WHITE PAPER ON CEYLON EDUCATION

(By V. VEERASINGHAM)

The labour of the mountain of a National Education Commission has brought forth the proverbial mouse of a proposal for a National System of Education. There is nothing national in it except the emphasis on national heritage and culture. The word national is used in it as antithetical to regional and smacks of communalism which has unfortunately become the passport to power in Ceylon. From a purely educational point of view one finds only the old wise that stimulated and inspired the progressive schools of Ceylon to produce gentlemen who led the country in its march for freedom, but under a new label which clearly indicates the influence of American Education. The extra-curricular activities and a part of its has become a common core subject, the new label for compulsory subjects, under the new name of "Work Experience", the evaluation of which is likely to prove a headache to conscientious teachers. There is however an indication of the newly developing traits of the rising nation.

Basic School

The Basic School is characteristically the new name for Elementary School and should not be confused with the basic Schools of India of Gandhian inspiration where the common core of all subjects is suitable handicrafts. It is elementary wisdom that no mention is made here of the "Common Core Subjects" prominently figuring in the new G. C. E. Classes, though they don't seem to have a common core. Introduction of General Science instead of special science is a progressive feature. The advantages of teaching General Science depend on the syllabus and scheme of work, the creative teaching and the methods

adopted. It is here that the "National" system with its mania for uniformity runs the risk of jeopardising the free initiative of the teacher to adapt the content and method for each grade to the student. In democracies there is room for pioneer methods to develop in schools and act as a haven for the progressive teaching of various subjects. It is necessary to copy the syllabus and methods of teaching of general science in advanced countries.

Secondary Education

Calling Elementary Education basic is in keeping with the general tendency to make the G. C. E. the objective of Secondary Education. In Britain G. C. E. has become the basic education necessary for admission to higher courses in trades and professions. G. C. E. stands for a general education.

It is a continuation of basic education on a more extensive as well as intensive scale. G. C. E. syllabus has virtually become the standard for basic education in advanced countries. Progressive schools and teachers of Secondary Education in other countries do not confine themselves only to the prescribed syllabus, but they take the students much beyond that level. Progress in technology and scientific achievements demand it. If Ceylon is not to lag behind other nations for ever, the syllabus of secondary schools should aim at as intensive and extensive courses as in the most advanced countries. As the White Paper visualises the establishment of adequate number of Agricultural, Engineering and Commercial Colleges admission to which can be gained by those who graduate from the basic schools and

Additional General Hospital for Jaffna

Mudlr. C. Muthuthamby moved the following motion:-

"This Committee earnestly requests the Director of Health Services to take early steps to establish an additional General Hospital of at least 500 beds in the Jaffna District."

Mudlr. Muthuthamby said that this Institution was originally started by the Friend in Need Society and was later handed over to the Govt. From two wards it has now grown into the present size. The development has been haphazard. Notwithstanding this, the service provided at this Institution was second to none in the Island. He wished to pay a compliment to the high standards of service rendered by the Specialist Staff, the other personnel and the Medical Supdt. This position could not be maintained unless more staff is appointed to keep pace with the expansion of the Hospital.

He said that the institutional facilities were not keeping pace with the phenomenal increase in population of the Peninsula. The Jaffna Hospital has almost reached saturation point in building space. Even horizontal development is not favoured as the Jaffna Hospital had reached the optimum manageable point. And added that he favoured the establishment of a Hospital about 10 miles further away from the Jaffna Hospital, in conjunction of Kankasantburai-Palaly and Pt Pedro Roads. The site selected should have sufficient room for expansion, wholesome and plentiful supply of water and communicable. The Hospital on that site should be well planned and must accommodate the major specialities

Mr. S. Kanagasundaram seconded the motion. He said that he was the Secretary of a Committee which had as its purpose the establishment of a Hospi-

2048 The blind leading the blind, they encounter and fall into ruinous pits, helter-skelter, one over the other.

The contents of this verse are similar to those of an earlier verse which we have already studied. Vide verse No. 1680 in the sixth chapter and our notes there.

He is the Gracious Guru who is able to (teach and vividly) demonstrate (the characteristics of) God, soul and bondage, and the dependence of both the intelligent soul and the inert bonds on the Supreme Sivam. He is the Elder who imparts the bliss-giving Mantiram (that enables the disciple) to transcend both purity (localized knowledge) and impurity (ignorance).

2066 As He mellows the soul's unceasing bonds, burns up its sins as they arise and frees it of its darkness by imparting the endless (incomparable) Mantiram, the Supreme Lord that teaches the way to emancipation is indeed the Guru.

The next two sections are headed XXVIII Kooda Olukkam கூடா ஒழுக்கம், bad or undesirable conduct, and XXIX. Kedu Kandu Irankal கேடுகண்டிரங்கல் bemoaning the fate (of vicious people). We read:

2067 People steal and commit other sins thinking that there is no Kangany (Overseer, Supervisor, or Inspector to witness their deeds). There is no place from which the Kangany (God) is absent. Seers who see with the eye (of wisdom) the Omnipresent Lord that pervades everything as the proprietor thereof, they refrain from committing theft (and other sins).

Here occurs verse no: 2070 வடக்கு வடக்கு என்பர் ... quoted and commented on in our prefatory remarks, to which the reader's attention is invited. Heartfelt internal worship is preferable to external formalities like pilgrimages if these are not accompanied by sincere devotion to the Lord coupled with faith and reverence.

2084 They accumulate seed (Karmam), they sow the seed and rear plants (and reap the crop, undergo birth and death). Ignorant sinners, they know not that their days of prosperity (in this world) are numbered, they think not of the Karmic woes that await them. Alas! they resemble flies fluttering round and round and) getting scorched in flaming fire.

PLAYFUL POLITICIANS

The Parliament is not in session; Parliamentarians, according to party groupings, are playing hide and seek. Peregrinations to health resorts in the hill country are believed to be creating a conducive atmosphere for coalescing of parties in self-defence. This is the picture of the present political situation.

The bug-bear of budget preparing no longer torments the Minister of Finance. Nor is any other Minister feeling uncomfortable about the affairs of his administration. What is really taxing the politicians is whether the May Day Rally should be unified or united. It is also puzzling the political pundits how the mixing up of marxism with mild socialism can be effected so as to help the components survive the event. The lurking fear is that coalition seldom fails to tend towards merger of parties. The Leftists who have been tire-lessly telling the people for twenty-five long years how they would govern if the people returned them to power have not been able to show their strength or scope of work. And now the misfortunes of the ruling party have provided the Marxists with a situation

that can be exploited with advantage to themselves. Aspirations of the Leftist leaders to become Ministers are therefore based on their ambition to show the masses what capacity of work the Marxists have to run the Government of the country.

The pity of the situation is understood when the idea of the offer of the Leftist Parties to jump over to the Front Benches is scanned in the light of statistics. The Communist Party with a number of three, the M. E. P. with equal strength and the L. S. S. P. with a slightly better following, will be ruling the country against the wishes of the people.

The S.L.F.P. was chosen by the people to lead the country. If it has failed to fulfil the aspirations of the people, the next step must be with the people and not the S.L.F.P. and certainly not with parties having two per centum representation. The oppressiveness of the heat wave is not so damaging as the benumbing cold currents of political chicanery of parties that do not represent even a tenth of the people.

The talk of the town (Nuwara Eliya) is that the tub-thumpers of the opposition, the fire-eaters of pre-prorogation period have now become play mates of their mercilessly criticized Ministers. These champion critics are played out and are now playing fast and loose. Politics is no doubt a doubtful game but surely it can be made a paying one.

(Continued from Page 1) tal at Urumpirai. This Committee had 22 Lachams of land and Rs. 10,000/- available for contribution if and when a Medical Institution was to be constructed at Urumpirai. Members expressed doubts about the desirability of putting up a Hospital at Urumpirai which was only 6 miles away from Jaffna and had an area as limited as 22 Lachams.

Mr. S. Muthucumarasamy said that at Sangilitthoppu about 10 acres of land were available for the purpose. It was observed that as this was in close proximity to the General Hospital, Jaffna the situation was most suitable for establishing specialised institution such as an Eye Hospital or Dental Institute. The motion was unanimously adopted by the House.

garb, they lose their rare (opportunity of) benefiting themselves (attaining salvation).

Is it not to worship God, (who appreciates) bathing with the five fold products of the cow, by meditating on Him mentally, singing His praises with words and prostrating before Him (bodily worship), that the soul is provided with human birth? Even Devas come down to the earth to worship Him. Dumb creatures (resembling beasts) who roam about in distress, Alas! they think not of all this.

Section XXX with which the Seventh Tantarim concludes is entitled Ithopadesam இதோபதேசம், literally good or beneficial instruction. Particular emphasis is placed in this section or the need to think of and worship the Lord in every possible way.

2102 Ponder over (and conform to) the excellent Saiva path. Forget and put an end to birth in this world which is impermanent. Think of (and meditate on) the Lord always, even at the time of death. He will relieve you of the intense sufferings that afflict and perplex you.

2104 ஒன்றே குலமும் ஒருவனே தேவனும்,

(God and you are) verily of one family (clan or genus, both being Chit or sentient entities, as distinguished from matter which is insentient. But) God is one only. Concentrate your thoughts on Him without blushing. There is no good to be gained by going astray (unabashedly thinking of other so called gods). Save yourself by meditating on Him enshrining Him firmly in your heart. The (agonies of) Death will not afflict you.

The first line of this verse is interpreted variously by various scholars. The word குலம் has several meanings. On reference to the classical Tamil-English dictionary of Sri Viswanatha Pillai we find that the first meaning given to this word there is அரமனை, royal palace. Among other meanings are: assemblage, tribe, family, race, caste, abode kind or species (of animals), &c. Some devout Saiva scholars adopt the first meaning of "palace" or house, the house of God கோயில், temple. It is found so used in standard works of Tamil literature. In Manimekalai (மணிமேகலை) for instance we read: தேவகுலமும் தெற்றியும் பள்ளியும் ... மிடைந்து, (the capital of the Chera King) crowded with God's temples sacrificial altars, abodes of ascetics &c. We quote a verse from Kanda Puranam also here for the information of our readers:

Maha Vidyalayams, the suggestion to have four streams at the G. C. E. level is educationally unsound and financially an unnecessary drain.

Pre-School and Post-School Education

The White Paper is not free from the influence of the political philosophy of the party in power. Its advocacy of socialism and the peculiar brand, of equality of opportunity stand condemned in with holding any kind of school education to children under six. Foundation for character and personality is unalterably laid in the pre-school age. Home is the best nursery for the development of character under the fostering care of the mother, but Ceylon homes vary in their lasting influence on the children. A Government which professes socialism as its goal and equality of opportunity as the means of attaining it cannot deny that the children from the slums and leaking sheds are denied equality of opportunity if they are not given educational centres to remove the leading inequalities of homes. Influence of such centres to remove the inequalities of caste and class and prepare the path for socialism is inestimable. This omission is a glaring evidence of the difference between profession and practice featuring prominently in Ceylon society and also of the effort to rationalise educational fallacies for lack of finance.

Democracy is failing in Ceylon on account of the incapacity of the average voter to understand and appreciate its value. There is no room for the democratic spirit to germinate. It is bound to deteriorate into dictatorship along with the much talked of Socialism if the standard of education of the average voter is not adequately raised. It is sound in policy that a Director of Education be in charge of adult education with an advisory committee to assist him.

There is no necessity to put it under the Department of Rural Development. The political, economic and social conditions in Ceylon are such that post school
