In 1409, be and his family and his attendants were taken prisoners by the Chinese and transported to China. Parakrama Bahu VI was selected from among the captives by the Chinese Emperor to take the place of Alagakonara as king. Though Parakrama Bahu VI had strong Hindu leanings', he was a supporter and friend of Buddhism. His wife Sunetra Devi was herself a Tamil.
