Premier Nehru Passes Away

WORLD WEIGHED DOWN IN WOE

Foremost Statesman and Patriot of His
Generation

The severest blow since the disappearance of Mahatma Gandhi sixteen years ago has been dealt to the entire world. Stricken by deep sorrow the people of the globe pay grateful homage to their beloved leader. He was Premier of Bharat in the sense he was elected to that office. But by common consent he was the Premier statesman for every country big or small, free or subject. That leadership has gone.



True it was that every one both in India and outside knew that Shri Jawaharlal Nehru had become physically depressed. But no one knew that the end would come so soon. For he had the strength of mind to withstand physical exhaustion. The end was quick. He took ill in the morning of Wednesday complaining of a severe pain in the chest. And at 2 p.m. he passed away leaving behind the wide world to weep in woe.

THE UNIVERSE AND
ITS CREATOR

(By Muhandiram E. P. Rasiah, J. P.)

A scrutiny and study of this Universe inspires awe and makes one feel that there must be an Architect, a Creator, a Planner and Controller behind it all. When one sees its staggering size and complexity, its order and unity, he realises his own smallness and the indescribable greatness of that Being, who is responsible for it all. One's image of himself shrinks into insignificance, when he peers into the depths of space and realises that the earth, where he lives, is less than a mere grain of sand by comparison with the Universe.

our Universe proved to be and so vast the distance within it, that one is driven to the belief that our latest scientific researches have only touched the surface in understanding it.

However, the billions of galaxies of innumerable stars, planets etc. were found to be set in orderly arrangement.

Distance

Despite the existence of so many heavenly bodies, there is little danger of collision, for, the spaces in between them are immense. Our closest neighbour, the moon is over 238,000 miles away and the sun is 93,000,000 miles away. The next closest star is about 270,000 times as far away from us as the sun is. So vast are the distances in this Universe that they are measured in "light years"—the distance light travels in one year at its speed of over 186,000 miles per second (equivalent to 7 times round the earth every second). This amounts to about 6 trillion miles a year. The closest star other than the sun—one of the Alpha Centauri Group—is over 4 light years away or about 25 trillion miles distant.

Our Milky Way Galaxy measures about 100,000 light years in diameter—the Sun being an insignificant star, 30,000 light years from the Galactic Centre—which helps explain why its myriads of stars are in little danger of colliding. In our Milky Way itself there is a star called Antares with a diameter of about 350,000,000 miles—400 times that of our Sun. How difficult it is to visualise the tremendous

Order and Design

From the largest heavenly bodies to the smallest atomic particles, order and design are apparent. And one Harvard Geology Professor, after much research, has remarked:-

"We live in a Universe not of chance or caprice, but of law and order. Its administration is completely rational and worthy of our utmost respect."

When astronomers began mapping out the heavens, what first appeared to be distant stars were later found to be "Island Universes, called Galaxies" where billions of stars and heavenly bodies were collected together in orderly systems. More advanced and more powerful telescopes revealed, not millions but billions and billions of such galaxies. Our Galaxy, called the Milky Way "containing about 100,000,000,000 stars is associated with at least 17 other such galaxies called a Galactic Group. Other Galactic Groups contain hundreds, or even thousands of galaxies. So colossal has the size of

Similarity of Planning

About a century ago, the English Physicist, John Dalton's experiments showed that the various elements behaved as if they were composed of tiny units. He called these units, Atoms and thought they were indivisible solid particles. Later experiments disclosed that the atom was not the smallest unit. Inside it were discovered, three other units—protons, neutrons and electrons. These were found to have the same orderliness as the rest of the Universe. Like a miniature Solar system the electrons were speeding around a nucleus of protons and neutrons in a law-abiding system.

An atom is only a few-billionths of an inch in diameter—the nucleus of protons and neutrons is however 100 000 times smaller than the entire diameter of the atom with its orbiting electrons. Yet this is not all. Modern research has brought to light many other particles inside the Atom and scientists number them at more than 30. So whether we examine the Universe or the Atom, we observe amazing power, order, unity, complexity etc. We can, however, comprehend the same order, harmony and regularity in both, testifying to their having the same Planner and the same Creator.

Supreme Power

A Professor of Biology once stated:—

"From the drop of water seen through the microscope, to the distant star observed through the telescope. I marvel at the exact orderliness—so exact that laws have been formulated to express its consistency ... Somewhere back of all this order must be a Supreme Being, for there can be no order and no laws without a Supreme Mind."

Professor Einstein has said:—

"I have a deeply emotional conviction of the presence of a Superior Reasoning Power, which is revealed in this incomprehensible Universe."

An Analysis of the TIRUMANTIRAM

Entering a womb and getting born in a body with the appetite for enjoyment, and experiencing objects of sensation, thought and action, resulting from contact with the bodily and mental faculties; thus abiding is the Sakala state of the soul.

When pleasure and pain appear alike (are equally eyed), and Divine Grace descends on him, one gets rooted in Gnanam, bondage disappears on the command of the gracious Guru, and birthlessness ensues. This is Suddham the pure state.

The careful reader will note the striking similarity of these last quoted three verses with the corresponding Siddhiyar verses, which seem to be a paraphrase of these. We refrain from quoting them here as we have already reproduced and translated them elsewhere. Vide Elements of Saiva Siddhantam, Chapter V, to which the reader's attention is invited.

2265 If the transcendent state is attained in the waking state, (the Guru) bestows his gracious look putting an end to the bewilderments of Maya, births cease, enduring emancipation ensues and there is an end to all thought and word (and action).

Subsection 8 continues the theme of Suddha Avasta (commenced in subsection 5) and calls it Para Avasta பராவத்தை (பராவத்தை), the state of association with Para Sakti or Divine Grace. We read:

2273 உரிய நனத்தரி யத்தி லிவனும், அரிய துரிய நனவாதி முன்றில் பரிய பரதரி யத்திற் பரனும், திரிய வரும்தரி யத்திற் சிவமே.

When resting in Turiyam in Jakram (Sakala Avasta) the soul is itself alone. When in exalted Turiyam in Turiyam beyond the first three states of the fourth state, it is associated with Param (Para Sakti or Divine Grace). When in transcendent Turiyatheetam (fifth state) it becomes (of the nature of Sivam.)

It is probably these three states of ordinary Turiyam in Jakram, exalted Turiyam in Turiyam and transcendent Turiyatheetam, that are described as சீவதரியம் Jeeva Turiyam, பரதரியம் Para Turiyam and சிவதரியம் Siva Turiyam later on, (Vide verse No. 2466). The ordinary reader cannot expect to have more than a faint superficial idea of subjects of this nature. It is only spiritually advanced souls that can properly realize their nature, பழுத்திடு பக்கு வம் அறிவர் பரிசுதானே in the words of Thayumanavar.

2286 The soul that relies on (or takes refuge in) Sivam, Sakti, Natham, Bindu, Sadasivam, Isan, Rudran, Hari and Brahman, becomes (of the nature of) these Deities.

Commentators explain that this verse indicates the nature of the soul that has attained the state of Para Avasta.

2291 When the 36 tatwas disappear along with Anavam and the hidden force (Tirodaya) that
