The governance of any country in the world to-day is no easy matter and the governance of a great and varied country like India is perhaps as hard a task as any in the world to-day.

Any person who is associated with this governance must approach this great task with humility as well as with a measure of faith. Whether we are small men or big, we are engaged in great undertakings affecting the life and future of vast numbers of buman beings. No man can say with certainty that success will come to him, but every man can determine to do his utmost to achieve success.

The governance of a conntry does not merely consist in issuing orders from some high office but rather in reaching the minds and hearts of the masses of the people to bring about satisfactory human relations. Ultimately, almost every problem can be resolved into one of buman relations.

We have to deal with human beings and humanity them if we always keep in view the human aspect of every problem. We are apt to forget this, living in our ivory towers of Government offices and dealing impersonally with files and papers.
