PERCY BYSSHE SHELLY 1792 — 1822 was one of the great poets of the Victorian Age. He was greatly admired by the Tamil poet Barathi. Both loved nature, sympathiesd with poor, upheld womens' rights and though pessimistic a regards their own lives, were quite optimistic as far as mankind was concerned.

Both died at a very young age — Shelly at the age of 30, and Barathi at the age of 39. As a young boy of Eddayapuram, Barathi organised a literary Circle aclled "Shelly Guild", to read and enjoy the poems of Shelly. For many years he used to write his poems with the pen name Shelly Thasan. The following poen of Barathi shows the influence of Shelly on Barathi's life and work.

Rarely, rarely, comest thou, Sprit of Delight: Wherefore hast thou left me now Many a day and night? Many a weary night and day 'Tis since thou art fled away. How shall every one like me Win thee back again? With the joyous and the free Thou with scoff at pain, Spirit false; thou hast forgot All but those who need thee pot, I love love - though he has wings and like light can flee, But above all other things. Spirit, I love thee -Thou art love and life: Oh, come, Make once more my heart thy home.

We, the laity representatives belonging to various dioceses of the CSI assembled at the Temple City of Madurai to participate in the Golden Jubilee Laity Assembly on August 22 & 23, 1997 on the campus of American College and examined the mission of the laity in the contemporary society and our paricipation in building of the nation and the

church. We were stimulated by inspiring bible studies, informative talks, challenging panel discussions and educative exhibitions.

The Laity Assembly cele brated God's gracious act of calling and constituting all and each nember of the church as a holy nation, royal priesthood and God's own possession. We acknowledge that we are incorporated as members into the one holy body of our Lord Jesus Christ, and authentic extension of the incarnate word to continue the ministry of our Lord. the assembly rejoices in the fact that all the believer are endowed with charisma for the building up of the church in order that the church might serve as an instrument of the kingdom.
