PRACTISE THE CREED OF CO-OPERATION

[Address by Mr. V. Veerasingham, B. A. at the Co-operative Rally]

We Co-operators in Jaffna have a habit of praying or wishing in silence at the beginnings of our meetings for a minute for the healthy growth of Co-operation. Will you all kindly join us today? Thank you! Having thanked God, I thank, on behalf of Co-operation and particularly of the Northern Division Co-operative Federation all Co-operators and other well wishers for the invaluable help they rendered to make this rally a success.

We thought of this rally in order to remind us and the public of the potentialities of the Co-operative Movement. The movement is to all appearance economic but its success and growth depend on the manifestation in action of the eternal moral principles by the members of the Co-operative Societies. It is on account of the deterioration of morals that our land and our societies have come to grief.

Unlike others who talk of introducing Socialism, the co-operative movement has practised socialism in Ceylon for the past 80 years. Many a poor man has been saved from abject poverty and the thralldom of usurious money lenders some landless and houseless poor got their lands and houses and may have been helped to secure profitable employment in agriculture, trade and small industries. There is much more to do. We have to fight corruption. We want more educated men to join us and help the movement and we want to create new leaders of the Co-operative Movement from the unsophisticated but thoroughly cultured and gentlemanly peasants of our land.

Out of a population of about 10 millions in Ceylon, we have 1500000 members of Co-operative Societies. We have 15000 societies doing banking, production, agricultural and industrial, marketing, labour and

health services which can boast of a business turnover of Rs 178 millions for a year. Co-operation can give a man whatever good things he wants, it is a veritable 'Kamadenu' but there is also the black Co-operation in our midst. It is therefore that we are trying to have leaders' classes to spread the ideology of co-operation. We are prepared to form education societies in any part in Jaffna provided there are at least 12 earnest seekers to know more of this 'Kamadenu' and the Gospel of co-operation.

Our creed is co-operation. We co-operate with the Government and private traders. What we

desire is that they also follow the co-operative ideology and work for the genuine interest of the people, the consumers, and not exploit them. Government is in a hurry to make Ceylon a socialistic State. They realise the value of the Co-operative Societies in their socialistic venture. Any socialistic scheme which does not prepare the people to work socialism is in peril of succumbing to the tyranny of Fascism or dictatorship. What we beg of the government is to give a trial to Co-operative Socialism, and make the co-operative sector a regulator of the excesses of private capitalism and State

High Honours For Ceylon Judge
In Great Britain

The Honourable Mr. Justice P. Sri Skanda Rajah, Puisne Justice of the Supreme Court of Ceylon who at present is holidaying in Britain with his wife, has been highly honoured there.

He was invited and sat in the House of Lords (Judicial) presided over by Lord Reid. He has also had the honour of sitting in the Privy Council, the Court of Criminal Appeal, presided over by the Lord Chief Justice Parker, the Court of Appeal (Civil) with Lord Evershed who visited Ceylon last year, the Queen's Bench (Original-Civil), the Central Criminal Court (Old Bailey) and the Court of Sessions (that is the High Court of Scotland in Edinburgh).

On the 12th of July Hon'ble and Mrs. P. Sri Skanka Rajah were presented to Her Majesty the Queen at Buckingham Palace and later this month they were the guests of the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress of London at the Annual Banquet given by them to Her Majesty's Judges. Both of them have

also been entertained to lunch by the Judges of the Old Bailey. Last month Lord Evershed, Master of the Rolls, threw a party in their honour and Mr. E. F. N. Grtisen, former Attorney-General of Ceylon, also gave a cocktail party in honour of the Ceylon Judge.

Recently they were present by invitation at the presentation of Colours by Her Majesty the Queen to the Household Horse Guards.

Hon'ble and Mrs. P. Sri Skanda Rajah have also visited many places of educational and historical interest in Britain, like Hampton Court (Palace built by Cardinal Wolsey) Windsor Castle, Cambridge University (where their elder son is doing research work after graduating in Engineering at London University). Chelsea Flower Show, Gray's Inn and Lincoln's Inn and Westminster Abbey.

They have been visiting Wales and Scotland and before their return to Ceylon they will be touring the Continent.

TIRUMANTIRAM

The pervading soul acquires eightfold (powers by Yoga practice). It can become (small as) an atom, (bulky like the expansive) world, lean (and light like cotton fibre), (pervading yet) unpolluted like Akas, it can assume the form of a foreign body. It can make (things) its own. It can enter a foreign body at will. It can become of the nature of the never-deserting Truth (or Godlike).

We have here taken the word வியாப்பியம் as referring to the soul which is of a pervasive nature, and நோன்மை as leanness wrought by the practice of penances and severe austerities and the lightness resulting thereby. Some editions have the alternative reading நோய்மை meaning softness. This evidently refers to the Siddhi known as இலகிமா or infinite lightness. A superficial reader may possibly take the words பரகாயத்தேகம் and பரகாயஞ்சேர் தன்மை as a repetition referring to one and the same idea. But it is not really so. They refer to the two cognate powers of பிராத்தி and பிராகாயம். The one is a complete transformation of one body into another body, while the other is the process of getting out of one's own body and entering the dead body of another person and enlivening it. The word தானுவது has to be taken as a modification of சனதாக்குவது the captivating power known as வசித்துவம். The words used to indicate the other four Siddhies of அணிமா, மகிமா, கரிமா and ஈசத்துவம் are self-explanatory and require no further elucidation.

670. Not the eight kinds of miraculous powers only but all forms of knowledge (Buddhi or Gnanam) also become manifest as a result of the practice of Ashtanga Yogam. The (eight) Siddhies increase eight-fold (in other words, there are sixty-four forms of Siddhies) which come into being, graciously granted by the self-existent Divine Mother (the destroyer of) the three kinds of blemishes (Anavam, Kanmam and Maya).

671. Those who attain Para Gnanam or Supreme Knowledge by the practice of the eight-stepped Yogam are called Siddhas. They attain God's world and realize whatever they wish for. (This is) Siva Dharsanam. The eight Siddhies come their way spontaneously wherever they happen to be.

Here follow a number of verses which mention among much else the periods of time taken for the acquisition of the different forms of miraculous powers. And these are followed by others which speak of different numbers of arteries pervaded by the life breath. Of the 72,000 arteries, reference is made to smaller numbers such as 513, 1305, thousands of them, 1051, 233, 729, &c. Durations of time are also prescribed for the functioning of the life-breath, such as five (units of) time, 5000, thousands and thousands, 56, &c. What these arteries, units of time, &c are, is not clear. These are all matters

MERCY MEASURES!

Consciousness of the fact that the end of the normal period of the present Parliament is not far away must have induced the Minister of Finance to lay the emphasis on concessions in his Budget Proposals. The U N. P. reduced the price of rice to the irreducible minimum just as the General Election had become due. And the S. L. F. P. cannot but act on similar lines. Circumstances cannot be ignored indefinitely as they are bound to exert compulsion on those who had created them. And Minister Mangarathne has attempted to picture himself as the merciful Budget-maker who has been actuated by boundless concern for the common man and the gripping cost of living.

As for the people of this country, the rock bottom in economic misfortune has been reached. Cost of living is in reality a punishment for having to live in this country. Income Tax is not so simple as it appears to be. It is confusing in its very conception, the fact that income and earnings are two different things having been ignored. The entire system of taxation requires to be recast and reformed. It is to be hoped that the concessions that have been compelled by circumstances will be able to ease the burden on the common man.

The Minister of Finance has reiterated his oft-repeated warning to hoarders and black-market men. But warnings alone cannot afford relief to the ordinary man. The proposed punitive measures certainly give the people hopes of relief but the success of this step entirely

ly depends on how effectively the punishment is meted out.

The term 'luxury' has acquired a new meaning with the way of living taking a different turn: What was considered to be an item of enjoyment has now become in the common routine of life indispensable. The necessities of life are no longer articles of food and clothing alone. Fountain-pens, safety razor blades, tooth-brushes to mention a few, are in daily demand. The house-holder has been compelled to pay for these urgent requirements hundred per centum increase in prices. Is he getting any relief in this direction!

It is idle to talk of ideological urges when budgets are framed. Socialism and democracy form the back ground of every political party. And so the Budget, whatever the party that frames it may be, must be based on real principles of socialism and democracy.

Capitalism which masquerades as socialism.

Co-operative Movement in Ceylon is in for trying times. It can be bled to slow death by means of fiscal and trade policies.

Our readiness to cooperate can be exploited to hasten our end. Co-operative movement is out for selfless service. Even if it dies, let us die ensuring the prosperity of the consumers. Let it not be said that it died through the corrupt practices of the co-operators.

You will all agree that what is lacking in Ceylon and throughout the whole world is co-operation. which should be learnt in the prescribed manner following the instructions of a competent Guru and by actual practice under the guidance of such Guru. And the less we say on the subject the better. Proceeding further we read:

704. The breath of the left and right nostrils, the self-existent Lord, the nectar generated at the top of the spinal column,—he who contacts and witnesses all these at the junction (of the auditory, optic, nasal and gattural nerves) and, transcending worldly attachments, becomes tranquil-minded and possessed of Divine light—he indeed is a Yogi.

711. Those who succeed in controlling (the breath and practising Yogam), they become omnipresent. They enshrine (the Lord and His Grace) in the fragrant lotus (of their hearts). They pierce (and open the suture of the head and discover the Truth Divine). They restrain the senses debarring them (from roaming about). To those verily who thus befriend and love (the Lord), there is no death.

Section IV is entitled ஸ்வாமிநிலை, literally the neuterian state. This state has already been referred to and explained in several places in previous sections. But being a subject of considerable importance, it is given special treatment here in a separate section. We read:

712. If with heart-felt love we contemplate steadfastly on the frontal-eyed Lord who paved for us the way of love, the stream of nectar will flow through such love. Salvation results through love.
