Total Collectivization of Agriculture in Hungary by 1965 is called for by the New Party program, which will be discussed at a Party Congress scheduled to begin November 30-the first since the Freedom uprising.

Early this year the Communist regime launched a wide-scale collectivization program, pressured over 350,000 peasants into collective farms, and increased the collecbivized area from 13.5 percent to 37 percent-With the state farms, this makes up more than half of Hungary's arable land.
