Commemorating this, stands the Jothi-Lingam, installed inside the Sanctum Sanc.orum-a peculiar combination of the 3 Thiramoorthies. Symbolic of Tria Juncta in Uno, the Lingam is called and worshipped as Thanu-Mal-Ayan (sa sou wassus). Thanu indicates God Shiva, Mal is Lord Vichou and Ayan stands for Holy Brahma, Thus this temple has not only immortalised the Triumph of Chastity but has also sanctified the rendesvoz of the Trinity and their spouses.

It s said that these Thirumoorthies continue to give their Dharsan in the shape of a live Garuda (tri-coloured eagle) on Aswani-Nakshetra in the month of December and this ceremony of Garndadharsan is observed on the 5th day of Dhanu Festival, be appointed guardian ad litem every year.
