Verses Nos. 75 and 76 are also sought to be rejected, but the rejection seems to be prompted by certain racial and linguistic prejudices as we explained earlier. Verse 75 reads: When there was neither rain nor drought, neither snow-fall nor floods and everything got withered up (i. e. after total destruction), He blessed the Gracious Lady teaching Her both Sanscrit (which contains the Agamas) and Tamil (in which 1 sing their purport) at the same time (at the beginning of creation).-This is as much as to say that the two languages, Sansorit and Tamil, are as old as creation itself. There are six verses (77-82) in section V entitled குருபாரம் பரியம், succession of teachers and disciples. Eight sages are mentioned as having received instruction at the Feet of Nandi (God). First there are the four Nandies These seem to refer to the four great Rishis frequently referred to in our sacred Literature: Sanakar, Sanandanar, Sanadanar and Sanatkumarar. Then there was Sivayoga Muniver, followed by Patanjali Muniver and Viyagrapada Muniver of Chidambaram, and the last is our Author Tiru Moolar, who took his abode at Tiruvavaduturai for some three-thousand years. There were seven disciples in the line of Tirn Moolar to wit: Malankan, Indian, Soman, Brahman, Rudran, Kalagni and Kancha Malayan. The first two of these were direct disciples of Tiru Moolar, while the remaining five may possibly be disciples of disciples one after another.

If France and Germany the determined rivals of Western Europe for more than a century could get together with a view to collaborating with each other in a spirit of reconciliation then the settlement of the dispute between China and India need not be given up as The significance of the Franco-German reconciliation is the realisation of the Western Powers of the need for closer co operation for the sake of their survival.
