Importance And Value Of Ayurveda

(In view of the passing of the Ayurveda Act in Lanka and the setting up of a separate Department for Ayurveda, this extract from Swami Sivananda's book on Ayurveda will afford useful reading.)

The ancient intuitive India that brought to being the brightest and the most inspired of eternal spiritual songs on the struggles and problems of active life in this terrestrial world in relation to the highest End of Existence which Self-realization is and embodied them in the four Vedas, could not resist its native many-sided tendency not merely to subject the entire nature of man to a process of dynamic spiritualization, but literally to seek the health, strength, vim, vitality to longevity of the third of the triune aspect of man—the physical body, which is recognised as the indispensable and perfectable vehicle for both the enjoyment of temporal happiness and supreme felicity.

This tendency of an essentially intuitive mind, towards an integral development of life, towards a complete blossoming of the whole man even while living in a physical form in this material world, this impassioned affirmation of positive living, this acceptance of the body as the best instrument for the realization here on earth, of the best blessings of the profound spiritual realms, resulted in the obtainment of the yet unmatched, deepest insights, the subtle determining vital powers and secrets in the human system that govern its radiant health and longevity and in the creation of a yet another Veda, the *Ayurveda*. Ayurveda is a perfect science of life and consists of a body of most remarkable knowledge on the internal mechanism of human health and longevity, on medicinal herbs and therapeutic roots, on the efficacious treatment of human ailments by eradicating from the human system the very sources of their

causation. This great medical science and humanity's most ancient and finest preventive school of practical medicine which has been practised in India, century after century for over four thousand years, by expert Vaidyas well-versed and highly trained in its lore, should now receive, as a matter of immediate practical necessity, the increasing and the best interest of modern free India. To those who claim to have a knowledge of this ancient medicinal science enriched by the happy results of the researches and advancement made by eminent Vaidyas in succeeding ages, its superior merits over the Western systems of medicine, and its immense value, do not need any delencation. Such names of the great pioneers who added to the development of the science of Ayurveda as Vagbhata, Madhava, Jivaka and Bha-va Mishra of Banares are well-known, and the almost miraculous results that the medicinal herbs prescribed by Ayurveda have brought into the systems of those who have used them, are more than sufficient proof of its unique value. The amazingly wide scope and the genuine scientific nature of Ayurveda received much enthusiastic appreciation by such Westerners as Sri William Hunter, too, and the recent researches show that the early Greeks owed much of their knowledge on the Physiology of man and medicine, to Ayurveda. The interest of Government of India, in Ayurveda is indeed most encouraging, but the private bodies and the public too should come to an increasing recognition of its importance and value, and as a first step begin trying its drugs.

National Games for Country's Unity

National Games Competitions if organised on a territorial basis, would in my opinion be one of the best means of bringing amity and goodwill among all races in this country, said Gate Mudaliyar C. Thiagarajah, President, Valikamam West Rural Development Union, at the Final Day Celebrations of the National Games Competitions in Manipay on Wednesday, organised by the Valikamam West Rural Development Union. Continuing he said that the function of Rural Development Societies should not only be to physically transform rural areas for better living, but also to build up a socially cohesive democratic society in the rural areas. The encouragement of national games would greatly help to eradicate caste prejudices, and create unity and greater understanding among the rural communities of Ceylon. The trouble with Ceylonese society today he said was the prevalence of narrow prejudices born out of a wrong sense of values. This could be remedied only by people belonging to various communities participating in even wider spheres of activities. As a preliminary step, if the leaders of the country would only agree on the principle of partnership, the communal problem in this country could be solved without any difficulty. If every true patriot of this country would spread the message that the Sinhalese, Tamils, Muslims and Burghers are equal partners in building up the Ceylonese nation, he was confident that the necessary goodwill, mutual respect, and sincere friendship would increase and help to solve the problems affecting Ceylonese society today. Therefore, he appealed to Rural Development Societies in this country to sponsor National Games Competitions not only among themselves but on a wider scale so that national consciousness would be inculcated among the people. The Art Of Finding Peace

The peace that passeth all understanding has been, since the remotest times, the axis around which Indian culture has revolved in all its aspects. Peace is a state of quiet; it is freedom from disturbance, anxiety, agitation, violence, disharmony, restlessness; it is harmony, silence, calm, repose, rest, tranquility. Peace is the very nature of the inner self in man.

Nothing can bring man peace but himself; nothing can bring him peace but the victory over his own lower self, the triumph over his own senses and mind, desires and cravings. If he has no peace within himself it is vain to seek it in external objects and outward sources. Wealth, women, children, property and palatial buildings cannot give him everlasting peace. Look within the chambers of his own heart, he must, should he desire real peace. When he is established in the highest Self within, he will not be shaken by heavy sorrow, loss or failure and inharmonious or disagreeable vibrations. He will tide over all difficulties and crises in life easily and will come out with triumph in all life's experience.

Peace comes from prayer, Japa, Kirtan, meditation, good and sublime thoughts and understanding. Development of cosmic love, kindness, forgiveness, understanding of the views of others, selflessness, detachment,

heritage and stimulate an interest in culture. There was too much of abstract talk about national culture in Ceylon today, and very little tangible in the way of preservation and dissemination of it in the interest of future generations. He suggested therefore that National Games Festivals should be organised on a district basis every year in the future, and this he felt

freedom from illness and 'mineless' and cravings, devotion to God, self-restraint, control of the mind and the senses, bring happiness and peace of mind.

Good virtues give peace of mind. Perfect peace cannot be had in this world, for the simple reason that this is a relative plan. The mind itself and all objects are conditioned in time, space and causation. But where are we to look for peace? We can find peace in its plenitude in the immortal Self within. The self in us is the embodiment of peace and is beyond time space and causation. Man has forgotten this inner Self, his inherent and essential Nature, on account of Ignorance and so is he tossed about higher and thither in the ocean of this Samsara by the two currents of Raga and Dvesha. Likes and dislikes.

Like the deer which wanders here and there in search of fragrance of the musk without knowing that it is emanating through its nose, in its own body, man vainly searches for his peace and his happiness in perishable objects outside without knowing that the fountain of bliss is within himself in the Immortal Atman or the Soul. He can have real and permanent peace if he would turn his mind from the objective universe and live in the Divine within his own heart. He can be free from cares, worries, anxieties, fear, delusion, etc. only if he leads a Divine life and obtains purity of heart and concentration of mind. Through Sadhana man should attain knowledge of the Self within, and it is then that ignorance, egoism, anger, jealousy, and all those traits that are responsible for the errors and evils and restlessness of life will vanish. With their vanishing, man will enjoy ineffable peace of the Self.

Unruly scenes, uproarious incidents and ugly demonstrations by 'scholars' are undoubtedly signs of a serious deterioration in the quality of educational instruction. Such a state of affairs calls for a probe into the problem of educational institutions.

He was an illustrious example of sincere devotion to duty.
