(1) The refusal to transfer to Malaya of deposits standing in their name in the Post Office Savings Bank, Local Kachcheries and the proceeds of property disposed of by them in Ceylon. The deposits were made prior to World War II when no such restriction was in force.

(2) This concession is also sought to all Ceylonese residing in Malaya and not eligible to become Federal Citizens owing to technical difficulties.
