Thiruketheeswaram Temple

Kumbha - Abhishekam

(BY A DEVOTEE)

The Kumbha - Abhishekam at the premier Saiva Shrine in Ceylon, Thiruketheeswaram, took place on Wednesday the 9th inst. with all devotion and solemnity. The temple was made ready and beautified with the necessary and substantial repairs to the existing old and dilapidated buildings. Sri Sellakannu Sthapathi, his assistants, and many masons and labourers worked day and night for about a month to have the temple ready for the occasion. The whole cost of the repairs amounting to about Rs 8000/- was met by the philanthropist and philosopher, Mr. K. V. S. Sundaram of Colombo a Vice-President of the Thiruketheeswaram Temple Restoration Society. Mr. ST. M. P. Sithambaranatha Chettiar, a member of the Working Committee of the Restoration Society, was at the Thiru-

ketheeswaram Temple Camp since April last personally supervising all the work connected with the repairs effected to the temple buildings.

When the temple was thus set ready for the abhishekam and Festival, thousands of devotees thronged the premises, from the distant parts of Ceylon, on the abhishekam day to pray to the presiding deities and invoke their blessings. Sir Kanthia Vaithianathan, President of the Restoration Society, and many other members of the Society were present and took prominent parts in the ceremonies of the day.

The Maddalaphishekam ceremonies were conducted during the following eleven days and concluded on Saturday the 19th inst.

Drink Evil Must Go

Winding up the debate on the 'cut' motion in the Madras Legislative Assembly on the topic of Prohibition, Sri C. Rajagopalachari said that men might fail, but they tried. What did Lenin do the moment the Russian revolution was successful? The Russian people historically had been known to be great drinkers; they were attached to alcohol for ages. In 1917, Lenin prohibited not only vodka but also wine, beer and everything. He said that drink was an 'enemy of wisdom' and the proletariat could not govern with drink. "Here," the Chief Minister said, "power has been transferred to the people; I do not want Prohibition to go."

The motion for a committee, he said, was "dangerous" and would mean the killing of Prohibition. "Here and now," He appealed to members to vote out the cut motion and said that abstention would mean "abstention from duty."

The Leader of the Opposition, Mr. Viswanatham, said that the Chief Minister had not agreed to look at the problem from a "realistic

The Gandhi National Memorial Trust is an organization which helps and promotes numerous activities particularly in social, economic and medical fields in which Mahatma Gandhi was interested. The Trustees include some of the leading men and women of India. One of the objects of the Trust is the preservation of places and articles associated with Mahatma Gandhi and particularly his correspondence. He was exceedingly a good and regular correspondent and throughout his life he wrote and replied to thousands of letters in his own hand. It hardly needs stressing that his great volume of correspondence should be preserved for posterity. The Gandhi National Memorial Trust has arranged for making microfilms and photostats of the letters. A large number of letters and documents available in India have already been microfilmed and photographed. This appeal is addressed to those outside India who may possess letters from Mahatma Gandhi. There is no compulsion.

Those who have letters and are willing to help may kindly send them by Registered Post to the Secretary, Gandhi National Memorial Trust, 5, Mansingh Road, New Delhi (India) with words superscribed on the envelopes as "GANDHI LETTERS". Microfilms and photostats will immediately be taken of the letters and the originals will be carefully returned to their owners. Letters donated to the Gandhi National Memorial Trust will be gratefully accepted and in all such cases the photostat copies of the letters will be sent to the owners at the earliest possible opportunity. But, where the Trust has not been asked specifically to keep the letters, the originals will be returned.

Mahatma Gandhi's letters were always a source of inspiration and comfort to

their recipients. The publication, therefore, in some form or other, would be of great public benefit. The Gandhi National Memorial Trust may, therefore, decide to share them with the world public. But the wish of the owners who may not desire the contents of their letters to be made public will be scrupulously respected.

PROTECTION BY PREVENTION

THE report of the Registrar-General on vital statistics published recently, particularly the table that gives a comparative analysis of the rates of death of the Island and certain other countries, makes us think that sufficient attention has not been paid to the important question of the 'Health' of the nation. There was a time when the blame for high rates of mortality had been traced to the scourge of malaria. But thanks to the persistent efforts of the Government it may be said now that the deadly mosquito has been either exterminated or made innocuous. The causes of death given in the report in accordance with the Nomenclature Regulations of the W. H. O. total one hundred and fifty but only a few of them come within the category of contagious diseases. Prevention of disease having been accepted as the most effective method of preserving the health of a nation, we would remind the Health authorities, Local Government Institutions and Social Service Organisations that regularly observe the

'Health Week' that the people cannot be persuaded to observe the elementary rules of sanitation by merely holding spectacular health shows and propaganda meetings.

The Mayor of Jaffna, in his 'Health Week' appeal has touched on a very important aspect of the cleanliness and has endeavoured to take the numerous food handlers of the Municipal area into his confidence. The various regulations governing the issue of licenses for hotels, tea-kiosks, and eating places do demand scrupulous attention to cleanliness but the proprietors and managers of these establishments take particular care in setting up an outward appearance of deceptive attraction carefully camouflaging the the 'core of rot' within by the fireside. An artistically arranged assortment of bottles of sweets and other tinned articles form a line of deceitful defence behind which the dirt-coated boiler, the unclean tea-pot and other squalid utensils take refuge.

Food handlers will become death-dealers unless they wake up their conscience and satisfy themselves that whatever food articles they handle, are fit for human consumption. This is a moral obligation and as such cannot be expected to be discharged even in a small degree. The Health Department and the Local Government Authorities, therefore, should go to the rescue of the citizens by the strict enforcement of stringent regulations for the maintenance of a high standard of cleanliness in establishments that handle food.

In town areas where the supply of water is not pipe-borne the source is the well, which unlike in rural districts, is not compulsorily cleaned because of the absence of cultivation that requires regular watering. Water in such wells should be baled out at regular intervals. The storing of water is another item that requires strict supervision. Then the question of keeping the utensils clean, and above all the personal cleanliness of food handlers should engage the constant and careful attention of Health Authorities.

Let the Health Week activities take a practical turn. Let the organisers devise ways and means of making the people health-minded. Propaganda has a value only if it is not strained to the point of monotonous repetition.

In Parliament

Budget Battle

Though not in the capacity of the Leader of the Opposition as in previous years, yet the Marxist Doctor started the firing for the Opposition. The attack was as feeble as the budget proposals. In fact the Budget speech of the Finance Minister was a recapitulation of the progress of the 6 year plan and this much-vaunted plan was what Dr. N. M. Perera took for his target. For a while the Leftist Leader dived deep into the intricacies of economics and ridiculed the Budget as good for nothing and the Six Year Plan as one that had no Planner and was without coordination.

For the Government the Acting Minister of Food and Agriculture spoke in defence and referred, by the way, to the Leftist dethronement in the Opposition. Mr. Kumarsamy was full of praise for the six year plan and declared that the Government would not allow a single person to starve.

Language Problem

The member for Kopay as usual harped on his pet topic the Indian question and set a problem in the subject of official languages—the Head of a Department being a Sinhalese, the subject clerk being a Tamil and the official minute being in Sinhalese or vice versa.

Mr. Vanniasingam provoked the Premier to utter a categorical denial when the former drew the attention of the House to an article in an Indian magazine by a Ceylon Government Information Officer which gave the impression that the Government had given instructions to the Gal Oya Development Board to settle Sinhalese persons on the land.

Making his maiden speech in Parliament Mr. S. Natesan the Minister of Posts and Information could not help recalling his association with the activities of the State Council and the captivating influence of the late Mr. D. S. Senanayake.

Mr. Natesan assured the member for Kopay that his fear that the Tamil Language will not have an islandwide status as a State Language was unfounded and expressed that there were bright prospects of the Indian question being settled to the satisfaction of the Indian Government.

Economic Commission

The establishment of permanent economic commissions was suggested by Mr. V. Veerasingham, M. P. for Vaddukoddai and added that the S. E. Asian countries should have an economy of their own.

'Bunkum Budget'

The member for Vavuniya characterised the Budget as a 'Bunkum Budget' and drew the retort 'Bunkum Lingam' from the Premier. Immediately switching on to the Citizenship Rights issue, Mr. Suntharalingam found his form and reminded the Front Benchers of the true meaning of 'Democracy'.

ANNUAL SURVEY OF ACHIEVEMENTS

Jaffna Hindu College Board

(Annual Report submitted by the Committee of Management of the Jaffna Hindu College Board, at the Annual General Meeting held on last Sunday).

In submitting your Committee's report for the year under review the Committee would first give you a rough idea of the improvements, extensions to buildings put up in the various schools under the Board's management.

Taking the Jaffna Hindu College first, a Projector for the Science Laboratory was purchased and installed at a cost of Rs. 3163/-. At the Kokuvil Hindu College much money has been spent and a lot of improvements made to buildings. A Laboratory, a new Staff room, temporary class-rooms, permanent class-rooms, Work-shop, equipment, re-roofing and tiling of the Tamil School which was burnt down and latrines were constructed at a cost of about Rs. 22,000/-. It may be noted in this connection that when the Tamil school was burnt down Mr. A. Mututambay volunteered and collected about Rs. 1600/- from the local public. At the Karainagar Hindu College a Gas Plant costing about Rs. 6000/- was installed and improvements to the library were effected at a cost of Rs. 1500/-. In addition to the above four class-rooms were tiled during the period under review at a cost of Rs. 1500/-.

Chavakachcheri

Many improvements were effected at the Chavakachcheri Hindu College during the year under review and the Committee would mention a few of them. The Science laboratory has been equipped with apparatus costing about Rs. 10674.38. Five class-rooms and a Geography room were put up at a cost of Rs. 8000/- furniture worth about Rs. 2200/- were supplied and improvements were also supplied and improvements were also effected to the library costing Rs. 1850/-. The school buildings are also supplied with electricity, the initial cost of which was about Rs. 1135.80. For the use of the girl-students of the College a Home Science Kitchen has been provided. Thanks of the Board are due to the Parent-Teachers' Association of the Chavakachcheri Hindu College and to the Karainagar Malayan Union who have under certain conditions donated articles and equipment to the Science laboratory at a cost of about Rs. 10,000/- and for having collected and donated a substantial sum towards these expenses.

Urumpirai

At the Urumpirai Hindu College the Science laboratory was equipped with apparatus worth about Rs. 2000/-. The building was improved

and furniture worth about Rs. 2500/- was supplied. The Girl-students were also provided with a Home Science room costing about Rs. 800/- The College will soon be raised to Grade I.

Vaddukoddai

The Vaddukoddai Hindu English School which is a 'C' Grade School is aspiring to come to the 'B' Grade very soon. Mudaliyar Kumaraswamy was kind enough to put up an Upstairs building consisting of class-rooms and a Hall costing about a lakh of rupees. The building is almost complete and awaits formal opening very soon. The thanks of the Board are due to Mudaliyar Kumaraswamy for having contributed liberally and magnanimously towards the building. Minor improvements such as temporary class-rooms, latrines were also effected. The library was strengthened by the addition of books to the value of Rs. 400/-. Furniture were also provided at a cost of about Rs. 2000/-.

Ladies College

At the Jaffna Hindu Ladies' College many improvements were effected to the buildings. The block of building consisting about 8 class-rooms were put up during the period under review at a cost of about Rs. 15,000, and a laboratory for Home Science was also put up. The premises of the Hindu Ladies' College were also fenced with barbed wire costing about Rs. 800/-.

Coming now to the Tamil Schools under the Board's management, the Committee feels glad to announce that the Parent-Teachers' Association of the Jaffna Hindu College Tamil Mixed School has undertaken the construction of a substantial new building for the school within a few yards of the present site. The Association has collected Rs. 9172/- and the masonry work of the building is almost complete. The Association has applied for a loan to the Board for the timber work and tiling etc. The removal of the Tamil school to the new site will be of great relief to the Jaffna Hindu College as it would give increased space for the play-ground.

The Sandrothaya Vidyalalai buildings at Urumpirai were also renovated at a cost of about Rs. 10,000/- of which the Parent-Teachers' Association was responsible for the collection of Rs. 6000. The Kindergarten classes of the Urumpirai Hindu Tamil Mixed School were also provided with equipment worth about Rs. 1000/-.

The main building of the Yaddu East Hindu Tamil Mixed School was also tiled

during this period at a cost of about Rs. 3000/-.

Financial Position

The state of finances of the Board was not so rosy at the conclusion of the previous year and the Board, will be glad to know that the overdraft at the Bank of a lakh of rupees has been substantially reduced during this year. The acquisition by the Crown of the property at Kokuvil namely 'Chekkarkadu' is likely to bring about a lakh-and-a-half rupees to the Board's funds and the Board should judiciously control and spend the amount in effecting urgent improvements at the various schools. This should not make the members to be idle. They should devise ways and means of collecting funds for the various needs of the schools reserving a major portion at least of the proceeds of sale of the above property as a permanent fund.

The Selective Tests for the VIII Standard which will be held in November next will divert a substantial number of students for Vocational training and the Board may have to provide them with Vocational Trained Teachers and work-shops etc. This may require additional funds for Management of the schools.

May Iahwara guide the Board in the proper direction in the management of the big Trust imposed on it and bless all.

Letter to the Editor

Classical Tamil

Sir, — An application has been made to the London University and to the Ceylon University to include Classical Tamil as a subject for their University examinations on par with Latin, Greek, Sanscrit, Pali, Classical Arabic, Classical Persian, Classical Chinese etc. The grouping of subjects in these Universities is different from those of the Indian Universities. Owing to the non-inclusion of Classical Tamil in the grouping of subjects, the Tamil students are forced to go out and choose Latin, Sanscrit etc. Thereby the study of Tamil Classics is not encouraged in our schools and Universities. It must be a subject for study in our schools from the lower forms progressively as in the case of Latin or Sanscrit, also for University and public examinations. The study of the Tamil Classics must be introduced to the English educated students who should make a mark. The study is now confined to Tamil pundits. There must be a graduated system in the teaching of Classical Tamil. Modern Tamil and Classical Tamil, considering the period and the range, shall be separate subjects for study and for examinations. A Tamil should first acquaint himself with his Classical Tamil, and in addition, he can take up the study of Latin or Sanscrit, and such a combination only would be fruitful. To be ignorant of one's own Classics and to prefer any other Classics will not lead to scholarship.

The Ceylon University College Council, at a meeting held on November 11, 1936 recommended to the London University authorities to consider the possibility of admitting Classical Tamil as an alternative to Latin, Greek (Classical Language) for the Intermediate Examination in Arts and to include it in the scheme of subjects on par with Classical Arabic, Classical Chinese Classical Hebrew, Classical Persian, Sanscrit and Pali Languages which a native of Asia is permitted to substitute for Latin or Greek. The London University appointed a Committee to consider the matter, but owing to war the matter was not gone into. It is necessary that the University authorities should be asked to consider and give effect to this decision now. In view of the importance now given to the national languages, it is necessary that this recognition and change must be made.
