Anti-Religious Activities In Russia

Soviet Law guarantees the right to conduct the Anti-Religious propaganda "but the law does not give anyone the right to conduct religious propaganda"

This reminder of basic Soviet law is set forth in a recent issue of Sovietskaya Estoniya in the course of a general article deploring the action of a father who encouraged his daughter a member of the Communist Youth Organisation, to attend religious services.

In the USSR, Anti-Religious propaganda is conducted in the schools and by public media, all government operated.

Among new examples of Anti-Religious activity conducted by state organs is an article published in Pravda Ukrainy written by N. V. Podgorny, first Se-

cretary of the Ukrainian Communist Party Central Committee. The article declares:

"Indoctrination of the workers in the Soviet spirit requires an implacable struggle against the various remnants of capitalism in the minds of the Soviet people. Religious remnants are especially tenacious and much has been done to overcome them.

However, there are still many shortcomings in atheistic work...

"Party organisations, Ministries of Culture, Education and higher and secondary education; the society for the dissemination of political and scientific knowledge, and all ideological institutions must conduct atheistic propaganda on a wide front, using

various forms and methods. These agencies should pay attention to reorganizing individual work with believers."

Similarly the Soviet newspaper Kommunist, published in Yerevan, recently published an article by M. A. Adonts, Secretary of the Soviet Armenia Communist Party Central Committee, declaring that "attention must be given to strengthening Anti-Religious propaganda in every possible way."

The campaign is directed against all religions and is carried out in all areas of the USSR, including central Asian regions once considered solidly Muslim. F. A. Grishayenkov, second Secretary of the Soviet Turkmen Communist Party Central Committee, writing in Ashkhabad's Turkmenkaya Iskra, asserted recently that in Soviet Turkmenistan "the social roots of religion have been suppressed" but "unfortunately, vestiges of the past including religion, still have not been eliminated." He attributed this to neglect of atheistic work."

The Ashkhabad newspaper, in another article, by Tashliyev, another Central Committee Member, called for intensified atheistic propaganda in Turkmenistan. "Recently," Tashliyev reported, Anti-Religious propaganda was revitalized in our republic. Lectures began to be read and conversations and topical evenings were conducted: our newspapers and journals activated their work. However, serious shortcomings continue in the organization of atheistic propaganda. Anti-religious propaganda is often conducted in short-term campaigns and does not include all people.

"Atheistic training of workers must be improved and its effectiveness strengthened: forms of Anti-Religious propaganda should be diverse and its campaign-like and seasonal character should be eliminated. Our atheistic work must reach strata and be conducted in many ways"

Peaceful Co-existence

The Real Significance

The term, "peaceful co-existence", has become increasingly familiar and the Soviet leaders are putting it forward as the ultimate solution to the world's problems. This makes it of primary importance and it is vital that we should all understand exactly what is meant by the expression.

If peaceful co-existence means the relaxation of international tension, the practising by all States of "live and let live" policies, with no further interference in the internal affairs of others and no attempts to spread alien political doctrines abroad, it would imply a goal for which we should all be anxious to strive. It would, in fact, be a means finally to solve the problems of a shrinking world.

Unfortunately, this is not what it means in the Communist view. There has never been anything final or ultimate about the Soviet interpretation of co-existence. This term was first used by Lenin and later by Stalin to describe a sort of interim period preceding the final triumph of Communism throughout the world.

It was viewed as a means of gaining a breathing space for the Soviet Union to bolster up its forces

Lenin himself said that in building Communism much depended on whether it was possible to postpone the inevitable war with the capitalist world until the moment when the proletarian revolution in Europe, of the colonial revolutions, had finally matured.

The inevitability of war against the Western "imperialist" Powers in which Lenin and Stalin implicitly believed, has

been modified by Mr. Khrushchev, who has come to realise that in the mid-20th. century a world nuclear war would be suicidal. The renewed emphasis on peaceful co-existence is a sign of this realisation.

But it means only that open war is to be avoided. There is to be no change in the basic Marxist tenet that the class struggle between capitalists and the working class—both anyway thoroughly out-of-date terms—in each country, and between Communist and capitalist countries, will be continued by every means until world Communist domination is achieved.

Mr. Khrushchev himself has made the real nature of peaceful co-existence clear. Speaking at Novosibirsk in November, 1959, he said:

"Peaceful co-existence must be clearly understood. Co-existence is a continuation of the struggle between two systems but by peaceful means without war. We consider that this struggle should be economic, political and

ETHICS OF ELECTION PACTS

Letter to the Editor

MOORS

Sir,

I thank Mr. M. Burhan for referring me vide his letter published in the Times of Ceylon of 17-3-60 to the meaningless meaning given to Shonagam in the 1-6 years old Rottlers Dictionary. This dictionary is yet to be traced. Even after much effort if it becomes available it is doubted whether the words "and is Arabia" will be found in it. Unlike Winslow, Rottler gives only one meaning to this word Shonagam. Mr. Burhan I presume to be an intelligent person. As such will be oblige your numerous readers by saying that 12th or even 500 years ago, India had in the list of her 56 countries Arabia too included. In that event Russia, Germany, Italy in short all Europe including the whole of China too should have contributed to form India's 56 countries and hence the Prime Minister of India need not worry about Chou-en Lai's claim to annex China with India. Further the writer says that the one meaning given by Rottler's explained in the Hindu Geography, a book unknown to me, is Arabic. The term Hindu has no connection at all with the earth or any part of its country. Had he said Hindu mythology or Hindustani or Indian geography it would have carried some meaning.

Such inaccuracies are often found in some dictionaries and in history books. My humble conviction is that Sattler was not of his own while grappling with the meanings of this vexed term.

There is nothing of educational value in the second letter of Mr. B. dated 17-3-60. I note with satisfaction his making use of some important points that I brought to light and explained from time to time in English and Vernacular papers since the descendants of early South Indian Arab-mixed residents settled in Colombo flouted the report of Akbar Commission. To those points he had added some quotations and references taken from the booklet of Mr. I. L. M. A. Azeez, the champion of Moors, whose work Mr. B. calls monumental in meeting my charge of his striving to help the so called Ceylon Moors to

perpetuate the use of that term to which they had become callous and feelingless may even thick skinned thinking it was a God sent one and not one sent by the Portuguese.

Akbar Commission contained two Malays and two Ceylon Muslims. The late Mr. M. T. Akbar the only brilliant man the Malay community ever produced in Ceylon was the Chairman. The other equally brilliant person was Dr. T. B. Jayah. The Commission was conscious enough to recommend that all the Muslim inhabitants of Ceylon including even the Malays should both in writing and in words be addressed as Ceylon Muslims to form one unit. This was in keeping with world order in that even the Moors of Morocco unlike the Moors of America changed their designation to Moroccan Muslims to distinguish them from Non Muslim Moors. The recommendations are in force now, though the Malays and the Moors revolted against them. I was the only Ceylon Muslim who supported the Malay's claim to identify themselves as a separate unit. What is this if it is not selfstyling and why should Mr. B. try to correct me when I said selfstyling Ceylon Moors. I end further comment on Mr. B's statements asking him whether he knows that the people of Java, Sumatra and Malay etc were converted to Islam by South Indian Muslim converts with the help of Arabs, many of whom, he cannot deny, settled down in those parts and yet we do not hear of Java Sumatra and Malaya Moors etc or as Samankarayas, Marakkala Minusu or coast Moors. I wish Mr. B. to note that the superficial meanings of these words are not those he had been taught to believe.

ideological, but not a military one."

Indeed, the measure of relaxation implicit in the doctrine of peaceful co-existence is strictly limited. It merely proposes that war should be excluded while the right to continue the struggle with all other weapons is maintained.

It should at this point be noted that Mr. Khrushchev, whose condemnation of nuclear war was first heard at the 20th. Congress of the Soviet Communist Party in October, 1956, has consistently referred only to major and nuclear wars. He has never been heard to condemn revolution or civil wars. These are an integral part of what Communists see as the inevitable future pattern of historical development.

The systematic spreading of Communism then, is to continue during the era of peaceful co-existence on all fronts save the military one. Communist parties throughout the world will continue to give their first allegiance to the Soviet Union, to receive their orders from Moscow, and to pursue their disruptive tactics against legally elected governments as they have in the past.

In this it is clear that the well-known Communist tactic, that of the united or anti-imperialist front, by which Communists seek temporary alliance with other parties so as to win power and work to undermine and eventually destroy their non-Communist colleagues, would be increasingly employed in any period of peaceful co-existence.
