The pilgrimage to Shri Vaishno Devi largely contributes to the economic well-being of the people of Jammu. On a conservative estimate, even if average expenditure per pilgrim be taken at Rs 20 in the State territory and the number of pilgrims about two lakhs, the total amount they have in the State comes to Rs 40 lakhs apart from several lakhs more in the form of offeriugs. The chief beneficiaries are the two towns of Jammu and Katra.
