MOTHER WORSHIP

"Navarathri" is round the corner. On all the nine nights, the Universal Mother, the all pervading "Sakti" will be the object of veneration. The purpose of this worship is to revitalise ourselves with fresh energy to overcome evil, to enjoy unflinching prosperity and to acquire creative wisdom without which evil cannot be conquered and prosperity cannot be acquired. Is "Sakti" a reality? Yes, it is as real as the pen that writes this. Does worship of "Sakti" confer the above boons? Yes. The boons are a measure of one's faith.

One night, a soldier was on guard duty. Exhausted he fell asleep by the side of a cannon placing his musket underneath. His captain, on horse back came round that way on patrol duty. The sleeping soldier became conscious of the trot of his captain's horse, picked up the cannon in place of his musket and stood at attention. The captain was overawed but went his way. Can one lift a cannon? The soldier did, in a semiwakeful state. Whence this superhuman energy! From within himself. "Sakti" is all pervading. It is in you, in me and in the image you worship. It is more manifest in your mother in her daily endeavours to give you wholesome food, to protect you from all dangers and evils and to educate you to be a worthy son of your worthy father. If one cannot recognise this God-head in his own mother, he cannot develop sufficient faith to tap the divine energy from the image in the temples.

Tamils of old recognised the God-head of mothers and daily worshipped them. A Tamil book on etiquette written in the 2nd century A. D. when no nation thought of a book on etiquette enjoins daily prostration before the father and mother as the first duty of children.

(parents are the first known Gods), we often quote but never worship them. "தாயிற் சிறந்தொரு கோயிலுமில்லை". (mother is the temple "par excellence") is a treasured aphorism of ours, but we have faith neither in temples nor in mothers. Is it any wonder that the fountain head of heroic mothers and sons has become choked!

Many nations have set apart a day in a year to show special veneration to mothers. Mrs. J. Kennedy the wife of the American president, recently remarked how she celebrated the Mother's day. They have also a Father's Day. No doubt we perform our 'Shradha' to our dead parents. This 'Shradha' is the necessary sequence of the Hindu custom of worshipping the parents while alive. Tamils will come into their own if they resuscitate the healthy custom of daily asking for their parents' blessing. A mother always tries to oblige her children. Even a prayer in silence to her is capable of producing astounding results. Great men have borne testimony to their indebtedness to mothers. Great sages have recommended daily obeisance at least to the photos of mothers.

Prostrating before the funeral pyre of the parents is in vogue. Does it not follow that it is a salutary custom to prostrate before them while alive? Children are shy and the parents too. They little realise the ennobling effect of such worship. Indians do it. Sinhalese do it. Tamil culture demands that etiquette. It has the power to cleanse our society of the many vices that undermine the nations. To me, it contains the only remedy to the downward trend of Jaffna Tamils. Why not break the vicious spell during "Navarathri"!

GOOD WORK OF COMMUNITY CENTRES

Speaking from the other consideration, The chair at the Fourteen Annual Celebrations of the Alaveddy North Community Centre, on Saturday Gate Mudlr. C. Thiagarajah, President, Jaffna District Community Centres Union said that Ceylon was in the cross roads today, and added that "unless there is sufficient sobriety and foresightedness among the leaders of this country, he was sure that we are heading for serious trouble. The economic crisis facing this country is primarily due to hasty nationalisation of various concerns, and as a result no tangible improvement has been recorded. Nationalisation in Ceylon is bound to fail, because there is a lack of sufficient social consciousness among those who administer these organisations and from the public. The failure of national projects is due to undue haste and the error of putting the cart before horse. Therefore, the first thing to be done is to create sufficient social consciousness, and I think that the best institutions which can undertake this important work are Community Centres. If every Community Centre in this country can instill sufficient social consciousness, I am sure that before long the progress of Ceylon in various spheres of activity will increase tremendously. The intercommunal problem in this country should be settled first if the undivided energies of the nation are to be concentrated to solve the economic crisis." He appealed to the leaders of this country to take stock of the situation in a realistic manner and to evolve a solution without being too rigid for the sake of pride or for any

language problem he stated should be solved without delay and he thought that all the major parties in the country were in substantial agreement with the solution to the language problem of the late Mr. S. W. R. D. Bandaranaike viz. that Tamil be declared the language of a national minority in the Northern and Eastern Provinces with due regard to Sinhala only as the official language of the country, while Tamils living in any part of Ceylon would be able to transact their business with Government in Tamil and educate their children in Tamil. The S. L. F. P., U. N. P., the F. P. and the Left Parties have not uttered a word against this language formula of the late Prime Minister either in Parliament or in the Press. Therefore, he appealed to the leaders to accept this solution and bring this deadlock to an early end.

Mr. V. K. Sellathurai, President of the Community Centre welcomed Gate Mudlr. Thiagarajah, Mr. S. C. Manickavasagar, A. C. L. G. and others present.

The Secretary of the Centre read out an interesting record of its achievements.

Mr. S. C. Manickavasagar, A. C. L. G. outlined as to what achievements were possible by the efforts of Community Centres to create an enlightened neighbourhood. He said he was prepared to go into any grievances which the Community Centre had the regard to non payment of Government grants etc if submitted in writing or if officials of the centre could see him in his office. Mr. S. J. V. Chelvarayagam M. P., Mr. A. Amir. thalingam M. P., Mr. Puthumailolan, Mr. Parvathinathasivam and others also spoke.

The spread of Communism as a distinctive political ideology has been possible all these years because of the disguise in which this anti-religious propaganda was made. However, there have been revelations of the true nature of Communism in certain statements of the Red leaders. The challenge to religion has been there throughout, but the campaign was not extended beyond certain limits of expediency. Now that the prestige of Communism in the political sphere is in danger of decline and decay as is in evidence in several countries which in the efflux of enthusiasm for novelty embraced Stalinism and Leninism, the Red Leaders are seeking pastures new for their insidious propaganda.
