Co-operative Movement And National Integration

In the evolution of nations, language and religion have been powerful integrating factors. Their capacity for unifying is today clearly demonstrated in the rapprochement of nations speaking a common language or professing the same religion. After the world wars, language has contributed to the disintegration of nation states and the rise and consolidation of new nations. In multi-religious States which grant freedom of worship, religions are paradoxically becoming more and more a force contributing to the disintegration of nations. In the regrettable absence of a planned effort for the gradual evolution of either a common language or common religion in a nation of different religions and languages, sentiment of nationalism alone does not appear to be strong enough to resist the disintegrating influence of different languages unless it is fortified by a common ideology. The unifying power of an ideology is seen in the communistic and democratic states of the world. The ideology of communism is mainly economic and that of democracy, political supplemented by ideologies in respect of other factors contributing to the progress of nations. There is already a cleavage in the communistic ideology. The political ideology of democracy has resulted in different patterns in different countries. Democratic States are experiencing a trend for disintegration an account of parties, some of which are opposed to democratic ideals. These two ideologies provide ground for the germ of disintegration to develop and grow. Further while democracy recognises the natural urge in man for equality and liberty and the necessity for the harmonious blend of control with freedom, communism with its de-

nial of the right of private property goes against the instinctive derive in man to claim something as his own and his own and to be proud of it and thereby chokes the very fountain of achievements which have contributed to the development of man and the progress of humanity. The co-operative movement transcending all national and ideological limitations has spread throughout the world because it is an ethico-economic-social movement with an ideology acceptable to all nations and inculcating the spirit and method of co-operation which is the sine qua non for integration.

Co-operative ideology became acceptable to all nations because it is based on some principles which came to maturity with the growth of human civilization—if not with evolution of life itself. They are equality, liberty, unselfishness, honesty, self-help and other principles derived from them and conducive to the harmonious relationship of human beings in their various activities. In the economic sphere, the idea of service dominates over the profit active. In the regulation of human affairs, the democratic ideal prevails.

As the co-op societies were governed by rules based on the above principles, they took root in all the civilised countries. Though the rise of selfish nationalism has changed their attitudes to some extent, the basic principles remain unaffected. Should the Co-operative ideology gain strength through the co-op. societies, it will contribute even to the integration of nations as a world community. In regions ethically sound, their integration as a nation is guaranteed. In the olden days of British rule in Ceylon, a Tamil without any knowledge

of English took service under a missionary who did not know Tamil. He served him honestly and faithfully and both picked up each other's language. Mutual regard and affection grew very strong. The missionary developed a desire to convert him which ended in the following reply and greater mutual regard. "God one! right? Your God, my God, one. Your God, your God! My God, My God! no quarrel, one." This anecdote illustrates how national integration can be strengthened in spite of differences in language and religion if gentlemanly ethical qualities hold sway in each religion. Integration on an ethical basis is the soundest of all and can withstand any other disintegrating factor. Unfortunately for the world, it is loyalty to time honoured ethical principles that has been undermined by mean selfishness. Restoration of co-op. ideology to its rightful place will pave the way for national integration in any part of the world.

Co-op. movement rose to fight the immoral ways of capitalists who exploited the poor people. It is an economic movement on a moral basis. Economic factors can initiate disintegration as well as strengthen integration. The disintegration that started under the cover of language discrimination in Ceylon is in reality caused by the economic factor of securing employment under government. Many Tamils in Ceylon who did business in the Sinhalese areas have arisen above linguistic communalism which plays havoc and hastens disintegration and some have even become Sinhalese. Sinhalese who do business in the North do likewise. Under the sway of Nationalism self-sufficiency has become the goal of every nation, but in nations composed of multi-lingual groups national integration will

Here the inhaled and exhaled breath is pictured and likened to two ladies that run in and out of the body. A part of the breath is generally allowed to run to waste. If this is stopped and utilized by proper practice under the guidance of a competent Guru, marvellous indeed will be the resulting fruit.

In the next sub-section regarding Pratyakaram பிரத்தியாகாரம் or control of the senses without letting them to run riot, we are told that the Yogi should concentrate his mind and turn his attention to the heart. He will then be able to discover many excellent qualities there and rest contented realizing therein the Lord earnestly searched for everywhere by the Vedas of old.

583 Sit steadfast pressing firmly and closing the aperture at the bottom of the fundament, turn your attention to the upper aperture at the end of the central nerve and your sharp-looking eyes inwards towards the space (of wisdom in the head). You can thus conquer and transcend the bounds of time.

585 Concentrating the powers of the mind on bondage, on God the comely Light and on the discriminating soul, contemplating union and uniting (with God) and getting immersed (in such thought to the exclusion of all other thoughts),—such is Pratyakaram, highly praised.

References to the importance of controlling the senses and the mind (Pratyakaram and Dharana) are frequently met with in the Upanishads. In Katha Valli for instance we read: "Know the soul as the rider, the body as the car, know Buddhi as the driver and mind verily as the reins. They say the senses are the horses and their objects the roads. The enjoyer (soul) is endowed with body, senses and mind. Thus say the wise. Whoever is unwise with the reins never applied, has the senses unbridled, like restive horses of the driver, whoever is unwise with mind always impure,—he does not attain the goal and descends to the round of births. But whoever is with wide mind always pure gains the goal, from whence he is not born again. Verily the man whose driver is wise, the reins of whose mind is firmly held, obtains the goal which lies beyond the Adhwas (அத்துவாக்கள், ways or paths by which the goal is reached), the highest place of the all-pervading God (Katha Up. III, 3-9).

The next subsection dealing with the sixth of the eight steps of Yoga practice re-emphasises the importance of mental concentration, keeping the mind one-pointed, without pursuing crooked paths, closing the nether passage, and directing it into the spinal nerve சுழுமுனை,

PIER FACILITIES FOR PILGRIMS

While being grateful to the Government for the provision of the Pannai and Pungudutivu Causeways, the inhabitants of the several islands that form the suburbs of the Jaffna Peninsula and the travellers to these places have to remind the authorities of the need for completing these facilities by constructing landing jetties for Pungudutivu and Nainativu. The ancient shrine at Nainativu attracts several thousands of pilgrims during the High Festival season. Though the linking up of Pungudutivu and Velanai with Pannai has facilitated transport yet the narrow strip of sea that separates Pungudutivu from Nainativu still remains a problem particularly because the sea transport is inadequately furnished. The vagaries of the weather in the month of June with the South West monsoon winds waging occasional bouts must be reckoned with. The volunteer service that was arranged by the Religious Associations of the Islands worked day and night under experienced leadership most enthusiastically and efficiently at both ends of the sea-route and in the precincts of the Temple. Even then the task was stupendous and

the journey by sea must have been thrilling and nerve-racking to most of the pilgrims. The boat men were definitely overworked but cheerfully bore the brunt throughout the occasion. The sea-transport service requires to be improved in several ways, the provision of adequate landing jetties being an immediate need. The improvised landing jetty at Irupiddy kept on reminding the pilgrims of the precariousness of the arrangements. Only the abiding faith in the Grace of Parameshwara emboldened the countless number of devotees to undertake the risky journey in a spirit of supreme indifference.

There is one other problem that has to be solved for the pilgrims. The scarcity of water in the arid Islands is wellknown. But the availability of water has not been explored as best as it could be. Thousands of devotees who congregate at the holy temple in Nainativu keenly feel the lack of water supply. Even the wells that are owned by the people of the area are sometimes not thrown open to the pilgrims for their use.

This is a matter purely for the inhabitants of the locality. The religious bodies that participated in the organisational affairs of the festivals and the provision of facilities for the vast concourse of pilgrims spared no pains to meet the situation. But the problem of water is beyond their control. It must be solved by the people of the area themselves.

Founder's Day at Manipay Hindu College

Mrs. Rajalakshmi Ramanathan distributed the prizes.
