N. O., who have competence, expert knowledge, moral and international authority and experience, among other qualifications requisite for the purpose.

Such reference to the International Court of Justice or the U N O., has not yet been made. It is, however, trusted that this eminently suitable proce dure will be considered without allowing a further deterioration of the situation. It is within the purview of the forthcoming Colombo Conference to include such a course of action among its recommendations.

In the meanwhile, it would definitely be help. ful if we in Ceylon could take into account re. actions caused in other countries and opinions expressed in internation. al circles.

Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, the Head of the British Commonwealth of Nations, of which Ceylon is a member, has in her moving statement expressed the warmest sympathy of the British people and her Government towards India. In the course of her statement, she says:-

"My Government has been shocked by the invasion of Indian territory DV Chinese armies. It fully supports India's decision! to defend its rightful frontiers".

Any amalgamation would not serve any useful purpose, because the proposed Cooperation would not only be too unwieldy besides being too impersonal in pature.

Ceylon needs a streamlined credit and savings structure, and as a first step, he would suggest that a National Co-ordinating Council of credit and savings Institutions of this country be set up with statutory powers, while the institutions which are doing good work should maintain their continuity and identity. He hoped this suggestion would be given consideration before taking any steps to set up a National Credit and Savings Co-operation.
