INSPECTORS' CONFERENCE

SCHOLARSHIPS AT CENTRAL SCHOOLS

Six hundred free scholarships for deserving pupils are to be established, according to a decision arrived at by the education authorities, it was revealed at a school inspectors' conference on Wednesday.

It is proposed to establish fifteen Central Schools and each of these institutions is to offer forty free scholarships. Central Schools will cater for students desirous of pursuing academic studies as well as for those wanting instruction with a vocational

The scholarships will enable the sons and daughters of poor parents who possess talent to carry on their studies at Government expense.

2,000 Altogether

It is learned that it is the intention of the Director ultimately to establish fifty Central Schools and two thousand scholarships for boys and girls.
