Navalar's Agitation Against The Administration

XIX

Mr. Twynam, the Government Agent became the target of Navalar's criticism. A Commission at the request of Navalar investigated into the shortcomings of the administration in the North. But Mr. Twynam's sub-ordinates saved him. Consequently the charges of bribery and corruption were not upheld by the Commission. The Examiner, had supported the point of view of the people. Whereas the Morning Star (English edition) attacked Navalar, and supported the Government. Navalar however ventilated the grievances of the people by his articles in the "Ilankai Nesan" and "Uthaya Bhanu", and pamphlets.

Mr. P. Comaraswamy, Member of the Legislative Council, being dissatisfied with the Commissioner's findings raised a question in the Legislative Council.

But Navalar continued his agitation. He got a band of eminent leaders, the Chief Justice of Thiruvananthapuram Mr. Chellappapillai, Advocate Nagalingampillai, Mr. Ponnambalam Ramanathan and Comaraswamy Mudaliyar to send a petition to the Secretary of State for Colonies in London calling for a probe.

Mr. Twynam tried every means to break the spirit of Navalar. In that he failed miserably and found that there was truth in Navalar's protest. He realised that Navalar was a Hampden fighting for rights of the common man. **Navalar — the Politician**

Navalar was a keen politician too. If he had chosen politics as his vocation, he would have become a great political leader such as Tilak or Chidambarampillai. He conducted a paper "The Udaya Bhanu" to redress grievances of the people,

to reform the social evils that were prevalent at that time and to safeguard the Tamil language, the Hindu religion, and the common weal. Will not somebody start a paper with the name "Udaya Bhanu?"—which name inspired Navalar.

Navalar advocated simple frugal living. He sought to organise Saving Funds. As a result of his efforts people benefited later. His ideas crystallised and yielded harvest a hundred fold.

Sir Muttucumaraswamy that eminent Tamil representative of the Legislative Council (1862—1879) had died, two candidates vied with each other for his place. One was Sir Muttucumaraswamy's nephew Mr. Ponnambalam Ramanathan. He was an advocate of the Supreme Court. The other was Mr. Britto, a Christian. Navalar presented a memorandum to the Governor Mr. James Longden stating that Ramanathan was a man of illumination, a versatile scholar, a popular philanthropist who knew the needs of the people and who had sympathy, virtue, honesty and love for the common weal. His family was well-known and he came from a very good stock. His grand-father Mr. A. Comaraswamy pillai had rendered yeoman service to the Tamils, until his death in 1836.

Navalar went from village to village, speaking in support of Ramanathan. His enemies all supported Britto. Here is an extract from a report of Navalar's speeches.

A public meeting was got up by Navalar, in support of Ramanathan at the Saivaprakasa Vidyalaya, Vandyapponnai on 22-5-1872. Pundit Carol

DOCTOR P. S. SUBRAMANIAM — AN APPRECIATION

Doctor S. Subramaniam passed away on 12-1-64 at the ripe age of ninety one. He was practising as a Doctor for sixty years; of which thirty years he was in Government service and for thirty years he was a private practitioner.

(P. S.) as he was popularly known was a great philanthropist. He was a scion of a great family noted for learning—namely Senathiraya Mudaliyar of Nallur who was the teacher of Arumuga Navalar. As a Doctor he was highly successful. Patients were looked after by him with care and affection.

A story is related of him, that on an occasion when the Governor had come on circuit, Dr. Subramaniam was called upon to give medical advice. The Governor was not impressed by his appearance. But when he found that his advice was sound, he praised the Doctor as a "black angel".

Dr. Subramaniam was always no-nonsense in his ways. Half a century ago, there were few medical aids such as modern medical practitioners enjoy today. Once while he was cycling, he rode on a cobra which pursued him unknown to him. It crawled and followed him to his bungalow and lay under his dining table. He fortunately espied this and chased it away, without killing it.

Doctor Subramaniam was a good Surgeon. He was a specialist for children's diseases. In many families, three generations, grand father, father, and son—all received medical attention from this doctor.

Many Colleges, Temples, Churches, were financially aided by the Doctor. He built a hall for the benefit of the Thirunelvely Saiva Training

An Analysis of the TIRUMANTIRAM

(By A Science Graduate)

As regards the discovery of God within oneself and worshipping Him surrendering one's own self as a flower, the following Tirukalitr Padiyar Venba will be read with interest:

தமிழர் சிவலிங்கம்கண்டு அநனைத்தாம்வணங்கித்,
தம்அன்பால் மஞ்சளநீர் தாம் ஆட்டித்,—தம்மை
பூவாகப் பூகுழியாம்ற் கொடுத்துப் பூசித்தால் ஒரு
ஓவாமை அன்றே உடல்.

Discovering the Deity within himself and worshipping the Same, bathing It with the water of love and offering himself as a flower in worship without losing his existence as a reality,—if the devotee thus worships the Lord, (birth in) the body will not fail to cease (will cease).

Sections IV, V and VI speak of துறவு, தவம் and தவதுஷணம், renunciation or asceticism, practice of austerities and the abuse thereof. We read:

1614 Those who always think of and sing the praises of the lustrous Lord seen by ascetics who have got rid of (the woes of) birth and death,—to them does the God of gods show (grant) the world of righteousness (heaven).

1617 நெறியைப்படைத்தான் நெருஞ்சில்படைத்தான்,
நெறியில் வழுவில் நெருஞ்சில் முன்பாயும்,
நெறியில் வழுவாக இயங்க வல்லார்க்கு
நெறியில் நெருஞ்சில் முன்பாய் சிவாவே.

He who planned and paved the pathways, He also made thorny creepers grow (on either side). If the wayfarer goes astray deviating from the right path, the thorns will hurt him, not otherwise.

Cf. Siddhiyar: மறைகள் ஈசன்சொல், அச் சொல்வழிவாரா உயிரை வைக்கும் சிறைகள் மாரிரயம் ..., the Vedas are the word of God, the horrible hell forms the prison with cells where those that transgress His word are locked up. It is hardly necessary to explain that the scriptural injunctions form the pathways for man to follow. The horrors of hell are likened to the irritating pricks of thorny creepers that torment the wayfarer treading on them by deviating from the pavement.

1619 உழவன் உழைவான் வானம் வழங்க
உழவன் உழவினில் பூத்தது வேளை,
உழவன் உழத்தியர் கண்ணோக்கும் என்றிட்டு
உழவன் அநனை உழவு ஒழிந்தானே.

When the farmer ploughs his fields repeatedly and the rains fall, the plants thrive and flower (and bear crops in abundance) in the ploughed fields. The farmer then ceases from his activities, leaving the crops to the care of the womenfolk.

This is all allegorical language. The farmer is the devotee. The repeated ploughing is the practice of various forms of Sadanas and religious austerities. The pouring rain is the descent of God's Grace. The crops are the fruits of the religious practices, Gnanam or Godly Knowledge. The ladies that guard the crops are the different forms of manifestation of Chit Sakti. The devotee should cease from his egoistic

LOSS OF A LAND MARK

The Grand Old (Gentle) Man of the North is no more with us. However, his revered name will be remembered by the people for generations for the lasting contribution he had made to the progress of the country.

It was not merely as the people's physician that Dr. S. Subramaniam's name became a house-hold word in Jaffna. His practical benevolence towards mankind was of a high order. He exerted himself for the well-being of his fellow men in such a patriotic manner that almost every public institution became benefitted by his benevolence. The Hindu Board of Education of which he was President and the Scanda Varodaya College of which he was Manager, among others, owe their growth and development to his untiring financial assistance.

With Dr. Subramaniam, the feeling for his fellow-beings was a matter of duty and responsibility in the discharge of which he lived throughout his full span of life. He had the strength of many because his heart was full of human kindness. So resolute was his determination to be useful to the people that he resisted all temptations to be drawn into the mire of politics though every political leader and party sought his advice and support.

Above all the philanthropist Doctor was a man of religion. He was a keen student of philosophy and voraciously read good literature. A store-house of sound knowledge, he had definite views on religion and culture in the pursuit of which he modelled his life. And this land mark has gone.

Philanthropist Passes Away



We deeply regret to record the death of Dr. S Subramaniam J. P., retired Provincial Surgeon of Jaffna.

Dr. Subramaniam retired from Government Service about thirty years ago and had established a very large practice serving the people of the Peninsula. Affectionately called the P. S., Dr. Subramaniam's medical advice was sought by almost everyone. In spite of advancing age, he maintained his medical chamber in the best tradition and attended on patients with rare sense of duty.

He was the President of the Hindu Board of Education and the Manager of the Skandavarodaya College besides being associated with

several other institutions and societies in various capacities. He was well-known for his donations to Temples, Madams, Educational Institutions and Welfare Societies. Even more was his unstinting help to the poor who always claimed his benevolence. His earnings as a Medical Practitioner were mainly spent on helping institutions and the people.

Deeply religious, Dr. Subramaniam devoted his leisure hours to the study of philosophy in which he was greatly interested.

The Park in the heart of the city is a monument to his memory.

The funeral which was very largely attended took place on Monday January 13.

activities and dedicate all his actions to God, இறைபணி நிறைவு.

1623 காமபு திறந்தன ஒன்பது வாய்தலும், ஆம்பற் குழலின் கஞ்சளி பட்டது, வேம்பேறி கோக்கின் மீகாமன், கூரையிற் கூம்பேறிக் கோயிலிற் பூக்கின்ற வாரே.

The doors of the nine gates opened. The overcoat of the Lady adorned with lily flowers touched him. The pilot climbed up a margosa post and looked. Oh! How brilliant and panoramic is the view witnessed from the topmast of the helmsman's sail!

Allegorical language again. The nine gates are the nine openings in the human body, two eyes, two ears, two nostrils, the mouth and the two nether passages of evacuation. The contact of the Lady's overcoat refers to Divine Grace alighting on the soul. The margosa post is the spinal column by which the Yogi (pilot or helmsman) ascends by virtue of his yogic practice from the abdomen to the top of the head (the topmast of the sail), where the Yogi witnesses the illuminating Presence of the Lord.

1626 Hermits who beg for alms know not (do not experience the woes of) birth (and death). Theirs is all desirable prosperity. They perform austerities of the highest order with Godly Knowledge. They indeed have attained the exalted eminence of overcoming birth (and death).

1631 Cease from exhibiting your cleverness by (simulating) learning of the Shastras and look inwards (at the reality within) for a second (without allowing your mind to wander astray). Such inward look (towards the Lord within) will get rooted in your mind like a nail rivetted inside a living tree and chase away afflicting births (and deaths).

1636 By performing Tapas with single-minded devotion did I see the tinkling Feet (of the Lord). By searching for him and performing Tapas did I realize godliness. Performing Tapas undergoing suffering through penances is true Tapas. Wordly-minded people who act otherwise gain no merit.

The Stuti goes on to speak of the mind as a scabbard from which the sword of knowledge should be unsheathed, all thoughts of duality cut asunder and the senses controlled. Feigned worship of God offering leaves and flowers (external formalities) without heartfelt love and humility brings no tears. Ignorant people searching for food to fatten their bodies and avoid bodily suffering are compared to people who run away fearing a crocodile in the river and falling a prey to a bear in the forest—a case of avoiding Scylla and falling into Charybdis. The goal of Tapas is purification of the mind. Avoidance of sinful deeds and association with Siva Gnani lead to emancipation from bondage.

Section VII speaks of the attainment of Gnanam through Divine Grace. By the Lord's Grace are riches, knowledge, greatness and godliness attained. Siva Gnani possessed of melting hearts and Godly Knowledge go about the five regions of the Tamil country, தமிழ் மண்டலம் ஐந்தும், spreading true knowledge like clouds pouring down rain. [—The five regions referred to here probably refer to the present Tamil, Telugu, Kerala, Telugu (? Maharashtra) and Kannada speaking regions of South India.—]. The country-wide pilgrimages of the great Saints Sampandar, Appar and others may be recalled in this connection. Gnani eschew all action, both good and bad. We read:

1647 புண்ணிய பாவம் இரண்டுள் பூமிமில், நன்னும் பொழுதறி வாய்சிவ ஞானிகள், எண்ணி இரண்டையும் வேரறுத (து) அப்புறத்து அண்ணல் இருப்பிடம் ஆய்க்கு கொள்வீரே.

There are two kinds of action (performed by man) in this world, virtuous and sinful (for good and bad). Siva Gnani know them both when they arise. Root out both after due deliberation and realize the abode of God, transcending both. (To be continued)
