assistance for it should be made in stages. The works so far done comes under Stage I which was estimated in 1948 at Rs 65,000. Stage 11 was expected to cost Rs. 23 000 and Stage 111 Rs. 44,000.

Unfortunately after 1948 all action on this seems to have come gradually to a stand still till again in September 1951 when at a Con-ference in Colombo of V. CC. Chairmen, summoned by the late Prime Minister, the request was renewed on the suggestion of the A. C. L. G. by the Charman, V. C. Tellipallal for R . 70,000. This was supported by the Jaffna District Village Committees Association.
