## CAPITAL PUNISHMENT

## COMMISSION'S CONCLUSIONS

Here are some of the conclusions of the Commission consisting of Professor Norial Morris, Sir Edwin Wijeyaratne and Professor T. Nadarajah that enquired into and reported on the suspension of capital punishment

It is, therefore, our view that the statistics of homicide in Ceylon, when related to the social changes since the suspension of the death penalty in Ceylon and when related to the experience of other countries, tend to disprove the assumption of the uniquely deterrent effect of the death penalty, and that, in deciding on the question of the reintroduction or abolition of capital punishment, reintroduction cannot be justified on the argument that it is a more effective deterrent to potential killers than the alternative of protracted imprisonment.

(a) In deciding on the wisdom of retention or abolition of capital punishment, reliance cannot be placed on there being any greater deterrence to potential murderers by imposing capital punishment on a few than by imprisoning all convicted murderers.

(b) Such increase as occurred in the homicide rate in Ceylon 1957 and 1958 cannot be attributed to the suspension of capital punishment in April, 1950.

All human systems are prone to error. The fewer the checks to error in any system, the higher the likelihood of error in any given case. The risks of executing an innocent man are sufficiently real to lead us to recommend, quite apart from our later recommendations, that no murderer should be executed in Ceylon other than upon conviction by a jury of seven or more jurors unanimously convicted of his guilt.

On the evidence we have received, and from our reading of the literature from other countries dealing with this ques-

tion, we cannot avoid the conclusion that there is a possibility in Ceylon that, if capital punishment be reintroduced, an innocent person may be executed. It cannot be dismissed as a remote possibility, and it is not one that can be ignored. Before such a risk could be accepted for reasons of expediency, there must be clearly demonstrated an advantage to the community in the protection of innocent lives by the execution of convicted murderers even if the latter group should in an ex-

so far in this report, which weigh differently with different members of the Commission, it is our view that capital punishment should not be reintroduced in Ceylon for murder as defined in section 294 of the Penal Code. We are unanimous in this recommendation that there should not be a return to the law as it existed and was applied prior to April, 1956.

There is a divergence of view amongst us, however, as to whether capital punishment should be reintroduced for certain defined categories of murder. We shall consider this compromise position later.

exceptional case include recommend (Sir Edwin Wijeyaratne dissenting) that no amendment should be made to the provisions of the Suspension of Capital Punishment Act, No. 20 of 1958; capital punishment should continue to be suspended under that Act until April, 1961. At that time, the question may merit reconsideration, the period of suspension so far having been too brief to serve as a foundation for final conclusions. In the view of the majority nothing in the experience of the suspension of capital punishment between May, 1956, and the end of 1958 justifies the re-

At this point it is sufficient to state that, if it is not for other reasons thought socially desirable to execute some or all convicted murderers, an appropriate alternative punishment exists, tested and effective, in protracted imprisonment.

It is our view that, just as reliance may not be placed on the assumed greater deterrent effect of capital punishment on potential murderers, so capital punishment cannot be regarded as having any substantial effect on the fundamental economic, social, political, and industrial problems of a society.

## Jaffna's Tribute To Bandaranayake

An unarmed contingent of nearly 2 dozen persons, representing various organisations in Jaffna, headed by the Mayor, Mr. Alfred Durayappa went down to Colombo on 29th September to pay Jaffna's tribute of sincere sorrow and respect to the memory of an illustrious son of Sri Lanka—the late Mr. S. W. R. D. Bandaranayake, the Prime Minister. They were armed with several wreaths, symbolic of their regard and respect to the deceased.

Several miles' long queues of sorrowing humanity, that we noticed on all roads, made us wonder when we could complete our mission; but the veteran Vavuniya M. P. Mr. Santheralingam, who was good enough to meet us at the Fort Station, led us valiantly across Police and Military cordons into the lobby of the House of Parliament. Without any delay we were able to reach the Hall, where lay the remains of Sir Solomon's son, in regal simplicity.

On the four corners of the enclosure four military men stood immobile with heads bent and arms reversed—silent sentinels of the national tragedy. The flames from a big brass lamp flickered fearlessly, while electric lights overhead dispelled the gloom. The bier was in the centre surrounded by hundreds of wreaths, many M. P. P., Ministers and mourners

Our Mayor with his Deputy and a few Members of the Jaffna Municipal Council walked in and placed Jaffna's first wreath in all solemnity. It was a touching scene—they, who were the worst critics of living Bandaranayake were the foremost to pay homage to Bandaranayake dead. Madaliar Attiar Arunachalam dressed in immaculate white coat and tur-

ban walked mournfully and made his namasthe in typical Jaffna style indicating to the on-lookers that Jaffna was playing its proper part. The others then followed—Mr. C. Arulampalam, President of the V. C. Association then placed a wreath, so did Mr. V. K. Chinniah the President of the Malayan Ceylonese Association and Mr. C. S. A. Namasiyayam Chettiar, President of the Jaffna Rotary Club and poor me, who brought up the rear, placed the last wreath on behalf of the 400 Community Centres, whose Godfather was Mr. Bandaranayake when he officiated as Minister of Local Government.

Thus it was, that Jaffna paid its last respects to Lanka's late Leader.

We then stood aside for some time and gazed griet-stricken at the stately figure that lay motionless amidst mountains of wreaths. There lay stilled his silvery tongue, full of dignity and widely mourned, while lakhs and lakhs of men and women filed past his bier. The assassination of Bandaranayake seemed similar to the wanton murder of Gandhi. The Mahatma was shot at while he was going to pray. Bandaranayake was fired at when he was holding his hands in supplication to his religious head. As we mused over the mysterious workings of the law of Karma, we realised the truth of the words in Gray's Elegy:

"The boast of heraldry,  
the pomp of power  
And all that beauty, all  
that wealth e'er gave  
Alike awaits the inevitable hour,  
The paths of glory lead  
but to the grave."

Bandaranayake, the laird of Horagolla a man of means and sound education, instead of leading

### HAND - SPUN HOMAGE!

The observance of Gandhi Jayanti follows a pattern that reflects the realism of the remembrance by Indians of their national hero. The anniversary of the birth or the death of the architect of a nation cannot be merely an annual event in which prominent leaders take part and pay homage in words. It necessarily signifies the expression of the people of their understanding of the high principles that guided the Father of the Nation in building it up. However there is a special significance in the manner in which Mahatma Gandhi is remembered. The occasion acquires a uniqueness. The real spirit of Gandhi an idealism is seen vividly expressed in the observance of the great day. The various aspects of service to the nation are portrayed in the celebrations.

The *Charha* or the Spinning Wheel was the emblem of the non-violent Commander in his Satyagraha Campaign for the liberation of Bharat. This spinning wheel that spun the thread of selfless service for the fabric of freedom to be woven continues to be the symbol of Gandhism and occupies pride of place in the program that is arranged for the observance of Gandhi Jayanti. Several hundreds of spinners including a number of women participate in the spinning ritual. This ideal method of remembering the Father of a nation indicates how deeply the zeal of Mahatma Gandhi to promote the general good of mankind by practical service had impressed the minds of those for whom he lived

and died. The extraordinarily exemplary and fully useful life Gandhiji lived cannot be symbolised better than by the solemn and steady turning of the spinning wheel by the great people of Independent India. Gandhiji was acclaimed the Father of Free India although he never sought the suffrage of any electorate or assumed ministerial power. He was a political Sanyasin who spent his life in patriotic service and taught his countrymen the true method of acquiring capacity for winning freedom. Therefore the people of Free India pay him the humble homage hand-spun.

### Gandhi Jayanti In Washington

Listeners to Washington's WWDC Radio Station on October 2 heard a glowing tribute to the late Mahatma Gandhi given by India's Finance Minister, Morarji Desai.

Desai, who in Washington attended meetings of the world bank and international monetary fund, said "Gandhi raised society to live like human beings and thus contributed to universal happiness."

He also told his American radio audience that Gandhi "Did not work for India alone but for the whole world" and stressed that Gandhi believed that so long as human society is not regenerated there can be no peace in the world."

Desai said that Gandhi's "Greatest accomplishment was his restoring lost self respect back to the Indians" and he described his "most significant teaching to the world" as his strong belief that "Proper means would lead everyone to the same right road."

Prior to his radio tribute, the visiting statesman addressed some 200 Indian nationals gathered at the Embassy to mark the anniversary of Gandhi's birth.

During the early morning commemoration ceremony, the Indians sang one of Gandhi's favorite hymns, "Vaishnavajanaadho."

In addressing the group, Desai stressed Gandhi's role in elevating India's status as never before.

"He made Indians discard their weaknesses and further strengthened them with the technique of satyagraha," Desai said.

The Finance Minister underlined the basic teachings of Gandhi—insistence on truth,

a life of ease and indolence had given half his life to the service of his country, treading the troubled path of politics. While his father had attained the summit of the public service by the back door, Bandaranayake had reached the zenith of power through the front door.

With all his ability, he did not have the gift of fore-seeing things to the end. All he did each day was to solve that day's problem: If the solution created another problem, he thought he could tackle it the next day. He had fought a daily battle between the man and the politician in him. As a man he loved humanity above all, but as a politician he loved power at any cost. When the situation in the country deteriorated and crisis after crisis cropped up, a less courageous man or a lesser optimist would have thrown up the sponge; but he seemed to thrive on such crises by glancing them cleverly to leg, for, he was never clean bowled. True, he did not play brilliant cricket, but he plodded on hoping to augment his achievements one by one.

The reputation Ceylon enjoyed the world over as a paradise for peace, concord and harmony in a troubled Asia, has now been lost.

**Sir. Wijeyaratne's dissenting recommendations**
