The Sign of the Times

Lecture by Mr. R. Selvadurai

The above was the title of an outspoken and stimulating lecture given in Jaffna by Mr. R. Selvadurai, a retired public officer, to an appreciative audience under the auspices of the S H. S.

Government

The lecturer deplored the present trends which have made the nation equate S. I. F. P. Socialism with mounting communal and religious tensions, the steady diminution of the value of the rupee, rising taxation, soaring prices of essential consumer goods, increasing unemployment, the multiplication of cash shortages, recurring financial losses, mounting cases of immorality, frequent murders and gang robberies which tarnish the Island's good name.

Education

Referring to education, the lecturer said that the tone, content and form of education imparted today lacked quality, vision or any equipment for the future. Each politician tries out his pet schemes at the expense of the future of the children under the guise of a so-called scheme of national education. There seemed to be no intelligent objective in the minds of the people planning education—except to provide more schools indiscriminately and satisfy the voters of particular constituencies. That seemed to be the immediate concern of the politicians in power. Time was when truly cultured and high-souled men like professor Marrs, Rev. Stone, Rev. Noble, Rev. Fraser, Rev. Fathers Le Goc, Matthews, Long, Ekanayake, Edirisinghe, Bicknell, Thompson, Messrs Blaze and Nevins Selvadurai made notable contribution to education and exerted an ennobling influence upon the students when they taught and worked for. It was a rare intellectual treat to hear their public lectures and of brilliant men like like Sir

Thomas de Sampayo, Sir Ponnambalam Ramathan, Sir P. Arunasalam, Sir Baron Jayatilika, Messrs. H.A.P. Sandrasegara, E.W. Perera and E. T de Silva. Their names still shine with incomparable lustre among the galaxy of men who worked with untiring zeal and selfless devotion to the public weal in general and education in particular.

Soft Collar Jobs

Though the high-ups shouted themselves hoarse decrying soft collar jobs and urging young men to take up to agriculture, trade &c. the national craze for high posts yet impels the new elite to continue to send their children to U.K, U. S, etc. to receive higher education to qualify them for the re-baptised Civil Service, Engineering medicine and other lucrative posts in Government and Mercantile services. He knew of a number of senior public servants who sent their sons to U. K. recently to prepare for the Civil Service, in spite of their public professions to the contrary; but their sons did not fare well in their studies: however, when they returned to Ceylon, they were given staff appointments in which they were later found to be misfits. Nevertheless they managed to secure lucrative posts in their spheres.

Continuing, the lecturer said that after 40 years of public service and travel all over the Island, he was more convinced than ever before that, so long as the average adult Ceylonese works only three hours a day, the country must become poorer and poorer and sink lower and lower and from period to period, to be bought over by a foreigner. All restrictions on remittances, grant of T. R. P. etc., to people who go out of Ceylon for higher studies etc., are applied strictly only to those who are not able to

DEMOCRATIC- SOCIALISM

S. Kumarakulasingham

In an article on Sri Kamraj Nadar, former Prime Minister of Madras and now president of All India Congress, published in the February issue of the popular South Indian monthly 'Kalaimagal', may be found the following comments of his on 'Democratic Socialism'—

"All are agreed that everyman is entitled to a life free from want and endowed with happiness. Some advocate reaching this goal through dictatorship while certain others favour military regimes. Both methods are wrong and not suited to our country's needs.

Can Socialism and Democracy combine? They will combine well. Democracy will safeguard people's rights. For Democracy to be complete economic equality is a must.

There are other socialist parties besides the Congress. These have no longer any justification for independent existence. If they join hands with the Congress a mighty socialist force can be created."

The above comments describe the Nehru brand of socialism. Democratic Socialism is on trial in India. The Indian Constitution has a Bill of Rights incorporated into it and for some time a Communist government which was brought into existence by the 'Ballot', was allowed to function in the state of Kerala. The five-year plans aimed at modernisation of agriculture and industrial self sufficiency have attracted world wide attention. However progress is painfully slow and the Chinese attack has made Indians feel that the avowed foreign policy of neutrality needs revision.

How about Ceylon? The country has witnessed some socialist

An Analysis of the TIRUMANTIRAM

(By A Science Graduate)

1728 கோயில்கொண்டன்றே குடிக்கொண்ட ஐவரும்

When I entered a body the five (Deities) entered it at the same time and taking their stand therein, they perform their functions. The Lord came to rule over me entering it through the gateway (of love), like the mother (loving cow) hastening homewards (from the grazing grounds, to feed the calf).

The five refer to the five Deities Brahma, Vishnu, Rudran, Maheswaran and Sadasivan who perform their functions of creation, &c, taking their stand within the body itself. The words...புகுனிப் புகு பெயர்த்துளிப் பெயர்த்து ... எண்ப் பிரியாதே எனவழி நின்றனன் என்கை...of Irupah Irupahtu may be recalled in this connection. My Father entered with me wherever I entered, departed from whence-soever I departed and served me, never deserting me.

Section IV which speaks of Sada Siva Lingam in some detail commences as follows:

1730 Seek (meditate on) Sadasivam of pearl-like lustre as possessed of five faces spreading round and upwards, handsome eyes three times five, ten hands highly praised and two feet touching the earth.

What the five faces are is indicated below. The eyes are said to be fifteen as the Lord is generally represented as possessed of a third eye on the forehead, (the Triambagan of the Rig Vedam). The Sruti proceeds to say in the subsequent verses that Brahma, Vishnu, Rudran, Maheswaran, Sadasivan, Bindu, Natham, Sakti and Sivam are generally spoken of as Sadasivam. The sun, the moon, the ten directions, they are all creations pervaded by Sakti. Comprised within them are the four Vedas, the six Vedangas, Sariyai and other forms of religious practices, the ten states of consciousness (Jakiram சாகிரம் &c, both upward and downward), the stars of the twelve clusters (Aries, &c), the six and eight forms of the Deity (Brahma, &c, and the Ashta Moorthies),—all these are manifestations of Sadasivam. His five faces are: Isanam of crystalline nature in the centre, Tatpuruham of yellowish colour facing east, Ahoram of dark-blue hue in the south, Vamadevam red of the north, and milk-white Sadiojatham in the west. The earth and the heavens, everything possessed of form and the formless, the static and the moving, the 36 tatwas, all this is Sadasivam. Pronounce His name a hundred times (repeatedly). He our Lord has entered my heart, blue-throated, with curling yellow twisted hair, moon decked and handling a battle-axe (to destroy evil). Him my Gracious ancient Lord do I realize and rest serene.

Reference is then made to the Pancha Brahma Mantiras indicative of the above named five faces and the six Anga Mantiras (indicative of different limbs of the body) with which various parts of the body are touched in the course of our daily religious exercises known as Anushtanam அநுட்டானம். And the section concludes with references to the Pranavam or

**IRRESPONSIBILITY
IN EXCESS**

As if to fan the flames of public indignation against the Specialist Doctors' strike, the Engineers of the Electrical Department have called a surprise stoppage of work. The people will now know how persons who are placed in positions of responsibility forget themselves and venture to disregard the fact that they are primarily and essentially responsible to the people. Here is a curious situation. The Leftist Parties who have been in the 'strike' drama all these years now are openly condemning the present strike and offering all assistance to the authorities to break it. The simple inference is that the terms 'non-co-operation, strike, direct action, fast' and other similar slogans smacking of the revolutionary spirit have been misunderstood by every one. Mahatma Gandhi who courageously defied the might of Imperialism used the weapons of non-violent non-co-operation and fast after much deliberation and self-searching taking the utmost precaution to prevent mischief-mongers and selfish minded politicians from using the situation for their own ends. **MAHA
SIVARATHRI**

There is no doubt that Mahasivarathri is the most sacred fast for the worshippers of Siva. It is said that it was on this night that Parwati by unparalleled fast and penance was blessed by the darsana of Parameswara and the boon of the Holy Sacrament of marriage that raised Her to the position of 'Queen of Heaven'. There is also another version by which that Siva appeared as limitless column of light between Brahma and Vishnu when they were contending for supremacy. Maha Sivarathri is usually observed on the 14th night of the waning moon in the solar month of aquarius the starting point of which is 120° from the Chitra nakshetra to the East. The Lunar month that falls in this period is called Maka Masa as the Purnima or Full Moon falls in the Nakshetra of Maka. This year too the full moon in the solar month of Kumba Rasi is falling in Maka. When Sivaratri is coming to a close one can see the last streak of the crescent moon in early dawn before the sun comes up. It is an awe-inspiring sight when in the northern skies one can see the great Plough (Sapta Rishis) and in the southern skies one can make out the southern cross (Tri-Sanku). The Great Seer of Colombuturai used to observe Maha Sivarathri with great devotion and the Sivathondan Nilayam is observing it on 13-3-64 with its usual program, Sivoham.

Schools Take Over

The lecturer said that he was greatly impressed by the righteous opposition of the Catholic population to the Government's attempt to take over denominational schools in 1961. It bespoke eloquently of the Catholic citizens' devotion and loyalty to their Faith and to their patriotism.

Federalism

Though he is not in favour of the Federal Party's agitation to secure Federalism in the Tamil Provinces, he would not hesitate to give them their due credit for their bold stand against the implementation of the short-sighted Sinhala Act. Education, broad-mindedness, vision and statemanship alone can solve the problem. These qualities have been lacking in every man and woman who dabbled in public affairs for the last 30 years. There are a few who have the requisite qualities, but they are kept back while Rome burns. The lecturer added that he was convinced that there was a practical, intelligent, patriotic and far-sighted solution available, but neither of the protagonists had the common sense to consider it frankly and openly in the best interests of the country at large.

At the end of the lecture, a discussion ensued and the lecturer answered questions put to him. A vote of thanks proposed to the lecturer by Mr. A Lazarus was seconded and supported by Messrs. T J Savundranayagam and D. James.

Omkaaram and its constituents A, U, M, Bindu (shape or light) and Natham (the sound principle):

1752 The pedestal where the Lingam rests represents Omkaaram, the neck thereof (where it touches the pedestal) is Maharam (M), the round cylindrical body is Ukaram (U), and the top Akaram (A). The whole is emblematic of Bindu (Sakti) and Natham (Sivam).

The theme of the Lingam is continued in the next three sections, reference is made to the Atharam ஆதாரம் or support and the Atheyam ஆதேயம் or the supported, the Thapara Lingam தாபரலிங்கம் consecrated in temples and the Sangama Lingam சங்கமலிங்கம் or moving emblems found in the persons of living devotees who walk about. We read:

1762 The Devas all praise and I praise our Lord as ever present everywhere. He dwells in my heart inseparably united with me.

1763 The Supreme Lord possessed of form and formlessness and both at the sometime, He appears as Guru also to the various souls. Such is the inherent characteristic of Sadasivam of bountiful nature.

1773 The world surrounded by roaring seas, water, the expanding air, the flaming fire (and Akas), —the Lord ordains all these and transcends them. I know not how to encompass His nature and worship Him.

How the Gnana Guru blesses and enlightens the disciple is described in section VIII entitled Sampradayam சம்பிரதாயம், the traditional method (of instruction).

1778 உடல் பொருள் ஆவி உலகத்தார் கொண்டு, படர்வினை பற்று அறப்பார்த்துக், கைவைத்து நொடியின், அடிவைத்து, நுண் உணர்வாக்கிக், கடிய பிறப்பு அறக்காட்டினன் நந்தியே.

Nandi the Blessed Lord accepts the offerings of body, soul and possessions made by devotees, bestows His Gracious Look on them, thus destroying the sins that beset them, gently places His Hand (on their heads), snaps His Thumb and Finger and crowns them with His Foot,

progress in recent years but unless the ruling party sheds its communal garb, it cannot be compared to the Indian Congress. Race and creed have no place in Democratic Socialism and if these are the basis for national policies, sooner or later an intolerant form of 'national Socialism' is bound to develop. Some may say that this has already happened.

The formation of the United Left Front doesn't augur well for the country. This is a group of parties which are not wanted in the country individually. The late Mr. S. W. R. D. Bandaranaike held views similar to those of Sri Kamraj. He often used to hint that in the face of the S. L. F. P. programme, Communism was superfluous. If his party (now under the leadership of his wife) gives true practical expression to a policy of 'Fair Treatment for Minorities' the success of Democratic Socialism in Ceylon will be assured.
