KILLING OF CIVILIANS

IN IKILALISEA CONTINUES

5 DEAD - BOAT BURNT

The murder by Sri Lankan forces of civilian passengers crossing the sea at Kilali is continuing, while efforts are being made by UNHCR and the Anglican Bishop of Colombo to persuade the government to allow free travel between peninsular Jaffna and mainland outside.

News reaching Jaffna from Kilali states that on Wednesday, January 27, a boat beading to Kilali from Poonakari was shot at by a Sri Lankan Air Force helicopter which resulted in 5 of the 6 occupants of the boat dying and the boat itself catching fire. There was only one survivor.

Kandiah Paartheepan, a refugee from Mandaitivu now living in Kopay, who is the only survivor said that 6 of them started from Poonakari in a boat along with merchandise to be brought to Jaffna. They started about 7.30 a.m. and had travelled for about an hour, when a Sri Lankan Air Force helicopter was sighted.

*Copter fires

The helicopter began to fire at the boat. Kandiah Paartheepan said that he was swimming underneath left. After the helicopter had boat which had caught fire injuries.

and tried to put out the fre along with some copassengers who had similarly iumped into the sea. When they went inside the boat they found two of their fellow passengers lying dead inside the boat.

As they were trying to row the boat, the helicopter came back again from the direction of Elephant Pass and started firing. They jumped again into the sea but two of them received shots and died. The boat began to burn again.

Kandiah Paartheepan said that he and the other survivor Thevathas began to swim for safety. Both of them were injured.

Lone Survivor

Kandiah Paartheepan also said that while they were so swimming, Thevathas began jumped into the sea and to be fatigued and could not swim, though he tried. the water until the helicopter In fact Thevathas died presumably because of the left, he went back to the bleeding from the gun shot

Kandiah Paartheepan said that he tried to bring along with him Thevathas's corpse but he himself was fatigued because of bleeding and continuous swimming, and had to abandon the effort to bring Therathas's body with him.

Towards 6 00 p. m, he reached the shores of Kilali and fell unconscious. He had a leg injury.

Kandiah Paartheepan also said that while in the boat they signalled to the helicopter waving white pieces of cloth indicating that they were civilian passengers but the helicopter did not desist from firing.

The five persons killed have been identified as Thavam (15) and his brother Sinnavan (30) both refugees from Purgudutivu. Thevathas, Panchaling am and Jeganathan.

War Crime

Observers say that the continued killing by Sci Lankan forces of civilian passengers in the Kilali sea is a war clime by the Sinhala Government. Though the Government has prohibited use of the Jifina lagoon for transport under Emergency Regulations, the regulations do not permit the forces to shoot at those who violate the probibition. The Government and everyone knows that the Jaffna population use the Kilali sea for their travel to the main-

Recently, even the Anglican Bishop of Colombo, Rt. Rev. Kenneth Fernando, came to Jaffaa through this prohibited area because there is no other communication route.

Rt. Rev. Kenneth Fernando who had himself experienced the di ficulties and dangers the people undergo, is taking efforts to open an access to

According to news even the UNHOR is negotiating to open an access for free travel and transport of goods to and from Jaffna.

In this con ext the continued killing of civilianpassengers, be it in the day or night, is apart from being a war crime, also clearly ind cates the genecidal intent of the Sinhala Government.

ROOKING

The news item "Bank of Ceylon rooks its customers in Jaffna" appearing in your issue of 27.12.92 comes like a bolt from the blue.

Banks are not merely repositories of public funds but their faiths too.

Unlike the customers in the South who are big-time mudalalis, gem merchants and landed proprietors who are able to reflect colossal sums as deposits, people in the North East are pror farmers and cultivators, small - scale business men, public servants and pensioners whose monthly incomes do not justify running accounts in banks. Nevertheless by their frugality and modest living, they are able to hold in deposits sums for a rainy day or to meet expenses arising cut of sudden illness or a death in the tamily. Even whatever they had in their reserves, stand depleted owing to their activities getting stalled due to the on - going war. In order to keep their heads above water, the moderates and the lower income - groups and daily wage - earners have to go in for borrowing various sums at high interest rates.

Now the banks have declared their offensive against their customers in the North. There are bounds and limits for endurance. Let the plight of some revenue - earning state institutions like the CTB, Excise, Electricity and the Cement Corporation be a lesson to the banks.

It bristles beyond any manner of doubt that the State having realised its inability to stand a battle with the LTIE and sensing that it is loosing its grip of the North East, is indulging in various unpopular measures, crippling the economy of the Tamils with a view to tarnish the image of the LTTE amongst the Tamil community. But the trend is far from the State expectation. By every misdeed of the Sate, the LTTE is gaining momentum.

Finally a note of caution to the customers and wouldbe customers. Draw a line to your transactions with the Banks and avoid heart-burns that may give rise to adoption of stringent measures the State is likely to contemplate in view of its economic Crisis.

Conspiracy Boomerangs

In an all out effort to spread India's hegemony in South East Asia the Congress (I) rulers in New Delhi have been conspiring to weaken and destabilize her smaller neighbours.

Congress (I) ru'ers' claim to power in New Delhi was based on the false claim that they were the successors to the great freedom fighters of the preindependence days. But the world does not forget the fact that in their thirst for power the Congress men failed to observe a fundamental advice given by the apostle of the Indian freedom movement, Mahathma Gandhi, to dissolve the Congress after independence.

The scramble for power internally, gave birth to power-hunger outside and to satisfy that power hunger Indian leaders started to meddle in the affairs of militarily weaker neighbours. India is today unable to open its mouth in the face of charges levelled against her by the LTTE and defend her conduct.
