent over 1990 receiving a total of US\$ 126.4 million. The major share of FTC came from bilateral sources, especially Japan (US\$ 29.4 million), USA (28.5 million), UK (9.7 million), Germany (8.3 million) and Canada (5 million). Virtually 44 per cent of the total NGO aid contribution of US\$ 9.7 millions was disbursed for Free-standing Technical Co-operation.

Investment-related Technical Co-operation registered a decline of 21.4 per cent to total US\$ 13.8 million in 1991. Almost 90 per cent of this type of aid came from two donors -- Japan (9.8 million) and Canada (2.6 million).

◆ Investments Project Assistance (IPA)

IPA exerts a significant influence on the structure of development assistance to Sri Lanka. In the year 1991, it formed the biggest slice of external aid, comprising US\$ 559.6 million or 57.5 per cent of total disbursements. As much as 91.5 per cent (US\$ 511.9 million) of IPA came in as loans leaving only 8.5 per cent or US\$ 47.7 million as grants. It is also significant that as much as 93.5 per cent of the IPA came from the three major donors - Japan (US\$ 199.9 million or 35.2 % of IPA), the World Bank (169.5 million or 30.7% of IPA) and the Asian Development Bank (146.8 million or 26.9 % of IPA). IPA comprised the whole of the World Bank contribution for 1991 to Sri Lanka; 94.3 per cent of ADB aid and 54.7 per cent of Japan's development assistance to the country. The other important donors to IPA were far below, with Norway Sweden, Finland contributing 6.8, 6.7, 5.3 and 3.9 millions respectively.

◆ Programme or Budgetary Aid or Balance-of-Payment Support (PBB)

Balance-of-Payment Support to the government had an exceptional increase of 333 per cent in 1991 over 1990, totalling US\$ 193.8 million, virtually 99 per cent of which was disbursed by way of loans. 99.3 per cent of the PBB came from just two principal sources - Japan contributing US\$ 112.6 million or 58 per cent of PBB and IMF giving the whole of its aid contributing of US\$ 80 million for the year covering 41.3 per cent of PBB.

◆ Food Aid

The total disbursement for Food Aid increased from US\$ 48.8 million in 1990 by 44.9 per cent to a total of US\$ 70.7 million in 1991. The biggest share comprising 74.8 per cent of the total value of Food Aid came from USA's US\$ 52.9 million, with Japan contributing 13.7 million or 19.4 per cent. The other donors of Food Aid were the World Food Programme with US\$ 3.4 million (4.8 % of Food Aid) and Australia with .6 million.

◆ Emergency and Relief Assistance (ERA)

Due to the situation in the North and East of the country during 1991 the aid quantum for Emergency and Relief dropped by 23.8 per cent from the 1990 level to a total of US\$ 8.3 million. The contribution to ERA came in as grants from Norway (US\$ 2.7 million), Netherlands (2.1 million), Save the Child Fund-UK (1.9 million) and the United Nations Children's Fund (1 million).

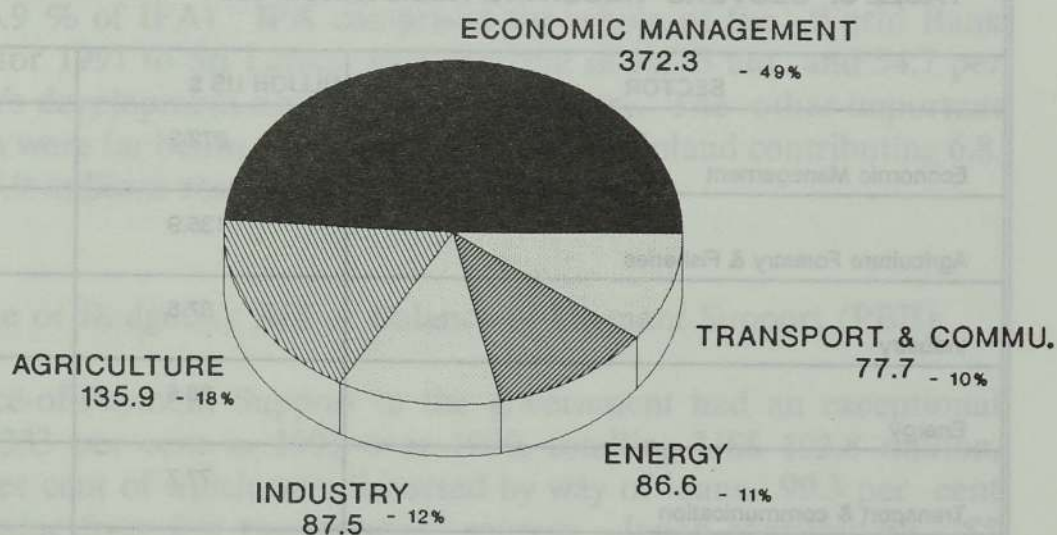
Out of the 13 sectors which received external assistance in 1991, five major sectors absorbed as much as 78.1 per cent of all aid.

Economic Management sector received an unprecedented share of aid almost double the share it received in 1990. The sector received US\$ 372.3 million which represented 38.3 per cent of all development aid in 1991. The greater share of this amount was disbursed for Monetary Policy Planning (313.2 million) and Macro-Economic Policy and Planning (56.6 million). Virtually 99 per cent of the contribution for Economic Management came from the five major donors with Japan contributing US\$ 209.5 million covering 56.3 per cent of the share for Economic Management; and IMF US\$ 80 million (21.5 %), World Bank 45.4 million (12.2 %), ADB 22 million (5.9 %) and USA 11.1 million (3 %).

Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries sector got the second highest contribution of US\$ 135.9 million; and virtually 90 per cent of this came from the ADB (76.8 million), World Bank (16.1 million) Japan (14.8 million), and USA (12.5 million). The aid received by this sector was disbursed principally for Agricultural Sector Policy and Planning, Food Crops, Support Services and Fisheries.

Industry sector saw the biggest percentage rise of almost 25.8 per cent over the previous year to receive US\$ 87.5 million, 70 per cent of which went in for large-scale industry. The bulk of the aid to the sector was disbursed by the World Bank (77.9 million or 89%), the ADB (6.7 million or 7.7 %) and UNDP (1.5 million or 1.7%).

Energy sector received almost 55 per cent lower than in 1990 and yet retained its position as the fourth biggest aid receiving sector. Almost the whole of US\$ 86.6 million received by the sector went in for Hydroelectric Power Generation and Transmission. 60.7 per cent of the contribution to the sector came from Japan with a contribution of US\$ 52.6 million whilst the balance came from the World Bank (10.9 million), ADB (20.2 million) and Germany (1.9 million).

Transport and Communication together received 15.8 per cent less than 1990; and the major share of its US\$ 77.7 million went in for water transport and shipping (24.8 million), rail (22.9 million) and road (21.5 million) transport. Japan with 75.3 per cent and the ADB with 15.3 per cent covered over 90 per cent of the aid to this sector.

■ SECTION 2 - TRENDS IN AID FLOWS

Trends in aid flow over the last 9 years reflected in Table 4 show a fluctuating annual flow in the period 1983-87 and an uptrend there after, with 1989 standing out as an exceptional peak year. The data for the years upto 1987 however do not present a full picture due to the absence of complete sets of data especially for the year 1984, 1986 and 1987. A relatively continuous uptrend is visible in the technical cooperation component in respect of which complete sets of data are available for the full period. It is noteworthy that the per capita rate reported in 1983 at US\$ 22.52 has increased more than two-fold to US\$ 56.08 by 1991.

Note: A new classification of sectors and sub-sectors was introduced in 1989. The principal changes affecting the above Table for 1989, 1990 and 1991 are:

1. Separation of "Energy" as a new sector from "Natural Resources" Sector
2. Separation of "Area Development" as a new sector from "Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries" Sector.
3. Separation of Programme and Balance of Payment Support from the "International Trade and Development Finance" Sector. New sector is named "Economic Management" and International Trade and Development Finance is renamed "International Trade in Goods and Services".

In an effort to identify the trends in the sectoral distribution of aid disbursement, Table 5 above indicates the five priority sectors for each of the years 1983 to 1991 except 1987 for which year the available data is incomplete. Though the analysis of annual trends over time is limited by the changes introduced in 1989 to the classification of sectors, certain noteworthy trends are still discernible.

- ◆ International Trade and Development Finance sector which occupied a prominent place in the years prior to 1989, shows a decline thereafter. This, of course, was largely due to the 1989 re-classification which separated Programme and Balance-of-Payment Support from the "International Trade and Development Finance" sector and placed Programme and Balance-of-Payment Support in a new sector titled "Economic Management" which sector has come into sharp focus in the post-1989 years. The greater share of the disbursement for the Economic Management sector comprised the Programme and Balance-of-Payment Support coming from IMF and Japan.
- ◆ The Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries sector, with high concentration of assistance on Food crops, Support Services, and Research and Development, shows continuous expansion.
- ◆ Industry sector which dwindled in importance in the years from 1988-1990 after being the fifth priority sector in the years 1984 to 1986, re-emerged as a major sector receiving aid in the year 1991.
- ◆ Energy sector has come into prominence in the years 1989-91 with most of the assistance going into Hydroelectric Power Generation and Transmission.
- ◆ The Transport and Communication sector has also come into prominence after 1988 with a major share being devoted to Telecommunication, and Water Transport and Shipping sub-sectors with assistance principally from Japan and the World Bank;
- ◆ A drop in the resource allocation for Natural Resources sector is seen after 1987 largely due to the completion of the important development work under the Mahaweli Development Programme.

Table 6 presenting the percentage proportion of assistance provided by each of the five major donors for past several years points to the critical dependence of Sri Lanka on them for over four-fifth of all aid, with 1991 recording the highest level approximating 87 per cent of the gross disbursements coming from five donors.

Japan, the biggest donor, has improved on her 1990 contribution of 27.9 per cent of total external aid to Sri Lanka by raising her contribution to 37.6 per cent of all aid to Sri Lanka in 1991. The World Bank and the ADB continues to maintain their high levels of aid flow to Sri Lanka. The IMF which made significant contributions towards Balance-of-Payments Support in the years 1986 and 1989, once again picked up its share in 1991 after a drop in 1990. USA which claimed a record 49.1 per cent in the exceptionally high aid flow year in 1989, registered a 8.4 per cent share of total aid to Sri Lanka in 1991.

Table 6 presenting the percentage proportion of assistance provided by each of the five major donors for past several years points to the dependence of Sri Lanka on them for over four-fifth of all aid with 1991 recording the highest level, approximating 87 per cent of the gross disbursements coming from five donors.

from this 1991 year, it is estimated that the contribution of Japan, the biggest donor, has diminished on net 1991 contribution of 27.9 per cent of total external aid to Sri Lanka by raising her contribution to 37.6 per cent of all aid to Sri Lanka in 1991. The World Bank and the ADB continues to maintain their high level of aid flow to Sri Lanka. The IMF which made significant contributions towards Balance-of-Payment Support in the years 1988 and 1989, once again picked up its share in 1991 after a drop in 1990. USA which claimed a record 49.1 per cent in the exceptionally high aid flow year in 1988, registered a 8.4 per cent share of total aid to Sri Lanka in 1991.
