# MUCH OF RELIGION!

## Abolish Controls Swaraj Party Indicts Government

The newly formed Lanka Swaraj Party wants all controls to be abolished immediately. At a meeting of the organising committee of the party held on Friday last, the following resolutions were passed.

(1) That the textile Control should be abolished forthwith. Its administration is chaotic, and has altogether failed in its purpose.

The Committee considers that the peop'e coud not possibly by the abolition of this control be placed in a worse position than they are in at present, since there is evidence of available supplies which are not being utilised.

(2) That there is no reason whatever for the further continuance of the co-trol of paper cars tyres and petrol. #### "Arrest Jinnah"!

A resolution urging the Government of India to declare the Muslim League illegal and arrest all League leaders including Jinnah as the Muslim League has resorted to rebellion and bloodshed was passed at a meeting of the Anti-Pakistan Front held during the last week-end Mr. L. G. Thatte, General Secretary of the All-India Anti-Pakistan Front has sent a telegram to the Viceroy requesting His Excellency to suspend the League Government of Bengal and give the administration of the province to the Governor as the League Government there is incompetent to maintain peace and order in Bengal and as Hindu life, Congress has also condemned the incompetence of the League Ministry in Bengal in no uncertain terms. #### Sikhs Warn Jinnah
