REPORT FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2012 - 2013 & 2013 - 20014

INTRODUCTION

The God Almighty in His boundless mercy has helped us enjoy a good and smooth year and through His providence directed us to perform our duties very well in our institute. Therefore we thank Him and praise Him for His kindness and loving concern over us. I am happy to welcome in our midst our bishop Rt. Rev. Dr. Thomas Savundaranyagam the Patron and Chancellor of this institute and our guest honour Mr. D. S. Soosaithas LL.B. Attorney-at-Law, Senior State Counsel, Attorney General's Department. We also welcome our Vicar General, Very Rev. Fr. Justin B. Gnanapiragasam, the newly elected Provincial of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate very Rev. Fr. Edwin Vasantharajah. The Provincial Superior of the Holy Family Rev. Sr. Christa, I also welcome the new students, Rev. Fathers. Rev. Sisters, and all the guests.

THE SITUATION IN THE NORTH

The war ended in 2009, and the guns are silenced. But the people are carrying the scars of the war on themselves. . The impact of war such as disturbed sleep and appetite, increased anxiety and nightmares, flash backs, thinking about the event constantly, hyper-alertness and confusion, overwhelming fear/emotional shock, fears of traumatic happening again, insecure feelings and feelings of helplessness, fleeing life's not worth living and attempts of suicide, disinterest in surroundings and withdrawal from others, memory and concentration problems and so on continue to haunt them. The children are the most affected in this war. During such times our institution was and is in the forefront helping the victims of the war and tsunami relieving them of their trauma and their mental stress. The presence of the army also contributes to the state of anxiety and other mental illnesses.

ACTIVITIES: COUNSELLING THE VICTIMS OF WAR

Since 2013 we are doing this project. We take a special attention on school going children and their parents and teachers. We came across many children who have lost either both or one of their parents and their siblings. Due to this they do have traumatic experience. Through counselling and support we help them to study. We are doing this in some part of Vanni where most of the people are affected directly due to the war. We also do this in some parts of Jaffna peninsula where people got displaced to Vanni during war. Some of these families still didn't get their houses as they were destroyed. Many are still languishing in the camps as their lands are grabbed by the government for the use of the military.

The other important thing is as the government still maintains zero casualties during war; we are not allowed to do counselling and to have any contact with the resettled people. Hence we have to take permission from the District secretary of the government, G.S. and military to do this work. We have to go through a lot of odds to do this work. Anyhow we are doing this work well enough. We not only do counselling but also visit their houses. After the school hours we conduct child friendly space, play and art therapy and counselling for the children

COUNSELLING

We are doing counselling in our institution where 4 to 6 families or individuals come for counselling on daily basis. We get families who have problems as well as individually disturbed persons who have neurotic symptoms too.

We do group counselling for the widows and the victims of war trauma. The government has neglected this part of the program completely. Anyway we made use of the opportunity to do this ministry where ever it is needed.

FAMILY MINISTRY

Our diocese had taken **Human Dignity and Family** as the theme for this year to conscientize the families of their responsibilities and duties. We do the following programs for the benefit of the families.

- 1. Visiting all the parishes in our diocese and do enrichment programs for the married couples
- 2. Marriage preparation course for the to be married couples for two days in a month
- 3. Counselling services for the families

- 4. Training of family ministers in parishes
- 5. Natural Family planning and pro-life movement
- 6. Awareness programs on family violence and alcoholism

DIPLOMA IN COUNSELLING PSYCHOLOGY AND FORMATION OF COUNSELLORS

This time we have $10^{\rm th}$ and 11th batches of students to be given diploma in counselling psychology. 17 students in the year 2012 to 2013 and 31 from 2013 to 2014 concluded their Diploma program.

The staff is very strict in forming them and they did a yeomen job in their teaching and formation. In the academic year 2012 - 20013 out of 17 students one got the merit pass and in the year 1013 - 2014 out of 31 students one obtained a merit pass. The others were successful.

The academic staff of the counselling section worked tirelessly with dedication to form them as good counsellors. I thank the staff for their cooperation and the work that they have done to bring out good quality counsellors. I also congratulate all the counselling students for their achievements. They did their work very well and put more work to achieve their goal.

DIPLOMA IN PEACE BUILDING AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT PRACTICE

We advertised this program twice for the year 2012 and 2013, only two applied and we had to drop the program. During the time of war, there was a need for this as there were very many NGOs employing them. Now many have gone out of the country as they have been pressurized

to close down. The applicants seek only job oriented courses and as this course has no demand none shows any interest.

EXTENSION OF AHAVOLI

I am happy to let you know that we have erected a three story building consisting of class rooms, counselling rooms and visitors' rooms. It was possible due to the generosity of our bishop and chancellor who gave us the land to put up this building. We were able to get funds with the help of Church in Need, Germany and with our Jaffna Diocesan Aid. Now we have amble space for our activities.

SENTIMENTS OF GRATITUDE

I thank the almighty God for all the blessings that He showered on us and inspired us to do this ministry well. He made everything possible for us to educate our youth in His own way.

I thank our Bishop, the Patron and Chancellor for his unstinted support to our institution. He always encourages with his advice and looks into the maintenance of this institute. He is very much concerned about the progress of this institute.

We are grateful to the administration of National University of Ireland, Galway for their direction, advice and financial help. I thank the President of NUIG, Dr. James J. Browne and the Director Ms. Nuala McGuinn for their encouragements and support that they are giving to us with their messages.

Our special thanks go to all the members of staff for their untiring efforts for the formation of our students. It is due to their dedicated services, our students are awarded the Diplomas today. We also thank the clerical staff for their valuable services.

CONCLUSION

Dear students, you are going to be awarded with certificates of Diploma in Counselling Psychology and Peace Building and Social Development Practice. Now that the war has come to an end but the people carry with them the scars and effects of wars. The war has left more than 80,000 widows who are struggling both psychologically and physically to survive. There are children without parents, and vice versa. Most of the people have lost their life's savings, homes and their ancestor's lands. Many people are in a state of anxiety about their missing near and dear ones. We get reports of many attempted suicide cases very often. Many are languishing in the camps and prisons not knowing when they will go to their places or reunite with their dear ones. This war left many people with psychiatric illness. We have a great task ahead as counsellors to give light to their lives. You will have to work hard with full of dedication to rebuild their lives and instil in them the hope and help them to live a meaningful life.

Our institution feels very happy and proud of your achievements. I congratulate you with the staff. I wish you all success in your pursuit and career. I thank you all and God bless you.
