#### Conferences

One petent factor for our present ills is the prevalence of communal and sectional differences. Till this is remedied, it would be impessible to have prosperity of any kind in any department of internal activity. Ex-ternally in the international sphere also there is every risk of the country going down the scale, having repercussions in internal affairs.

It is urgently necessary for the vasions sections of the people of Ceylon to meet at conforences and take concerted action to remove or at least ease the present distressing situation in the country and build for the future.

#### Not Patriotic .

There unfortunntely appears at the present critical moment in Ceylon great Inertia. To employ the words used in another context by a great Indian leader (Mr. Jayaprakash Norayan) 'Paralysis of action in a fast developing situation is dangerous?

It is not patriotic to leave the entire burden to Parliamentarians politicians. The time has come for the general public to take more active and detailed interest in the country's affairs and express its views and thoughts. This step would incidentally assist Parlia. mentarians and politicians.
