## Disarmament and International Relations

(Continued from last issue)

The current conference is mainly of an exploratory nature and is expected to be followed by a summit meeting of Heads of States. The latter will cover not only disarmament but also all problems of concern to the meeting powers. If the present conference succeeds in bringing about some definite agreement on Disarmament and if the International scene is free from any startling developments in the coming weeks, then the middle of this year may witness a Summit Conference. At the time of writing there seems to be a dead-lock over matters connected with the procedure to be adopted in executing a policy of partial Disarmament.

At political conferences it is the statesmen who run the show. If these fail to deliver the goods can other groups like the anti-nuclear demonstrators of Great Britain and the nuclear scientists of the various countries themselves working within the boundaries of their own countries, force the hands of their respective government to renounce nuclear weapons. The nuclear demonstration in spite of big names like Earl Russel and John Osborne, the playwright in their midst, have so far succeeded only in keeping London cops, magistrates and newspaper reporters busy. The scientist of today is as much a career man as anybody else owing loyalty to the organisation which employs him. He can claim to be 'neutral to Ends'. Further it is doubtful that scientists can completely free themselves from national feelings and in some states their services are really commandeered.

How about Religious organisations and movements like moral Rearmament and Gandhism? Now, adays organisations are

hard put to make their existence felt. The Moral Rearmament movement is at the cross roads with the death of its founder Dr. Frank Buchinan and further it is tainted by (alleged) connections with Big America business. As for Gandhism its appeal is a mainly confined to the East and the recent Indian invasion of Goa exposes its limitations. As matters are many Governments are free to pursue foreign policies of their own making without being unduly worried about public opinion. Modifications of these are caused more by external pressures than by popular pressures from within. Thus while many may talk or write about world problems, vital decisions affecting the peace and safety of mankind are really in the hands of a few powerful statesmen.

In conclusion I wish to say a few words about a recent unfortunate trend in world affairs viz. growing hostility on the part of the Western nations especially former colonial powers towards attempts on the part of the newly freed Afro-Asian nations to express their developing personalities in world assemblies and at international conferences. Their change of attitude towards the U. N. O. has been caused chiefly by the alarm felt at the growing influence of Afro-Asian nations in the deliberations of the U. N. O. National psychology in some countries has not yet filled the gap caused by the loss of colonies. As a social phenomenon 'Colour Bar' is nothing new. It would be an international tragedy of the first magnitude, if the differences between Soviet Russia took on a 'Colour' aspect. One cannot help feeling that the world freed from fear of a nuclear war may be characterised by International disharmony at social level on grounds of race and colour.

### NORTH-CEYLON SANSKRIT ACADEMY

The annual celebrations and the prize-giving of the North Ceylon Sanskrit Academy were held on 1-4-62 at the Navalar School Hall, Jaffna with the President Vyakarna Siromani T. K. Sitarama Sastrikal in the chair.

The meeting commenced with a prayer in Sanskrit. In the presidential address, the chairman spoke about the different ways of attaining salvation. He added 'Sanskrit is not the language of one community. It should not be regarded as a language of the temple alone.'

Mr. K. Balasubramaniakurukkal General Secretary and Pandit S. P. Sarma, Exam. Secretary read their reports.

There were two items in Sanskrit by students. Mr. V. Sivasubramaniam B. A., B. Sc, distributed the certificates and the prizes (on the results of the Sanskrit Exam. Vishva Parishad Bombay).

## CHITRA GUPTA - THE DIVINE RECORDER

The Chitra Gupta Vratam that falls on the Chitra day of the Chitra masa when the Sun is in celestial mesha naturally deserves observation. In the Loka paripalana or the governing of the universe Parameshwara has delegated His powers to Yama to deal with all living beings and dispense justice without fear or favour. It is said that Yama employs Chitra Gupta to record faithfully every act of thought word and deed of every individual so that Yama could award His just rewards to every soul according to Papa and Punnya that one has done in this life on earth. Chitra Gupta derives his name from the nakshetra Chitra situated on the boundary line between Kannya (Virgo) and Thula (Libra) and exactly 180° opposite to Chitra is the beginning of Mesha according to the Nirayana system. When the Sun enters this point we have Mesha Sankranti and Hindu New Year. When the Sun is in Thula and the Moon is in Chitra we have Naraka Saturdasi on which day we are expected to expiate for our sins to escape from Naraka the purgatory where we are purified by suffering for our sins. Yama is the devata for Saturn which is in uchestra or zenith in Thula, hence saturn is regarded as a purifier. Yama is helped in his

work by Chitra Gupta, represented by the asterism Chitra at the entrance to Thula. The importance of Chitra is evident from the Vakiam 'Chitra nakshetra Chitram bavathe' pronounced at the end of divine puja and service in our temples. The planet for Chitra is Mars of which Skanda is the Devata. Sankara says of Skanda. Mahadevabalam Loka palam 'the son of Siva is the Governor of the world' more so in this age of Kali. Thus it will be seen that Yama is propitiated on Naraka Saturdasi that precedes Dipavali and His Recorder Chitra Gupta on the day that the moon is in conjunction with Chitra in the month of Chitra. The former takes place when the Sun is in Thula and the latter when the Sun is in Aries i.e. opposite each other but in both Chitra Nakshetra determines the day. Thus sun, moon and the planets have their functions in lives of individuals and Vratams have been prescribed by our sages to propitiate them for the welfare (Loka Somastha) of the world. When ordinary individuals die their anniversaries are observed according to the 'thithi' or phase of the moon but when saints and sages die their anniversaries are observed on the day the moon is in conjunction with a particular Nadshetram. Does this mean that for those that expect rebirth 'thithi' is important and for those who attain moksha that saves one from rebirth the Nadshetra is important. The proximity of the moon to the earth and the far distance of the Nakshetra seem to have been anticipated by our sages long ago when prescribing a way out of this small universe of ours to the distant Nakshetras.

SYLLABUS FOR  
SAIVA STUDENTS

At a time when the study of religion is being made compulsory in schools it is unfortunate that misgivings have been unnecessarily created in the minds of the Saiva students about the text governing the teaching of Saivism. It has been undisputedly acknowledged that the Saiva Siddantha System applies to and obtains in Tamilakam. The Vedanta philosophy and other allied branches may have a following despite contradiction in terms and thoughts and confusion in interpretation and understanding. However, Saiva Siddantha as the special heritage of the Tamils must necessarily be accorded its rightful place in a scheme of the study of Saivism without being assigned an optional status of choice among other 'systems' that are credited with the prestige of belonging to Saiva philosophy.

If by making the study of religion a compulsory requirement for students, it is meant to enable them know the practical and theoretical aspects of their religion and philosophy, then the Syllabus for 'Saivism' should be based on the Saiva Scriptures—the Saiva Siddantha—and should not be made a choice among various syllabuses that provide for the study of systems other than and different from 'Siddantha'. The open

mind of the unsophisticated student should not be allowed to be confounded by the controversial concepts of the diverse schools of thought. All that is required is that the Saiva student must be assisted to learn his religion in the traditional manner as a special and exclusive subject. Hence the resolution of the Saiva Teachers' Conference (recently held in the Jaffna Hindu College Hall) recommending a separate syllabus of Saiva Religion according to the Siddantha System exclusively for Saiva students of that persuasion as endorsed by the Saiva Paripalana Sabha and other representative Saiva organisations and Saiva scholars is most appropriate and opportune and merits acceptance by the Education Authorities. Need we remind the Authorities of the oft-quoted opinion of the renowned Christian Missionary Tamil Scholar Rev. Dr. G. U. Pope?

"The Saiva Siddhanta System is the most elaborate, influential and undoubtedly the most intrinsically valuable of all religions of India. It is peculiarly South Indian and Tamil religion..... Saivism is the old prehistoric religion of South India, essentially existing from Pre-Aryan times and holds sway over the hearts of the Tamil people. Saiva Siddhanta philosophy is the choicest product of the Dravidian intellect."
