The (contemplation of the) heart-lotus implanted (within the human body is as follows): Earth (the grossest of the 24 Atma-tatwas is its root embeded in the navel, the next (23) tatwas form its stalk of 8 inches length, the products of Maya (Vidya tatwas) and Suddha| Vidya its eight petals on which are inscribed the eight letters (commencing with the Om), Iswara and Sadasiva tatwas the pallen and stamens, and Sakti (and Siva tatwas the seedvessel and seed) inside the pollen. Such is the comely seat (of the heart-lotus) on which resides the Bliss-giving Lord with His Arul-Sakti. Thus should you contemplate and worship (the Lord dwelling in your heart).
