## F. I. N. S.

### "A BRIEF STORY OF ITS PAST"

[Extracts from the Brochure issued by the Jaffna F. I. N. S. on the occasion of its 120th Anniversary.]

Here is the story of a great adventure, the adventure of Social Service in attempting to reduce the incidence of destitution in Jaffna. It is a most thrilling story that could ever be narrated. It is the story of how, nearly a century and a quarter ago, officials and unofficials had founded the Friend-in-Need Society, how they had managed to build it up for the good of their fellow-beings and how they had endeavoured to reduce mendicancy.

Across the stage had moved selfless men, social workers, officials and unofficials, who had, each in his own way, played some part in this great drama of Social Service.....

Captain G. Cochrane, who held the rank of Brevet Major and was officiating as Commandant in charge of the Garrison in Jaffna, had the distinction of being elected the first President, while the Rev. Peter Percival, a well-known Wesleyan Missionary was elected the first Hony. Secretary of this Society, on 9-3-1841.

In the very first year, the number of "regular pensioners" totalled 70. The collections amounted to £ 98/- and the payments went up to £ 60/-.....

In 1847, Mr. P. A. Dyke, the then Govt. Agent, succeeded Major Cochrane as President. During his tenure of office, the Society grew in strength and began to extend its sphere of activity. Not satisfied with the mere doling out of monthly allowances, the Society decided to open a Hospital to render Medical aid.....

Thus in 1850, the Society became the proud possessor of (a) A Pauper Hospital, (b) A Hospital for patients who could pay,

(c) Lodging houses in the Hospital premises for patients, who were able to pay, (d) An Out-door Dispensary for paupers, and (e) A Dispensary for the sale of medicines.....

In 1855, when there was no Medical College in Ceylon, Jaffna gave the lead in that direction too, thanks to the enterprise of the F. I. N. S. The Ceylon Medical College was founded in 1870 but the F. I. N. S. was ahead of it in the starting of a Medical College; and one of its first Graduates, Dr. William Paul, had later the distinction of serving as Resident Surgeon of the Society's Hospital from 1878-1900.....

In 1857, His Excellency the Governor, Sir Hercules Robinson, after paying a visit to the Hospital had expressed "His high appreciation of the buildings and arrangements" and pronounced "that this Hospital was one of the best in Ceylon."

In 1890 His Excellency Sir A. E. Havelock after an inspection of the Hospital had stated: "It is an Organisation that is unique of its kind in Ceylon, and it does much in a remarkably suitable manner towards relieving suffering humanity. I would add, that I was greatly struck by the large amount of work done, in proportion to the money expended.....It is the only example in Jaffna of an Organisation that I know of, of co-operative work for the public good."

Even after protracted discussions the terms of the transfer of the Hospital to the Civil Medical Department were found to be unacceptable to the Society. So a deputation had gone to Colombo and

met His Excellency Sir Henry Blake in Queen's House and thereafter arrived at a satisfactory agreement. Consequently, the Hospital and nearly 14 acres of land were handed over to the State. The F. I. N. S. refused to accept an offer of a substantial sum of money from Government, but transferred the Hospital subject to certain conditions.

Thus the nucleus of the present General Hospital that was founded by the people, for the people and run by the people for a period of 57 years was handed over to the Civil Medical Department in 1907, and the curtain fell on one of its unique activities.....

On the suggestion of Mr. M. Sri Khanta, while he was President of this Society, steps were taken to celebrate the 120th Anniversary and to revitalize it by enrolling new members to make it a fully representative Organisation. The 120th year is a vantage point from which one can view the past with satisfaction and look with hope towards the future. Though he left Jaffna suddenly on transfer, his successor Col. A. R. Udugama evinced equal, if not greater enthusiasm, in these celebrations. After Col. Udugama's transfer, it has fallen to the lot of Mr. V. P. Vittachi, his successor, to finalise arrangements and give the crowning touches for this celebration.....

This Society is Jaffna's proudest asset. It has given relief to thousands of persons for the past nearly 1 1/2 century. It has disbursed more than 10 lakhs, as charitable allowances to the poor, without distinction of caste, creed or nationality. The past has to its credit a brilliant

### HISTORIC GUN

Sir,—In the 'Sunday Observer' of 9-9-62, under a large Banner Head-line reference is made to a "Historic Sinhalese Gun". It was used during the time of Sri Wickrema Rajasinghe, King of Kandy.

Sri Wickrema Rajasingham was the last of the Tamil Kings of Kandy. The cannon which is now in the Rijks Museum in Amsterdam is said to have belonged to Leuke Dissave. Dissave, is in fact, an abbreviation of 'Disavani' i.e. *Thisai-Vanni* a Tamil title for a Vanni Chieftain, *Thisai* meaning 'an area' or region'.

Iron from very early times was smelted in South India, and it is known that the Malabar Tamil Kings of Kandy had an iron foundry at Kilivetti, in the Trincomalee district, traces of which are still found in the area.

### THANTHIRA - MALAI

Sir,—In the 'Sunday Times' of 9-9-62, describing the activities of treasure hunters in the Vavuniya District, reference is made to two place names — 'Thantiri Male' and 'Cheddikulama'

It is important that in independent Ceylon, where we have revived our National Languages, places should be given their correct designation, wherever possible, without anglicising their historic names. The name of the hill in this case, when rendered phonetically, is in fact Thanthira Malai. Malai means 'rock', 'hill' or 'mountain', and Thanthira is an adjective from Thanthiram, signifying 'a set of religious works of the Saiva sect (Tantras)' indicating rites and ceremonies, particularly relating to Sakthi, the female energy of Siva. It was apparently a hill on which 'Tantric' rites and ceremonies were performed before it came to be associated with Buddhism.

Cheddikulama is actually *Chettikulam*. 'Kulam' means 'a tank'. It was named Chettikulam, probably because it was constructed by Chetties (merchants) in olden days to serve the needs of the village and a Hindu Temple in it. 'Kulam' is the form in which the Tamil word 'Kulam' is pronounced in Sinhalese.

## AFFLICTION BY 'ACTIVE HUNGER'

With the population of the world fast growing by fifty million every year, the campaign against active hunger and malnutrition seems to be an impossible task. Statistical surveys always serve as grim reminders of the need for study and action. The figures that were quoted by Mr. B. R. Sen, Director - General of the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation, in the course of his inaugural address at the Kuala Lumpur Conference revealed the gravity of the problem of food for the teeming millions.

The crisis in Asia is of particular concern for the F. A. O. as the rapid rate of the growth of population is too much even for the full capacity of the grow - more - food campaign. Almost fifty seven per centum of the world's population live in Asia. Himalayan efforts have to be made to ensure sufficient production of food even to maintain the present level of semi-starvation. The present wants of mankind are adequate food supplies and medical facilities. These needs must be provided before the revolt of the hungry and sick precipitates further crisis. With misery and starvation menacing the whole of mankind, what have the statesmen of the world done all these years for those by whose choice they wield power. They must fulfil their obligation by sincere and efficient efforts to improve the lot of mankind through sound planning of production.

# Loyalty to U. N. Charter

## New President on Common Interest of All Countries

The first day of the 17th session of the United Nations General Assembly in New York was notable for the Commonwealth.

It saw the election of Sir Muhammad Zafrulla Khan of Pakistan as President, acceptance by acclamation of two new Commonwealth nations—Jamaica and Trinidad and Tobago—as members of the Organisation, the forecast of acceptance into membership of Uganda very shortly and a welcoming address by a British Minister, Mr. Joseph Godber.

In the election of the President, Sir Muhammad Khan received 72 votes against the 27 for Dr. G. P. Malalasekera, of Ceylon, the only other candidate.

Expressing himself "deeply moved" at the honour done him and "deeply conscious of the responsibility this mark of your confidence places upon my shoulders", the new President acknowledged this is a tribute to "the country and people whom I have the honour to represent here." Pakistan, he said, "is not a great Power nor a county which, beyond its own security and the well-being of its people, has any ambition or interest other than the common interest of all of us here. Over the years Pakistan has given proof of its loyalty to the Charter of the United Nations and its sincere devotion to the spirit and purposes underlying its provisions."

Sir Zafrulla said that thought would be given during the current Assembly to organising its work so that the large number of items on the agenda could be handled expeditiously and he pleaded for "diligence, restraint and punctuality" on the part of all members.

On August 29 there were some 89 items on the agenda. Since then several more have been submitted, including one sponsored by Britain and most of the Commonwealth, among other members, concerning measures to be adopted in connection with the earthquake in Iran.

Mr. Godber, Britain's Minister of State for Foreign Affairs, spoke for all members of the Commonwealth when he took the podium to welcome the new members. Pointing out that it had been the privi-

lege of the British delegation during recent sessions to speak on the admission of a number of new nations formerly under British administration, Mr. Godber said: "It is a new and happy experience to the Assembly countries from the Caribbean.

'Over the very long period during which these two Caribbean countries have been associated with Great Britain a feeling of kinship has developed between us of a unique and remarkable kind. From the start both my Government and the Governments of these two countries had one clear aim in view—that they should govern themselves and have for this task both the best possible system of administration and the greatest momentum of economic development.

"Because the people of Jamaica and of Trinidad and Tobago themselves realised that this was our common objective; they were prepared, in collaboration with the British Government and other Governments of the British West Indies, to consider in detail the form in which independence could best be achieved. The result is that we welcome nations with proved systems of Government, stable social structures that are not based on race, religion or class and with well-founded economies."

## NEW GERM - KILLERS FROM PENICILLIN WASTE

Three penicillin discoveries have been made by British chemists to help keep doctors ahead in the war against microbes.

The discoveries, made in the research laboratories of Messrs. Beecham Pharmaceutical Ltd. at Betchworth, in southern England, are a by product of basic penicillin—a by-product hitherto regarded as waste by drug manufacturers.

They have been code-named Factors 1, 2 and 3. Factor 1 has proved effective against some germs more effectively than penicillins. Factor 3 has also shown that it is effective against respiratory germs.

The findings of the Beecham team are published in the magazine, "Nature". Scientists are now working to obtain quantities of the three substances on which to carry out full-scale tests.
