Bishop Spells Out

7 Point Programme

It is with great pleasure that I welcome you all to the 51st Sessions of the Jaffna Diocesan Council of the Church of South India. For the past two years, only the delegates from Churches within the peninsula attended the sessions Today we are very happy to see delegates from Colombo also attending the sessions. This indicates that very soon we will see the dawn in our midst.

When we held our sessions last year, Bishop D J. Ambalavanar was in our midst. In that meeting I said, that we had few founder members Viz Bishop S. Kulandren, the Rev J. J. Ratnarajah and Mr. S. S Selvadurai were present, at the 40th Sessions but today they have all gone beyond the veil. Then, Bishop D. J Ambalavanar corrected me and said, that Mrs: Ruth Bunker one of the founder members was still with us and that we must send our greetings to her. When I went to America last year, I spoke to her and conveyed to her the greetings of the Diocesan Council

There may be some here today, who are older to Bishop Ambalavanar, but no-one can deny that only he was the bridge between the old and the new. Today we are here to continue his work as a new generation. We are about to enter into a new era with the prayer of psalmist 'O Lord God, thou art our refuge from generation to generation'

At this juncture, it is necessary to look behind as well as to look forward. Prophet Jeremiah said stand at the cross-roads and look and ask for the ancient paths where the good way lies: and walk in it and find the rest for your souls (Jer 6: 16 NRSV). According to the Revelation the one who was seated on the throne said 'See 1 am making all things new' (Rev. 21; 5 NRSV). Therefore let us accept both the old and the new and continue the Lords work.

The time in which we live is a period of suffering. Because of the war situation in our country 90% of the familes in our areas are not living together. Yet we can be proud of the fact, that we are living in such a time when changes are taking place at Lightening speed. Today we are seeing diverse changes similar to what occurred in 1930s and 40 S. One day we will take pride in saying that we lived during this critical and crucial time.

It will be a great thing to claim that we lived with people of this country when there was danger. Barathithasan also said "the hands those played in the cruel valley of death are our hands of victory".

Crises give us new opportunities as well. The task that God gave us is to make the best use of these opportunities. When we celebrated the birth anniversary of Daniel Poor in 1989, Eelanadu Daily, in its editorial stated, "Though the American Missionaries came here to propagate Christianity actually they gave the new country, sideals values and impetus: When they came it was a new country even today if you go there you can see that they like novelty

Mr. S. J. V. Chelvanayagam never let the Tamils down. He possessed an icy, precise mind and a translucent personal intergrity. Those qualities enabled Thanthai Chelva to establish the Eelam Tamil nation. Prior to Thanthai Chelva the Tamil leaders spoke of how the Tamil people could live and work together with the Sinhalese and the other cammunities in a united Ccylon whereas Thanthai Chelva, the prophet, realised that this was not possible. And so he proceeded to place on a solid foundation the Eelam Tamil Nation that he created, separate and distinct He did not establish a politically independent sovereign state. But as a first step he made the Tamil speaking peoples regard themselves as a nation. No other Tamil leader either before or after independence was able to achieve what at first seemed and objective impossible to accomplish.

Lord had already entered into His Passion when He spoke these words. Going out of the Upper Room after the last supper, He arrived whith His Apostles at the Garden of Gethsemane which was to be the scene of that terrible agony of soul. He chose three of them to be His companions during that agony, the three who had also witnessed His gloriaus transfiguration. Peter, James and John. They must have seen that He was in great distress of soul, but their eyes were heavy with sleep and so, after His first hour of prayer, He found them asleep 'Could you not watch one hour with me?' He asks St. Peter. Then He warns them all to watch and pray. Again they ignore His warning and return to sleep, leaving Him to face His agony alone.

Had they listened to His warning they might not have fled in the moment of supreme trial, leaving Him to face His Passion without them. Peter, especially, might have won the grace to confess his Master openly at the court of the High Priest instead of ignominiously denying with an oath that he had anything to do with Jesus. Surely there is a great lesson for us in this scene and in Qur Lord's words! Prayer is a duty, not necessarily a pleasure. God.

as our Creator, has a right to the homage of our prayet. because He is our God and also because we depend on Him for all that we have If we wish to be faithfu. to that consecration of our selves to Him which we made in Baptism then we dare not omit or neglect this obligation. Yet how few of us ever truly make an effort to give God the homage of real prayer, well said in a spirit of reco-Ilection! Sometimes it is mere laziness which prompts this neglect; at others it is the feeling that God is so far away and that we have so many other important things to do. Yet nothing is so important as our life of prayer. If we really paid full attention to it what a difference it would make in our lives!

The American Missionaries in Ceylon worked among Tamils only. The Anglican and Methodist Churches have many influencial personalities, among them but we do not have such dignitaries. They have erected many memorials for their missionaries through the Sinhala Government. It grieves us when we realize that we havent done much to those who sacrificed their lives among us Therefore we mist work hard to erect memorials for them.

First we must look forward and have a clear vision as to where we should work in future. The pride of expanding to Kilinochchi, Vavuniya and Batticaloa the church that once was confined to the peninsula goes to our former Bishop D. J. Ambalavanar, Because of his distant visonwe are able to work in many parts of Sri Lanka. Our focus of attention in future should be the Central Hills. We have already sent one worker to Nu-

waraelia. The encouragement given by people there is very good. We have already started a Day Care Centre at Labukelle We have plans to set up a childrens Home in Kottagala soon. The Church of South India has a right and duty to work among the people of Central Hills

Secondly it is necessary to expand our work in Colombo. The Girls Hostel established there due of the efforts of our former Bishop is functioning well now. It is necessary to establish a library and boys hostel in memory of Bishop D J. Ambalavanar. The estimated cost is circa Rs. 40 million We must work hard for this purpose. The housing problem for youth will be solved to some extent when this hostel is set up. Miss Carol Arulnantham will submit a proposal to the Synod Working committee when it meets on March 12th I also believe that we will be able to make decisions at this ession about the purchase of a land for this purpose.

Selvaratnam of Tellipalai, Mrs Ranji Joshua of Uduvil, Miss S Vaithianathan of Delft and Miss E. Selliah of Navaly.

Mannar Catholic Bishop Visits Jaffna.

The Rt. Rev. Rayappu Joseph, Bishop of Mannar of the Roman Catholic Church visited Jaffna recently. In an interview to "Pathukavalar" a Catholic Tamil Weekly, he said, that he visited Jaffna to see the condition of people in Jaffna who returned after the displacement.

He wanted all those displaced to come back to Jaffna and settle in their own villages. All must come back and join hands in rebuilding the society. On the contrary, living here and there as a displaced socitey, would bring in more sufferings on individuals and on society. People here may face some difficulties undergo sufferings Yet living together will be advantageous to the entire Tamil community The Bishop also visited Island of Delft, his birth place.

Thirdly, the educational standard of our workers should be raised. Most of the English educated Pastors have left the country. Dr. Samuel Fs Green who realized this problem as far back as 1848 conducted his medical classes. n Tamil. Today Jaffna University and Tamil Nadu Theological Seminary in Madurai have facilities to provide higher education in Tamil. We are happy that Rev. A. Thevakunananthan and Rev. Fourthly, the plight of our women should be taken into consideration. Our Vocational Training Centres help the women to some extent. However, we are unable to provide them with comprehensive service which the Roman Catholic Church is able to, through their establishments. Today, the problems of women affect our society to great extent. The women leaders of the Church should take this into consideration and draw plans to uplift the status of women Many organizations are willing to help us in these programmes.

Fifth, We must revive our Hospitals. The midical mission is part and parcel of our Diocese. I have talked to our Medical professionals in this regard.
