If the lustful passion which is the source of enjoyment ceases, then all worldly bondage which has its substratum in the mind, will cease. Even the most virulent of poisons is no poison; but the sensual objects are truly so; the former defiles one body only, whereas the latter adulterates many bodies in successive births. You are a sporting lap-dog of the caprice of your passion. You are a slave of desires, emotions and passions. When are you going to rise up from this miserable state? Those persons who in spite of the knowledge of the non-existence of happiness both in the past and the present baneful objects of the world, do yet entangle themselves in them, with their thoughts clinging to them, deserve the appellation of an ass, if not a worse one. If you do not possess Viveka, if you do not try your best for salvation, if you spend your lifetime in eating, drinking and sleeping, you are certainly an animal. I should say, you are worse than an animal. Because you can learn some lessons from those animals which possess self-restraint.

Desires, anger, jealousy, hatred, worry, anxieties and cares torment you every second. Deaths of persons whom you loved most give you severe shock. Yet, you are so much attached to the ephemeral pleasures of the senses of this unreal, mundane existence. Such is the depth of your ignorance! You may seek through Ahankara or egoism: "Oh, I am a very powerful man. I am very intelligent. I can do anything I want. The worldly pleasures are so real. There is no Ishwara." You may talk very high of your valour; but when a scorpion gives a sharp sting, you will cry bitter-

ly and call out, "Oh God, Oh Ocean of Mercy help me." If the hair becomes grey, you will invent various dyes to blacken it. If the teeth are fallen, you will put on a new false dental set. In old age you will want to have a 'monkey gland grafting' treatment. Though you may be witnessing so often the deaths of many around you due to hunger, disease, poverty and old age, yet you foolishly have the notion and believe that you will live for ever! What a miserable and hopeless state of affairs!

Sun's Effect On Building Materials

The global distribution of the thermal radiation from the sun and its effects on building materials are dealt with in a new publication by the Building Research Station of Britain's Department of Scientific and Industrial Research—"Solar Radiation: Thermal Effects on Building materials; Tropical Building Studies No. 3".

The first part of the publication, which is priced at 4s 6d, contains data on the intensity of solar radiation and temperature levels at the earth's surface. These are summarised in map form covering large areas.

Emphasis is placed on the effects of high temperatures. They cause premature evaporation of solvents from paints and from cement mixes, producing early weakness, poor adhesion, and cracking. Another aspect is the occurrence in materials of surface temperatures greatly in excess of the air temperature.

Important also is the rapidity of daily and short period temperature variations. These give rise to temperature gradients within materials and surface stresses which, if frequently reversed, may produce fatigue failure.

Conditions prevailing in both temperate and tropical climate are compared and appendices provide technical comment on the results of various studies.

NAVALAR-INSPIRED REVIVAL A NATIONAL PURPOSE

Principal on Lofty Ideals of J. H. C.

(Extracts from the Prize-day report of Mr. C. Sabaratnam B. Sc., the Principal of Jaffna Hindu College, are published below).

Jaffna Hindu College became a Director Managed School from 1-12-60 and it has been vested in the Crown since 1-8-62 and has become a full fledged National School of the All-Island Category. It is proper that in this period of fundamental changes in educational administration, we review the ideals that fired that band of Hindu philanthropists who founded this school 72 years ago. It was an era of Hindu-Buddhist revival led by Sri Sri Arumuga Navalar in the North and Anagarika Dharmapala in the South; and both these men were moved by the same national purpose—to found Schools where our people's culture and traditions could come back to life and strength and resist the insidious influences of an alien culture. It was their faith in national revival that inspired the founders of this institution; we are proud that throughout her long history, Jaffna Hindu College has never once swerved from the national ideals of her founders. Whatever changes may occur in the control of our schools, it is our earnest prayer that our college will continue to hold fast to the lofty ideals which had inspired the founders and the long line of devoted and selfless workers.

Our stress on the cultural aspect of education does not mean that we are not aware of the national need for training large numbers of our young men in habits of industry and technical efficiency. We see no other way out of this present economic crisis. The Commissioner of Examinations analysing the results of the latest G. C. E. Examination (O. L.) in his Administration Report of 1960 bewails the colossal wastage of human talent, and concludes that 50% of the pupils presented by schools should not have been entered at all for it. It's time we realised the unwisdom of concentrating on purely academic studies, a course which has led to widespread unemployment and economic imbalance. This is a problem that arose in the United States three or four decades ago and was solved by giving a practical bias to school education. Let our secondary schools introduce optional courses in Agriculture, Commerce and Technology in the upper forms and train the bulk of our students to earn their living by skilled manual labour.

I would like to refer to another matter that hampers national effort; I believe that our national schools can tackle the problem. Nothing is causing greater harm to the well being of our nation than the growing intolerance and racial, linguistic and religious tensions. It is the business of educators to promote national unity and our schools must play a distinctive role in the constructive task of national development. An education that fails to break down the barriers of race, caste and creed, to deepen cultural understanding and sympathy and broaden the intellectual outlook of our students, to instil a love for honest work, and an attachment to national culture is unworthy of its high status and purpose.

STANDARD OF THINKING

In the course of his address on the occasion of the Prize-giving function at his alma mater, the Jaffna Hindu College, Mr. C. Balasingam, Deputy Secretary to the Treasury referred to the several obstacles that had impeded the nation's march to economic independence and appealed to the students to venture out on new lines for producing the required wealth for the country. The distinguished speaker invited the attention of the youth to the needs of the country and called for a factual approach to the many problems that demanded immediate solution, particularly, unemployment and the failure to reach the state of self-sufficiency in several articles of food and other necessities of life. He went further and pointed out that the standard of values and thinking could be said to be responsible for this unfortunate state of affairs.

It is of the utmost importance that the causes that have led to the deterioration in the economy of this country should be analysed for a sure solution of the pressing problem to be arrived at. Parliamentarians who owe a special duty to the nation in this respect have failed to do so and have made use of the opportunities of debating these questions during the consideration of the Annual Appropriation Bill for mere effervescent criticism of one another and that in the furtherance of party-politics. Letters to the Editor

BANDA — BANDARA

Sir,—
It has been customary to refer to the late Premier Bandaranaike affectionately as Banda. There is, however, a difference between Bandara, the first part of the name, and the familiar epithet Banda.

The word *Bandara* is the Pallised form of the word *Pandaram* (T. பண்டாரம்). The meaning of *Pandaram* is given in Tamil dictionaries as 'treasure', 'stores', 'wares'; and *Nayakam* (Naike) as 'a Chettyar', 'the merchant class', 'a ruler', 'a chief'.

But *Banda* is the same as *Vandan* (வண்டன்) in Tamil, and means 'a valiant man'. From the root meaning of both the terms, it would appear that the Premier should be referred to as *Bandara* rather than *Banda*. *Bandara-Naike* would mean 'Lord of the Treasury'. The same word *Vandan* was used in the form of *Bandahara*, 'a wealthy Lord', 'a Treasurer of the State', in Malacca and in Malaya—a relic of early Tamil 'Court influences'; in pre-European times.

Among the Sinhalese, however, it may be observed, the suffix *'naike'* and *'Nayake'* are attached to names not purely Kandyan. It is interesting to recall that in the Tamil inscription left by the Chinese Admiral Cheng-He, in Galle in 1409, the South Indian Tamil merchants who traded in Galle are referred to as *'Nayakar'*.

NATION

Sir,—
A correspondent writing to the 'Hindu Organ' asks for the correct names of *Nation* and *National* in Sinhalese and Tamil

The English word *'Nation'* is derived from the Latin *'Natio'* meaning 'being born', 'birth'. *Natio* was used by Latin authors metonymically to mean 'a people', 'a race of men'. It is in this sense

that both Cicero and Caesar used it.

The idea of a *Nation* is a modern conception associated with the rival organised military states of Europe. The Greeks had no word corresponding to *Nation*, as they were organised into City States.

In medieval times (as in some Scottish Universities even today) the word *'Nation'* meant 'a division of students according to their birth place or district from which they come.' Shakespeare refers to the English merely as 'a happy breed of people', and it is doubtful whether he has used the word *'Nation'* anywhere to convey the modern idea of a Nation State.

Mc Dougall in his *GROUPMIND* (1939), humorously remarks, "historians and political philosophers cannot tell us the meaning of *'Nation'*. Go and fight, and if you survive we shall recognise the *'fact accomplished'* and hail you a nation."

It is not surprising, therefore that there is no word corresponding to the word *Nation* in the older Indian languages such as Sanskrit and Tamil. But there are certainly a large number of words conveying the original meaning of the word *Natio*-viz *Nadu* (of the Latin *Natus*-'born'), *Kulam*, *A rasu* (Tamil), or the Sankrit word *Gotram*. The word *Sathi* or *Jathi*, indicates 'a tribe' or 'a caste'; but by popular use, it has come to mean 'a nation' or 'a people or a community associated together and organised under one Civil Government and ordinarily dwelling together in a district territory of their own, 'a body politic', as well.

Somasegaram is one knowledgeable in matters of education, high in the work in this field, and withal one so devotedly an Old Boy and hails from a family that have served the school and the cause of Hindu Education for several decades.
