We have taken the word Bodham in these verses (கக்தி பொற் போதம் and போதக் தரும் எங்கள் புண் ணிய மக்கி) as referring to Pati-Gnanam or God's Gnanam (பதிஞானம், கிவஞானம்), Godly knowledge as distinguished from Pasu Gnapam and Pasa-Gnapam (பசுஞானம், பாசஞானம்), egoistic and worldly knowledge. Some scholars however take it as referring to the Siva Gnana Bodham This may possibly be correct, as the Siva Gnana Bodha Sutras were in existence from time immemorial, forming as they do an integral part of the Rourava Agamam, and Tiru Moolar might possibly have had these Sutras in mind when attering these words.
