In the present singe of the public Health Work in this country very little thought is given to Health Education as a specia lity. It is usually a by-product of the services of the Health Department. We are in an age of doing things for and to people rather than instructing them in how to solve their own problems. Doing things for people is often easy but it is often expensive and of temporary benefit. Every Health acti vity should therefore have as its content HEALTH EDUCA-

# THE GENESIS OF THE SIVA GNANA BODHAM

### CRITICISM

In continuation of my article published in the "Hindu Premier Nehru in the Organ" of June 29, 1951 I wish to make the following observations on the statement by the Science Graduate that the Sanscrit Agamas were divinely revealed. My comments on the "Divinely revealed Vedas" will follow:
