Arumugam had made a Siddhanta works. He was a master of Grammar and knew all the excellences of Tamil poetry. Whenever he heard any verse, he had the talent of assessing its worth. If there was any limping in the verse, or any fault of form or thought, Arumugam criticised it.

In the early part of the nineteeth century, there were no printed books. Many did not know Sanskris. Students borrowed the literature books found in "das" and after making alterations in the "ola" manuscripts, returned them to the owner. Arumugam's cousin Viswanatha Mudaliyar Mailvaganar being an Advocate and being a man of great influence, took him to various places, where the various Puranams were to audiences on the fundamental truths of Saiva Siddhantism.

Arumugam saw that the torch of Hindoiam was burning dimly. He mastered the tenets of Saiva Siddhantism, and also studied the Vedas originul Sauscrit. dit S. Ganapathypillai in chala Kavirayar's life of Navalar, gives a list of over eighty books quoted by Aromagam in his WOLKS.

Arumugam (Navalar) was a very sharp thinker, a readly versifier, a most facile writer, eloquent speaker and brilliant con troversialist. He was not issued to her accordingly only a great man, a genius, chief characteristic was a deep love for Shira, and a passionate yearning for the Hodu religion.
