## TWO MATTERS OF CURRENT INTEREST

I am frankly of opinion that the Minister of Education should temporarily give up the idea of sending Sinhalese teachers to the Tamil areas. His recent contention that all Tamil students will not be compelled to study Sinhalese is mere eye-wash. Students below the Pre-G. C. E. level have no choice but to follow classes in all subjects provided for in the time-table. Further to be eligible for pay a teacher must put in at least twenty hours of work a week (thirty periods of 40 mts. duration each). Now he has hit upon the idea of consulting parents. The secretary of the Jaffna Parents' Association has appealed to parents to boycott the proposed Referendum. The Federal party has announced its plans for a Satyagraha to prevent Sinhalese teachers from entering the schools. There is the possibility of students of a school joining the Satyagrahis outside the gates of their school. A section of them, always on the look out for excitement, will be engaged in making appearances at more than one Satyagraha venue. Student participation in such activities would whet their appetite for more action of this type and after this matter of Sinhalese teaching is settled they will be on the lookout to strike over some trivial matter. Student discipline is bound to suffer.

Viewed purely from the educational angle, educational experts have expressed the opinion that learning three languages is not beyond the capacity of a young student. However it must be noted that in schools where Sanskrit is taught a student may have to learn four languages. This aspect of the matter requires special consideration.

The other matter I wish to comment upon is

the proposed resignations of Federal M. Ps. Are the Federalists worried about their waning support in the North and East? A rift in the party has been reported in the local press and hotly denied by party stalwarts. However, the M. P. for Kili-nochchi has resigned and there is room to believe that a united front (with some suitable name) of those Tamils and Muslims who do not agree with the policies of the Federalists, will be formed soon. The formation of such a front is welcome and may make the Federal M. Ps give up the idea of resigning and re-contesting. If there is no front, individuals with money and hitherto unrealised personal ambitions may come forward as candidates and bye-elections may not be clear fights.

The issues facing the Tamils now are the same that faced them in '56. Present government action is based on policies made in '56 and after and the Tamils cannot afford to waste time, energy and material resources in demonstrations (often badly misunderstood in the South) against each and every administrative act arising out of the discriminatory policies of Sinhalese governments. Tamils must protest and demand in a broad-based and dignified manner. The next General Elections will come off in 1965 and the Federal M. Ps can wait till then. This will give the Tamil people a chance to judge whether the formation of the S. L. F. P.—L. S. S. P. coalition has led to any improvement in their position. Frequent bye-elections before the General Elections would dampen interest in the latter—something not desirable. Issues facing the Tamils can be explained to the masses without clamouring for a Federal set-up and Federalists should not demand that they should

That one should refrain from the desire for God seems rather a bold statement to make. The idea is that in its highest aspect even the worship and love of God should be disinterested, without any strings attached (without any expectation of reward). The reader's attention is drawn in this connection to our 'Study of the Swetaswata Upanishad', Appendix 2, where we have discussed the subject at some length.

**UNIFIED DEMANDS BY UNITED FRONT**

While expressing our appreciation of the fact that the precipitation of a major political crisis in the Tamil-speaking people's movement for their rights has been averted by the latest decision of the Federal Party Central Committee we wish to plead for a review of the situation in general in the light of the professions of good-will by the leading spokesmen of the Coalition Government. The unanimous opinion of the Commonwealth Prime Ministers' Conference that the Member Nations of the Commonwealth must strive to solve inter racial problems that are threatening the orderly development of mankind also inspires in the minds of the minorities in this country a fresh hope for a fruitful solution of all outstanding questions. At this juncture it becomes a need of paramount importance and priority that the Tamil speaking people should be able to put forward unified demands for redress of their grievances. The place of political parties in the movements for regaining lost rights cannot be denied. But it must be admitted that the cause of a people would be best served only when it is presented unitedly. The uniformity of demands will make the effect more forceful and easier for consideration. We, therefore, in the name of the entire Tamil speaking Community suggest that a Convention of the minorities be summoned for formulating the basis on which the harmony-seeking mediators in the Coalition Government can proceed with the exploring of a workable solution of the problems of language, colonisation, citizenship and other allied mat-

**REDUCING COST OF LIVING**

**By Better Agricultural Methods**

Mr. Nagalingam Ethirveerasingham, a 29-year-old student from Jaffna, who is working toward a Master's degree in agricultural education at California State Polytechnic College, says he enjoys the practical aspects of college training in the United States.

Mr. Ethirveerasingham, who will complete the requirements for his degree in July (1964), already has a Bachelor of Science degree in agricultural economics from the University of California at Los Angeles. He says he decided to work toward his advanced degree in agricultural education because his country needs more vocational agricultural teachers.

Now on his second stay in the United States, Mr. Ethirveerasingham went to "Cal Poly" in San Luis Obispo, California, last September. "I like living in a small community", he observes. "It functions much differently than does a big city."

The serious-minded Ceylonese student says he enjoys studying agriculture and likes the added "depth" of his education courses even more.

"I like the idea of developing a philosophy of education to go with the practical aspects of agricultural courses." Besides studying poultry, husbandry, soil science and agricultural economics, Mr. Ethirveerasingham is taking courses in the philosophy of education, curriculum and methods, the psychology of learning, social psychology, educational guidance, audio-visual methods and special problems.

"I enjoy these courses," he says. "It gives me a broad outlook on both teaching and agriculture."

Currently, Mr. Ethirveerasingham is preparing a paper titled, "The Introduction of a Vocational Agriculture Program in Ceylonese High Schools."

"I have already read more than 40 books in the preparation of my report," he comments. "The subject is so interesting that reading the material does not become a chore for me."

A student who gets the most he can from his classes, Mr. Ethirveerasingham enjoys seminar discussion courses in which students do most of the talking. "These are the classes that really have substance, because they give us a practical type of experience in teaching, he points out.

But life in the United States is not all classroom work for the diligent Ceylonese student. Besides working hard at his studies, Mr. Ethirveerasingham is a member of the Agricultural Education Club and the International Relations Club on the campus.

Recently he participated in a debate on "Nationalism versus Internationalism" at an International Relations Club forum. "I took nationalism because no one else would," he says.

A former Olympic athlete, Mr. Ethirveerasingham enjoys track activities. Although he does not officially participate for "Cal Poly" he does "work out with the team." He is looking forward to a weekend trip to the San Joaquin Valley to compete "unattached" in the California relays at Redesto, his speciality is the high jump.

After graduation, Mr. Ethirveerasingham says he hopes to work for about a year on an American farm or ranch in order to gain more practical experience, because "a knowledge of practical methods is what my people really need most."

In addition to the introduction of vocational agriculture, he believes that the coming of small industry is going to aid the economy of Ceylon.

Mr. Ethirveerasingham says he firmly believes that the introduction of vocational agriculture on a wide scale will help lower the cost of living in his native Ceylon.
