The Pujas are performed by the Children of the Forest, the Sinhalese Kapuralas. They know not and chant not any mantrams. They bandage their mouths with a piece of saffron-tinted cloth and get in behind the curtains and wave the light and mounam (silence) appears to be the mantra used by them here. "The voice of silence is perhaps more eloquent than the spoken word."
