STEPPING ON TO SEVENTY SIXTH YEAR OF SERVICE

Vannarponnai Vaidheswaran Temple was the holy shrine where the Kuttuvilaku was lit on the auspicious occasion of the starting of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabhai in April 1888. The pious organisers marched in solemn procession from that ancient Temple to the then headquarters of the Sabhai.
