'Christ is risen' was the message that was given to a few women on the first Easter morn.

These women went to the tomb where Jesus' body was laid, in order to give him a last loving service. They left for the Garden of Gesthemene when it was still dark. It was the hour when people would not venture out. It was the time when soldiers of the occupying army were sprawling.

There was danger outside. Perhaps, the men of Chief Priest were on the lookout for the associates of the national traitor. These women were vulnerable at the hands of, occupying army and other men. In a patriarchal society in which they lived, women had no place and so, could have been raped, molested or arrested on false charge of adultary.

The men who were friends and disciples of Jesus are now hiding behind closed doors. They have buried all their hopes under the blankets with which they have covered themselves. These men were trying to bury any sign of their association with the man who was killed for treason When men were trying to sever all ties with their dead master, a few frail women steped out into the darkness boldly. They had no hope; they had buried their only hope three days ago. Yet, they could not forget their dead.

These women were acting on love. They were following their master from Galilee to Jerusalem. They were witnessing in silence to all what was happening to their dear friend. They were in pain as they were looking at the cross on which their saviour was hanging. They followed Joseph of Aremathea and noted where their hope was buried.

Also on this Easter morn they are at the place where their hope was buried. They HOPE \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*



didn't expect to see a risen Christ where they buried him. All they wanted to do was to show their love to their dead friend. No matter what happens they wanted to be with their dead friend.

What these women did was an act of protest. They knew that their friend was innocent They knew that the leaders of the nation were evil and that they were very powerful. There was nothing that these women could do to stop the murder of one who always did good to the community.

They have now resolved to show their protest in the only way which they thought was proper - to be at the tomb of their dead leader. Let those who killed our leader arrest and kill us also.

Let us be the first martyrs of the resistance movement

which we are to start was, perhaps, their attitude. Whe ther others will follow us or not let us start this movement they resolved. Nobody is going to turn the stone; we must do it ourselves. So let us go forward— they told each other as they approached the tomb.

These women, who set-out in the darkness of lost hope were greeted by two men who said "Jesus is risen" "Why are you searching him among the dead, for, he is risen; go and proclaim this good news to his friends". Martha believed in Jesus and her brother was raised to life again as a reward for her faith.

These women were willing to sacrifice their lives for their beloved friend, and their saviour was raised again as a reward. Dead hopes are brought back to life when we prepare to lay down our lives for the sake of God and people.
