IMPORTANT NEW INFORMATION

For Scientific Approach To Lunar Flights

Any appraisal of the first two Americans to orbit the earth will characterize John Glenn as primarily a "Pilot" astronaut and Scot Carpenter a "Scientist" astronaut.

This is way it turned out and the way project mercury officials planned it,

Colonel Glenn, the first to go, was sent up chiefly to test the space worthiness of his mercury capsule and its myriad systems and components. Commander Carpenter went into space to a large extent to get information that would advance America's manned lunar program.

Quite logically the first American astronaut in orbit concentrated on checking the workings of his spacecraft, its life-support apparatus and steering mechanisms. He did much scientific observing but his biggest contribution was in proving that man is more reliable than automatic equipment in controlling and bringing back a spacecraft safely to earth.

Now Commander Carpenter has given not only a superbly literate and articulate account of his flight but has told how scientific experiments he conducted relate to America's moon program.

For the first time, for example, he has given future astronauts the elemental but needed information on what the earth probably looks like from the moon. "The earth would appear to be a bright blue ring in the sky", he said. He deduced this from his view of the earth's horizon from his vantage point in orbit. It appeared a brilliant blue when the sun was just below the horizon,

he said, and was the same on all three orbits.

Popular conceptions have pictured the earth as a glowing green orbit when seen from the moon.

Of more immediate help to scientists planning the U. S. moon program was his conclusion that the colours orange and silver show up best in space.

If this finding is confirmed, orange and silver spacecraft would be used to practice space rendezvous in project Gemini, the space program which will follow the present mercury flights. The coupling of space vehicles in earth orbit is an essential step in getting the three-section apollo moon craft to the lunar surface. The three sections of the craft are to be boosted separately into orbit, joined, and then sent on to the moon from the rendezvous point in space.

Commander Carpenter said the orange and silver sections of the balloon he towed were the most visible.

The so called inconsistent behavior of the balloon, reported by Astronaut Carpenter, gives interesting new data to space physicists who must thoroughly understand how objects behave in the weightlessness of orbit before rendezvous is attempted.

At times, the balloon was taut at the end of its 100-foot (30 meter) line, and at other times the line grew slack and formed loops. The balloon rolled and pitched in a random manner much like a toy balloon held out the window of a moving car.

Astronaut Carpenter confirmed that weightlessness is an ideal state

in which to perform work. "Every function inside the capsule is easier because nothing has weight", he said.

His report on the behavior of water under zero gravity conditions should help in the design of fuel tanks for rockets that must fire spacecraft to the moon from earth orbit.

Water in an experimental vessel aboard his spacecraft rose in a standpipe and that which could not rise tried to, he said. It did not form droplets, as some scientists had speculated it would. This information will be of help in designing the precise thickness required for fuel bulk.

THE POLICE AND THE PUBLIC

The constant criticism of the Police by Parliamentarians and the Judiciary does not seem to have opened the eyes of the Premier. Of late there have been several allegations made against the conduct of the Police. Recently the M.P. for Nallur has brought to the notice of the Prime Minister an incident that happened in the Jaffna Police Station and has alleged that he was assaulted by Police Officers. It is learnt that an immediate investigation into the complaint has been ordered by the Premier. However the general feeling in the country is that there are 'excesses' committed by the Police Officers in the course of their dealings with the public. Here is a situation that is fraught with grave misgivings and has to be dealt with by the Government.

The Police Department is an important part of the administrative machinery and is responsible for maintaining law and order. The purpose of the Police Service is mainly to help the public live in peace free from the fear of lawlessness. Hence the Police Force must be able to create in the public an abiding confidence in them. In fact the Police and the public must be mutually co-operative among themselves. The public must be able to enjoy the satisfaction of feeling that the services of the Police will be available whenever required. Where such co-operation and mutual confidence exist, the detection and investigation of crime and the further step of prevention will be easy. The efficiency of the Police Department, therefore, depends on the protection

being or otherwise. General principles are discussed and not personalities hence the teaching is more impersonal than in the Gita. A careful consideration will show that the author was conversant with the general philosophical and religious teachings of Rudra that were extent after Buddhistic et Jainistic thought had percolated into South India after the 3rd century before Christ. Many teachings in the Kural are found to be echoes of Dhanmapada. Owing to many similarities to Jainistic thought some regard the author to have been a Jain. But the reference to Adi Bagavan in the first verse itself shows that the author was a great 'BagaVata' devotee yet he did not allow sectarian views to mark his universal outlook. His reference to the organisation of the defence of the country, to army shows he was no mere pacifist but believed in using force whenever required for a just cause. The Tamil language is richer and developed by having this great classic and any one can study it with great profit. Each is great in its own way and demands the serious attention of all students with thirst for knowledge.

The Law And Language

Sir,—

When the European conquerors took over the administration of the Island it is known that—

(a) The Tamils of the North and the District of Mannar had their own laws—the Thesawalamai. These laws were recognized, codified and applied.

(b) The Tamil people of Batticaloa and the Vanni had their own customary laws and these laws were not interfered with either by the Dutch or the English.

(c) The people of the Kandyan Provinces came under the Kandyan Law, and this Code did not apply to the Sinhalese (Low Country or Maritime), even when they happened to be domiciled in the Kandyan Districts. The major section of what is known as the Kandyan law itself, it has been pointed out by Derrett, had its origin in the Dravidian country South of the Vindhyas.

(d) The Moors, a Tamil speaking people who came under their religious laws based on the Quran, were allowed to retain their own laws and these were codified by the British.

The Sinhalese of the Low Country and the Maritime Provinces apparently had no well-defined laws of their own to be codified, and were brought under the Portuguese and Dutch legal rules and principles. They

HOW TO COMBAT THE FOLLIDOL MENACE

(By Dr. T. Angulampalam in the People's Health Week Souvenir—Tellippalai.)

Follidol E 605 is a powerful and potent insecticide introduced into Jaffna Peninsula about seven years ago to combat pests affecting the tobacco and vegetable plants. It is an oily substance with a strong pungent smell and is sold over the counter in Chemist's shops in phials varying from ½ oz. to 34 ozs. It is used as a direct spray in dilutions of one in a thousand (i.e.) one ounce in about eight gallons of water and is found to be highly effective in controlling insect pests in the tobacco and vegetable plants. In a week's time the substance completely loses its toxicity and becomes a good manure producing luxuriant growth of the plants sprayed. This dual action has made its use very popular and when properly used is indeed a boon to the farmers and cultivators.

Follidol is a deadly poison and is lethal to man in very small quantities. About one teaspoonful seems sufficient to produce death in an hour or two. Death occurs sooner when bigger doses are taken. The suffering, pain and retching are not so marked as in poisoning by corrosives. In the Kankesanthurai and Chunnakam Police areas not less than 33 deaths have resulted from Follidol poisoning in the last two years as shown in figures below. Most of these deaths were suicides. Instances

are on record where follidol was added to arrack and toddy with fatal results. There was one instance of two children dying suddenly after eating some biscuits and the Govt. Analyst detected traces of follidol in the stomach contents. Follidol with its rapid and sure action and easy availability has become a menace in Jaffna and it is high time something is done to check this toll of human lives. It is not within the purview of this short article to go into the causes and the prevention of suicide and homicides. But it will be correct to say that the easy availability of a deadly poison like Follidol, facilitates the commission of these acts.

The indiscriminate sale of follidol should be restricted. Follidol should be sold only to genuine farmers after ascertaining the purpose for which it is to be used and a register of their names and addresses should be maintained. Follidol could also be sold diluted adequately so that while its insecticidal property remains unchanged, it will lose its advantage as a suicidal or homicidal agent. It is hoped that the People's Health Week Committee will recommend and urge that some steps be taken to combat this Follidol menace. My thanks to the Inspectors i/c of Kankesanthurai and Chunnakam. Police Stations, who readily gave me the statistics.

heads, the size of tanks, and will help in solving the problem of fuel "sloshing." Excessive sloshing could unbalance a rocket at take-off causing a failure.

On the important question of space navigation, he indicated that moon astronauts may need only the stars as reference points. "I had an opportunity to navigate with stars alone and 'we came back with some good information on how to orient in yaw with the stars', he said.

That he spent long periods in "drifting flight", using no fuel whatsoever to control the gentle rolling motion of his spacecraft may prove useful in conserving fuel for the long 230,000-mile (368,000 kilometer) trip to the moon.

His observation that depth perception is good in space could prove helpful to astronauts returning to earth from the moon and preparing for reentry into earth's atmosphere. "There is no change in your ability to perceive depth", he said. "I was able at one time to look straight down and distinguish four separate layers of clouds. This is depth perception at a hundred miles."

Astronaut Carpenter's observations must be checked and rechecked in future flights. Some will likely be revised as new
