Some devout Saiva scholars adopt the first meaning of "palace" or house, the house of God Banuan, temple. It is found so used in standard works of Tamil literature. In Manimekalai (woof மேகவே) for instance we read: தேவ அமையம் தெற்றியும் பளளியும் ... மிடைந்து, (the capital of the Chera King) crowded with God's temples sacrificial altars, abodes of ascetics &c. ## Pre-School and Post-School Education

The White Paper is not free from the influence of the political philosophy of the party in power. Its advocacy of socialism and the peculiar brand, of equality of opportunity stand condemned with holding any kind of education school children under six. Foundation for character and personality is unalterably laid in the pre-school age. Home is the best nursery for the development of character under the fostering care of the mother, but Ceylon homes vary in their lasting influence on the chi dren.
