





ADMINISTRATION (INTERIM) REPORT OF THE

PROVINCIAL MINISTRY OF HEALTH NORTH-EAST PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT

O1. INTRODUCTION:

In accordance with the powers vested upon the Ministry of Health, North-East Province by the 13th Amendment to the Constitution of Sri Lanka (Chapter XVII A - Clause 154 A) the office of the Secretary to the Minister of Health was established. The powers vested on the Provincial Councils as regards Health are described below as spelled out in the 13th Amendment to the Constitution. Every Provincial Council may, subject to the provisions in the Constitution, make statutes applicable to the Province for which it is established with respect to any matter set out in List I of the Nineth Schedule which is as follows:-

List - 1: (Provincial Council List)

Section 11 - Health

- 11:1 The establishment and maintenance of public hospitals, Rural Hospitals, Maternity Homes, Dispensaries (Other than Teaching Hospitals and Hospitals established for special purposes);
- 11:2 Public Health Services, Health Education, Nutrition, Family Health, Maternity and Child Care, Food and Food Sanitation, Environmental Health;
- 11:3 Formulation and Implementation of Health Development Plan and of the Annual Health Plan for the Province;
- 11:4 The provision of facilities for all Institutions referred to in 1 above within the Province, excluding the procurement of drugs;
- 11:5 Awarding of Scholarships for Post-Graduate Education within Sri Lanka to personnel attached to the Institutions specified in 1 above.
- 12 Indigenous Medicine Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani -
- 12:1 Establishment of Ayurvedic Dispensaries and Hospitals, grants to such Dispensaries and Hospitals;
- 12:2 Establishment and maintenance of Herbaria.

Section 9 - Health

- 9:1 Schools for training of Auxilliary Medical Personnel;
- 9:2 The supervision of private medical care, control of Nursing Homes and of diagnostic facilities within a Province;
- 9:3 Population control and family planning;





04. REGIONAL OFFICES:

The Director General of Health Services, North-East Province is responsible for managing and supervising all work connected with Health Services in the Regional Offices and all medical institutions in the North-East Province. There are five (05) Regional Offices headed by Regional Director of Health Services at Amparai, Batticaloa, Trincomalee, Vavuniya and Jaffna. The Organisation Chart of an office of a Regional Director of Health Services is shown in Chart II.





05. SUBJECTS AND FUNCTIONS.

The Ministry of Health, North East Provincial Government is charged with the responsibility of providing guidance and policy direction to the Health and Ayurvedic Services by the provision of establishments and services necessary for the prevention and treatment of diseases and generally for the preservation and promotion of the health of the people living distributed in the following Administrative Districts of the Province.

The responsibility of the Ministry includes the executive management of the health services by direction, supervision of the functions and evaluation of the services provided to the public under the two substantive Programmes (1) Patient care services (2) Community Health Services through the Regional Directors of Health Services with the objective goal of attaining better health status for the people.

This is done through the net work of Curative, Rehabilitative, Preventive and Primary Health Care Centres ranging from central Dispensaries/Specialised Clinics providing outpatient treatment to the largest types of hospitals of the nature of General Hospitals and Specialised Hospitals. A classified list of these Medical/Health Centres are shown in Pharty III. Distribution of Bed-strength of hospitals is as indicated in Assahante IV.

However the Administrative control of the following hospitals are not devolved and is retained at the Centre.

- A. General Hospital (Teaching) Jaffna
- B. Specialised Hospitals -
 - 1. T.B. Hospital, Kankesanthurai
 - 2. Leprosy Hospital, Mantivu

The functions comprise of Planning, Management of Medical, Para-Medical & Supportive Staff, Management of Drugs, Medical Laboratory and General Stores, Equipments, Machinery, Vehicles including Ambulances; Construction and Maintenance of Buildings with infra structure facilities; Financial Administration and Control: General Administration & Staff Services Management.

PLANNING

The activities include the following:-

- (i) Preparation of the Annual and Medium Term Provincial Health Development Plans in accordance with National Policy
- (ii) Preparation of the Provincial Public Investment Programme
- (iii)Implementation, Supervision, Monitoring and Evaluation of Annual Medium Term and Capital Provincial Health Development Plans.
- (iv) Establishment of Provincial Management Information
 System
- (v) Provision of Health Data to the National Level for the National Health Information System.

PATIENT CARE SERVICES

The activities include the following:-

- (i) Providing both Indoor and Outdoor Medical Treatment to the sick in Provincial, Base, District, Peripheral, Rural Hospitals and Maternity Homes & Outdoor Treatment (only) at Central Dispensaries
- (ii) Providing Ante and Post Natal Care of Mothers at all Hospitals
- (iii) Performing Surgical interventions on patients when required
- (iv) Provision of all basic specialities in Provincial and Base Hospitals and establishment of clinics for specialised care of patients Viz. Cardiac(Heart), Hiabetes, Surgical, Eye, Ear, Nose & Throat, Dental and provision of finer specialities like Neuro-Surgery, Thoracic Surgery and Paediatric Surgery
- (v) Provision of Peripheral Consultation and Support Services to Institutions around Provincial and Base Hospitals
- (vi) Provision of Specialist Consultant Service from Provincial and Base Hospitals to other Medical Institutions to prevent specialist concious public filtering into Provincial and Base Hospitals.
- (vii) Provision of specialised Medical Care, both Indoor and Outdoor, to patients suffering from Tuberculosis, Leprosy, Mental Illness, Cancer and Sexually Transmitted Diseases
- (viii)Opening of New Hospitals and Up-Grading of existing Hospitals in accordance with Policies and Standards specified by the National Ministry of Health
- (ix) Construction and Maintenance of all buildings and provision of infrastructure facilities
- (x) Procurement and Distribution of Furniture, Linen and other Hospital needs, such as Non-Medical Equipment, Diet and the like
- (xi) Procurement of Drugs, Dressings, Consumables, Surgical Soft Goods, X-ray films and Chemicals, Laboratory Glass Ware and Chemicals and Medical Equipments from the Medical Supplies Division and the Bio-Medical Engineering Division of National Ministry of Health
- (xii) Management of all Medical and Health Institutions other than General Hospital (Teaching) Jaffna, Nurses Training Schools of Jaffna & Batticaloa, Leprosy Hospital, Mantivu and Chest Hospital, Kankesanthurai.
- (xiii)Deployment of Staff within the Province
- (xiv) Establishment of Ayurvedic Dispensaries and Hospitals

The activities under the Indigenous Medical System include the following:-

- (i) Treatment of patients under the Ayurvedic System.
 All the Hospitals and Dispensaries presently

- (v) Providing assistance to Free Dispensaries and Hospitals run by the Local Authorities.
 - (vi) Establishment of New Ayurvedic Hospitals and Dispensaries.
 - (vii) Ayurvedic Preservation Boards.

- (viii) Establishment of Institutions for the purpose of training of students to sit for exams conducted by the Ayurveda Education and Hospital Board.
- (ix) Establishment of Homeopathic Dispensaries and Hospitals.

COMMUNITY HEALTH

The Health Policy is geared towards the achievement of the goal of "Health for all by the Year 2000" and this would be achieved by implementation of the Primary Health Care Programme. Priority would therefore be given for Community Health Services.

Community Health Services include the following activities:-

- (i) General Preventive Services and Environmental Sanitation.
- (ii) Health Education
- (iii) Family Health, including Maternity and Child Care, including Family Planning & Immunisation
- (iv) School Health, including School Dental Health
- (v) Malaria Control
- (vi) Filariasis Control
- (vii) Sexually Transmitted Diseases Control
- (viii) Rabies Control
- (ix) Food Quality Control.

Community Health Services are managed mainly by Medical Officers of Health, Public Health Inspectors, Health Educators, Public Health Nurses including Dental Nurses, Midwives, Family Health Workers and Field Assistants.

SPECIALISED CAMPAIGNS

Management of activities of the following specialised campaigns at the Regional level in terms of the policy set out by the National Ministry of Health.

- (i) Control of Malaria
- (ii) Control of Filaria
- (iii) Control of Leprosy
- (iv) Control of Tuberculosis
- (v) Control of Rabies
- (vi) Control of Sexully Transmitted Diseases.

PERSONNEL ADMINISTRATION

- (i) All activities relating to personnel administration of non-Technical Staff
- (ii) All activities, other than basic training, relating to personnel administration of Technical Staff. (Disciplinary control of all Health officers belonging to National Service but serving on secondment/deputation will come under the National Ministry of Health).
- (iii) Conduct of all efficiency bar examinations and departmental examinations, in terms of guide lines set out by the National Ministry of Health.
- (iv) Promotions in all grades belonging to the Provincial Health Services depending on the cadre, in accordance with the policy of National Ministry of Health.
- (v) Selections for further training within Sri Lanka in consultation with the National Ministry of Health.
- (vi) Conduct inservice programme for all catagories of staff.

TRAINEES

206 Pre-Pupil Midwives have been selected for training 16 Dispensers

It has been the experience in the past that the vacancies in the trained and untrained cadres of various grades of employees are not filled fully. There has been vacancies ranging from 50% to 90%. All vacancies in the Health Institutions amongst the cadre where training is not necessary have been filled in 1989. Where possible, training has started in full scale in the available Training Centres in the North-East, viz. Schools of Nursing Batticaloa and Jaffna. However in other grades of Para-Medical Staff where training has to be done in Colombo, attempts are being made to train such personnel selected from North-East. The biggest problem facing the Major Medical Institutions, which we are unable to overcome at the moment, is the acute shortage of Junior as well Senior Medical personnel. Attempts are being made to obtain the services of Specilists from abroad, while employing junior staff on casual basis to provide the urgently needed basic treatment and hope the present critical situation would ease out enabling the Medical Officers to report in North-East Province.

07. FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION

The Finance Branch of the North-East Provincial Ministry of Health started functioning with one clerk from 25th January 1989. A current operational Bank Account was opened with the Bank of Ceylon Trincomalee on 09.03.89, bearing Account No. 106676. The finances of the Provincial Ministry of Health are not yet fully devolved. The line Ministry i.e the State Ministry of Health is continuing to grant allocations to the five Regional Directors of Health Services in the Province directly.

The activities include the following:-

- (i) Preparation, Implementation and Supervision of Provincial Budget in terms of Annual Provincial Plans.
- (ii) Evaluation of financial performance.
- (iii) Providing Financial Information to the National Ministry of Health.

Regarding Capital Expenditure, orders have already been placed for one Motor Car for the Secretary and urgently required office equipments. The Motor Car has since been purchased and payment made in August 1989.

The State Ministry of Health has granted financial allocations for Recurrent Expenditure and Capital Expenditure, direct to the Five (5) Regional Directors to meet all expenses in their offices as well as in all Medical Institutions in their regions during 1989. Monthly Expenditure is intimated direct to the State Ministry of Health by the Regional Directors of Health Services, with a summary of expenditure to this Ministry.


The Ministry Office was housed in the present Secretariat

Sea View Road, Trincomalee towards the end of June, 1989.


It is proposed to put up a Secretariat for the Health Ministry at

10. PRIMARY HEALTH CARE PROGRAMME.

The North East Provincial Co ncil is committed to the "ALMA ATA" declaration by the world Health organisation to which Sri Lanka is also a signatory. This declaration has the goal of attaining "Health for all by the year 2000 A.D". It has been agreed world over that this state could be achieved in the third world countries only by working out the grassroot level through the Family Health worker sometimes called the "Bare Foot Doctor" working in the Rural Areas, replaceing the traditional Field Midwife, operating from primary Health care centre and mainly concerned with the prevension of diseases. She will also be cog under the referal system preventing over crowding of hospitals. The selection of Family Health Workers is now done on an area basis, so that after training, they will be posted to the same area.

PRIMARY HEALTH CARE CENTRES (GRAMODAYA HEALTH CENTRES.)

The North East Provincial Government is showing its commitments by allocating nearly half the Health Budget to this Project.

11 REHABILITATION AND RECONSTRUCTION.

Normally the Ministry would mainly concern itself and direct its energy to expand activities and improve the services provided to the people for stated goal of attaining better health status by providing the needed facilities and services for Curitive Care, (with Surgical interventions where required) Preventive and Primary Health care. But unfortunately from the first breath, the Ministry's energy had to be vastly directed and devoted to the task of Reconstruction and Rehabilitation. High priority had to be given to Rehabilitation and Reconstruction activities. In view of the fact that as many as 142 Institutions in the North-East Province were severely damaged and / or affected (One completely : District Hospital Adampan) due to militant activities or Security Forces operations , a sum of Rs. 160 million was estimated in 1987 for Reconstruction and Rehabilitation. It is regretted that only a sum of Rs.10 million rupees has been allowed under the Emergency Rehabilitation and Reconstruction Programme and that too from June, 1989. It is hoped that the National Ministry of Reconstruction and Rehabilitation will take an active role in rehabilitating the ailing Health sector in the North-East. The Ministry with the rapport and strong support from the Chief Secretary's Secretariat did not and does not spare concerted effort in finding ways and means in seeking resources fur Reconstruction and Rehabilitation from whatever sources - Government or non- Governmental Organisations, foreign and local. Aids already received, agreed, and /or under consideration are indicated under respective assistance programmes.

REHABILITATION AND RECONSTRUCTION

A total sum of Rs. 166.3 million has been requested for Reconstruction and Rehabilitation of the damaged and affected Health Institutions in the O5 R.D.H.S.Divisions of the North-East Province as shown hereunder:-

- 7. Ensure the intrasectoral and intersectoral Co-ordinations with Governmental and N.G.OO.
- 8. Review and monitor performances.
- Pay attention to the maintenance of Capital assets buildings, equipments, vehicles and other utility services.
- 10. Organise collection and maintenance of statistical data.
- 11. Organising for establishment of a Para-Medical Training Institute for Radiographers, Medical Laboratory Technologists, Pharmacists and Physiotherapists.
- 12. Organising and Establishmentof a Bio-Medical Engineering Service Unit for North-East Province at Trincomalee.
- 13. Continue attempts to obtain services of Specialists from abroad through Governmental and N.G.OO assistance and goodwill to overcome acute shortage of Senior Medical Personnel.
- 14. Obtain the assistance of the State Ministry of Health and the Public Service Commission of the North East Province to fill vacancies of para-medical, preventive, Primary Health care staff.
