Section IV which speaks of Sada Siva Lingam in some detail commences as follows:

1730 Seek (meditate on) Sadasivam of pearl-like lustre as possessed of five faces spreading round and upwards, handsome eyes three times five, ten hands highly praised and two feet touching the earth.

What the five faces are is indicated below. The eyes are said to be fifteen as the Lord is generally represented as possessed of a third eye on the forehead, (the Triambagan of the Rig Vedam).
