CO-OPERATIVE MOVEMENT AND NATIONAL INTEGRATION

In the 1950 Ceylon, Co-op. Congress, a Sinhalese gentleman addressed the gathering in Tamil and a Tamil addressed in Sinhalese. At a Co-op. dinner, in the time of the late Mr. Gunasena de Soysa the spirit of Co-operation was such that the proposal that Sinhalese should toast in Tamil and vice-versa was accepted with great glee. With plenty of howlers and mischievous promptings, it proved the most enjoyable dinner. Successful attempts were made in writing and speech to show that words common to Sinhalese and Tamil are sufficient to solve the language difficulty and to evolve a national language. Co-operative movement has great (revivifying) potentialities as a unifying and revivifying agent.

Co-operative movement stands four square for democracy. Africa, U. S. A. and Russia claim to be democracies but all citizens don't enjoy full democratic privileges. It is a Co-op. creed that no discrimination whatever be shown on account of one's race or religion. In Ceylon Co-op. societies led the way in giving equal seating to low-caste men in their meetings, and in the days when Co-op. sub-Inspectors were appointed by the Federation, a low caste man was given equal chances to complete for selection. Appointed as Inspector, his colleagues were good enough to treat him equally and he dined at the same table with high caste inspectors, a thing unheard of in those days. This illustrates how Co-op. movement, true to its democratic ideal, accelerated abolition of caste system and helped the process of national integration.

With the increasing saturation of the venom of corruption, primarily due to the laxity of morals, condemned by the

ascendency of self love and self interest as the paying factors in life, Co-operative Societies also have to fall victims to corruption in spite of the co-operative ideology which they profess but fail to practise. Corruption is the most dreadful enemy of national integration. The remedy lies in making education creative; creative of a new moral atmosphere based on the co-operative ideology. Education for co-operation is an aim unheard of by the present generation of teachers. Education through co-operation will be dismissed by them as the invention of a crazy brain. Self-help is a prime concept of co-operative ideology. How far do our schools attempt to make the students depend on themselves for their learning process? The Dalton plan which failed to capture the imagination of educationists attempted to promote the self-help aim. What amount of wastage of finance and energy could be avoided if self-help alone, of co-op ideals, is kept in view.

Switzerland alone is a shining example of a nation of four linguistic groups, but well-knit through co-op ideology. Co-operation is there a definite aim of education, always kept in view by educators. It is said that a co-operator finds a call to Co-operation in reading the history of Swiss education. The relationship between education and Co-operation is so intimate in Switzerland that a Swiss co-operator has written a book, the Educational Teaching of Pestalozzi in relation to the Co-operative Movement, in which the principles of Co-operation are related to those of education. It is a pity that the advantages offered by the co-op movement are not availed of for integration of nations and national integration.

Jagad Guru, Sri Sanakaracharya, who was an Avatara of Lord Siva, delved into the precious wisdom of the Upanishads and brought out the most rare gem in the form of the unparalleled Advaita philosophy or the Monistic idealism which gives you, in a nutshell, the glorious truth that you are in essence Divine beings, ever perfect, free, full and blissful. This idea is contained in his famous memorable Sloka: 'Stokardhena Pravakshyami Yadvaktam Grantahakotibhit, Brahma Satyam Jagannmithya, Jivo Brahmaiva Naparah'. This gives the very essence of all spiritual wisdom, and it is the last word in the transcendental realization expressed in the form of this famous Sloka. Bliss is to be found in the spiritual Reality which is within you. Realise this and be free.

Now this ultimate declaration has been given well and good. But how to attain it? Because you know that in your actual experience of worldly pleasures, your mental impressions are, unfortunately, gathered through the instruments of the mind and the senses. So, when your entire experience of pleasure gives you a perception of Asat, Achit and Dukha, how can you find the Satchidananda Atman? Everything in this world is fleeting in character. You do not find Chit

An Analysis of the TIRUMANTIRAM

(By A Science Graduate)

(Continued from last issue)

In this last verse we have taken the words சித்தாதி and மனோதிசத்தாதி as referring to the evolutes of Aviyaktam and to the subtle body, respectively. That this is the correct interpretation will be apparent to any careful student of Siddhiyar where, in describing Maya and its evolutes, Arulnandi Devar says that Chittam is Aviyaktam, the parent of Buddhi and the lower tatwas ending with earth, and that Manas, &c, and Tanmatras form the subtle body. The words used there are சித்தமாம் அவ்வியத்தம் சிந்தனை யதவும் செய்யுப், புத்தி அவ்வயத்தில் தோன்றி ..., and ... மனோதி தன்மத்திரை புரியட்டகம்தான். It will be remembered that the புரியட்டக உடம்பு (literally, eight-braided body) or subtle body accompanies the soul in all its perigrinations, from birth to death and death to birth, and does not leave it till it attains beatitude. As regards the affirmation தரித்தது தம்பரத்தோடே, the whole abiding in (the Feet of) the Lord, the reader's attention is invited to the words of our Lord Meykandan in his Tamil redaction of the Siva Gnana Bodham தாரகமாம் அத்தன் தான் கிற்றல் that (to wit: Maya) which clings to the Feet of our Father as its support!

Sub-section 7 speaks of Dhiyanam தியானம் or meditation on the Lord. The reader will note how these steps are graded. After eschewing all vices and practising virtues, the disciple has to sit in a suitable posture and control his breath. Then follows control of the mind restraining it from running amok with the senses. As a prelude to meditation on the Lord, it has to be disciplined and trained to concentrate on some fixed focus in the body. Now follows actual meditation on the Deity. We read;

599 Inside the senses there is a hoary Being (Divine Grace). Oh! How it generates harmonious music, displays the boundless Light above the root of the tongue (Uvula) and liberates us from afflicting (bondage)!

602 Kindle bright the light in the heart, put out the fire of anger (and other passions), cultivate all forces of righteousness simultaneously, the Light in the heart will then shine without interruption.

604 If one fixes his eyes on the tip of the nose (and practises Yogam with heartfelt love), he will indeed become (like) God Himself. He will not experience any fatigue, his body will not perish, breathing will cease, the ewill be no (worldly) thoughts and no need to indulge in researches (and discussions), and egotism will disappear.

The Sruti proceeds to speak of Nitham, the Divine Music heard by the true Yogi, what we call திருச்சிவம்போசனம் (literally, music of the holy ankle rings), said to be a happy blend of various forms of music. Ten kinds of musical instruments are mentioned. The sub section concludes:

IN THE SAME STRAIN

The only notable feature in the otherwise stereotyped indication of the Government's legislative plans for the ensuing period as revealed in the Speech from the Throne is the vagueness of the promised measures. The almost full attendance, with only the ever-ebullient J. V. P. Leader non-co-operating, of the M. P.s and Senators also confirms the general opinion that the occasion was plainly normal and could not excite the feelings of the critics in the Opposition.

The reference to the establishment of District Councils is presumably intended to inspire hope in the Tamil-speaking people as an indication of goodwill and readiness for the problem of the status of the Tamil language to be finally determined. The absence of the re-iteration of the full implementation of the Sinhala Only Act cannot mean that the switch over to Sinhala in 1964 has been postponed or modified. The situation remains unchanged and the grievances of the people are all there. The promise of the consideration of a scheme to introduce District Councils, not the Regional Council of the Bandaranaike conception, replacing Kachcheries also does not have in it anything to suggest that it is a step forward. Affairs continue to remain as they are. Even the all-important Speech is in the same old strain!

Those who repose calmly like a (waveless) sea and meditate on the Lord seated four inches above the navel and two inches below the heart where sound originates, they indeed know (both the soul) the lord of the body (and God).

Pious men that practise Yogam as prescribed, they become enlightened, they transcend the 36 tatwas, they destroy the adhering bondage, they become one with the never-deserting Divine Grace.

The student of Peria Puranam will note that many of the saints, whose life-stories are vividly set forth in that master-piece of Saiva literature by St. Seklar, attained beatitude by having recourse to Yogic exercises. St. Sundarar, for instance, was a great Yogi, and he is generally looked up to as a typical example for followers of the Yoga path to emulate, the chief protagonists of the other three paths of Sanyasi, Kriyayi and Gnanam being generally regarded as the three other great saints, Appar, Sampandar and Manikavachagar. We are here reminded of such Devara lines as நாவின் நாடுவன் நாடுக்கு மேலே ஓர் நாவிரல்..., I shall seek. I shall seek, four inches above the navel..., which look like a re-echoing of the words of verse 616 quoted above.

The concluding sub-section of section I particularly refers to Samadhi or complete rest, the last and highest of the eight steps of Yoga practice. This goal of Samadhi has already been referred to when speaking of the earlier steps. The reader's attention is here drawn to our remarks under the head of A Retrospect in our 'Elements of Saiva Siddhantam' Chapter XIV, where we explained how the different subjects taught in the different Sutrams and propositions in Siddhiyar are intertwined and interdependent, so much so that the exposition of one theme necessarily involves reference to one or more of the other themes as well. Similarly the eight steps of Yoga practice adumbrated here are so interlocked that it is impossible to explain them without reference to other steps. Where, for instance, we say that the senses or the mind should be controlled, it should not be a sort of an ipse dixit instruction. The reason for saying so should at the same time be clearly stated if we are to carry conviction to the mind of the reader. Speaking of Samadhi, we read:
