Double Deckor Buses for Jaffna

The C. T. B. Bus service in Jaffna has been slightly strengthened by the addition of two double-decker buses. Twenty more buses are expected to be sent to the Jaffna Depot in the course of this month. The Kachcheri-Manipay, and the Jaffna-Kankesanturai routes will have the benefit of the double-decker buses in the first instance.

Postal System Polls for India

'The surest way of guaranteeing a real parliamentary democracy in India is to plan inexpensive elections' said Shri C. Rajagopalachari, Leader of the Swatantra Party in calling for the appointment of a Commission to go into the entire system of elections in India. He wanted a new method of conducting elections in as simple a manner as the 'postal system which deals with letters.'

Meaning Of The Term Newspaper

"Newspaper" means any paper containing public news, intelligence or occurrence which is printed and published in Ceylon by any person other than a political party or other than a body which is recognised by the Council as a political organisation and includes a Sunday edition of that paper:

"Newspaper business" means the business of printing or publishing any newspaper.

Independence Of Newspapers In India

The Council of States of India is considering a Bill about the establishment of a Press Council.

The Bill is being introduced to preserve the liberty of the Press and maintain and improve the standards of newspapers in India".

The Press Council will have 26 members nominated by the Chief Justice. 13 working journalists will be among the 26 members. The council's functions *inter alia* will be to help newspapers maintain their independence.

Make Press Bill Election Issue

Sir,— Lord Macaulay, the eminent British Statesman and Historian, in one of his Essays, says thus:—

"When there is a Free Press, the Governors must live in constant awe of the opinions of the governed."

This is a requirement of Democracy.

In view of the great controversy in the country regarding the proposed Press Bill and as the life of the present Parliament is almost coming to an end, this measure could be placed before the country at the next general Election and the new Parliament could well be allowed to consider the matter afresh. This procedure would in the long-run be advantageous not only for the country as a whole but for all political parties including those two forming the Coalition Government. Your editorial on the subject voices the opinion of the public.

A similar postponement in the case of the proposal re-Toddy Tapping would be very desirable.

The Prime Minister has expressed her readiness to listen to public opinion. Great opposition has been demonstrated generally by the public regarding these two proposals.

The immaculate Lord possessed of Supernatural powers,—He creates forms (bodies of various kinds for the soul) without having a Form for Himself. He is the cause of all creation without having a cause for Himself. No one can attain Him without the aid of a Guru.

C.f the following Devaram lines which convey the same idea in almost identical words; கருவினால் அன்றியே கருவேளாம் ஆயவன், உருவினால்ன்றியே உருவுசெய்தானிடம்.....தென் குடித்திட்டையே.

He is (the source of) everything (all creation) without Himself having a source. He who created all bodies without Himself having a body to rest on,—His place of abode is (the shrine of) Tiru-Ten-Kudi-Thiddai.

Section XVIII bears the heading Ooz ஊழ், literally oldness. This refers to old deeds, particularly the results of deeds done in previous births, otherwise known as Praraptam பிராரப்தம், the fruits of actions performed in previous births which are ripe for enjoyment in this birth. It is also called Vithi விதி generally translated as Fate or destiny and misunderstood. It is order or destiny in the sense that it is God's Ordinance ordained in accordance with our good and bad deeds of previous births. We have discussed the relative effects of Vithi விதி and Mathi மதி in our note on the life of St. Sundarar in appendix 3 to our study of the Swetaswatara Upanishad, to which the reader's attention is invited.

2847 Whether you cut off (their limbs) or pare off (their skin) or anoint their bodies with fragrant sandal paste, or split their heads with chisels, true Gnanies will remain calm and steadfast in the path ordained by the Gracious Blissful Lord without losing their equanimity.

That Vithi is not an arbitrary ordinance enacted and imposed on us by an autocratic dictator at his whim and fancy without any rhyme or reason but a judicious order made by the Lord based on the merits and demerits of our own deeds (good, bad and indifferent) performed in previous births is made abundantly clear by our author in the next verse, which reads:

THE PEOPLE AND THE PRESS

It has become a matter of habit for politicians to qualify their actions and statements by stating that they represent the people and whatever they do or propose to do is on behalf and in protection of the people. The ruling group and the parties in the Opposition all claim to champion the cause of the people. Herein lies the fallacy of arguments.

Taking the Governing group into special consideration the anomalous situation of contradictory principles and practices is glaringly exposed. There is the Ministry in charge of Cultural Affairs taking infinite pains to make this country progress according to the traditional culture of its people. The Prohibition movement for instance is characteristic of the cherished respect for the cultural greatness of this Island. But in the same breath, though the entire Cabinet may not be of the same contradictory view, the proposal to make this glorious isle a toddy-land flowing with fermented juice of palms, has been included in the suggested legislative measures that are to sustain the new budget plan. The same inconsistency can be seen in the Premier's tall talk about freedom for the people as against the subtle move to enslave the people by denying them the right of a free press.

In the Raja Sabha of the Union of India, a Press Bill has been introduced with a view to enabling the Press guard the liberty of the people. The term 'people' in the context of the Indian Press Bill connotes the real significance of the term. The Indian Bill is a legislative support to the Press and the People for the common purpose of maintaining high journalistic standards. It is not a destructive agent aiming at the establishment of a

dictatorship. The Press Council of the Indian conception is a body that is representative of the Press and is intended to function in a manner that will help newspapers maintain their independence. There is no vindictive provision, no vicious intention. The main idea behind the legislative measure is the reiteration of the Indian Nation's unshakable faith in the freedom of the Press.

Premier Srimavo Bandaranaike and her colleagues in the Cabinet will do well to study the Indian Press Bill and grasp its simple significance and to understand the fact that the ruling party is not the only party that represents the people nor the only voice of the people. If this interpretation cannot be accepted by the Coalition Government, the only sure method of ascertaining the views of the people is for the Coalition Government to sound the mind of the people by means of a plebiscite or in other words by holding a General Election.

Objects Of The Ceylon Press Council

The objects of the Council shall be—

(a) to safeguard the freedom of the press;

(b) to help the press to maintain its independence;

(c) to ensure that news is published in newspapers without distortion or disregard of truth;

(d) to exercise general supervision and control over newspaper business with a view to ensuring that newspapers published by such businesses will maintain a high standard of journalistic ethics and will present news to the public fairly, accurately and with due regard to the truth.

(e) to ensure that in case, where news is not so presented by such newspapers, suitable amends will be made to persons aggrieved by the publication of such news;

(f) to publish periodical reports of the various developments of the press, and

(g) to suggest to the Government any amendments necessary to the existing legislation relating to the Press.

The Council shall have power to do anything necessary for, or conducive or incidental to the carrying out of its objects, including the power—

(a) to frame, in consultation with associations of journalists and proprietors of newspapers, a code of journalistic ethics;

(b) in regard to the journalists and other persons engaged in any newspaper business—

(i) to make recommendations as to the terms and conditions of their employment.

(ii) to devise the scales of salaries and wages payable to them;

(iii) to devise pension schemes and provident funds for their benefit;

(c) to hold inquiries into complaints made by members of the public who are aggrieved by the publication in any newspaper of any news, cartoons or pictures which are of a defamatory nature;

(d) to hold inquiries into matters connected with the publication in any newspaper of news, cartoons, pictures or stories which are obscene or are injurious to public morality or are harmful to young persons, and into contraventions of the provisions of the code of journalistic ethics.

TEMPLE LANDS AND SCHOOLS

The following will be discussed by the Sabhai at its meeting on Sunday 13th inst.

The Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabha notes with deep regret the refusal of the Department of Education and the Government to continue to pay the rents of Temple Lands donated by philanthropists specifically for providing funds for the maintenance of such Temples and had been leased by the Temple proprietors to the proprietors of schools for the purpose of obtaining funds for maintaining the temples. The temples are already poor and without these scanty resources they are unable to maintain themselves and serve the public. The Sabhai presses on the Government to have in mind the above position and when new legislation is framed after the discussion on the White Paper under consideration at present provision may be made in law for the restoration of such lands to the Temples and where the lands cannot be spared by the schools, for the payment of reasonable rent as done before the schools were taken over provided that the Govt. is satisfied that such funds are being used for the maintenance of the said Temples.
