## A Pioneer of Hindu Education

### Prize - Day Reference At Scandavarodaya College

#### (Principal's Report)

This is the 12th anniversary of our revered founder. We cherish his memory with gratitude. He was so attached to us and we to him that we have got used to thinking that death would never part us. He was one of the pioneers of Hindu Education in the North. He worked heart and soul for an institution in which the poorest felt that it was their own, an institution in which there was no discrimination between high and low and an institution in which he desired to be an ideal seat of learning. He was a scholar and a devout Saivite. His culture was definitely oriental. His deep knowledge of both English and Tamil, his devotion to Saiva Siddhanta, his humility and genial smile and his generosity made him to be endeared and sought after, May he live in the hearts of all of us for ever!

#### Fountain of Generosity

It is our sad duty to record the death of our former Manager Dr. S. Subramaniam in January this year. He was a source of inspiration, strength and encouragement to us for about three decades. The development of this school is largely due to this untiring efforts, his generosity and his abiding interest in educational and social service. We were singularly fortunate to have Dr. S. Subramaniam at the helm of affairs of this college. He was an ever-flowing fountain of generosity pouring out in every direction—in religious activities, in social services, in donations to maternity homes and above all in educational pursuits. He ungrudgingly donated several acres of land to this college, put up buildings and spent liberally on the laboratories. We are deeply indebted to him for

such valuable contributions he made from time to time. His name will be writ large in the annals of Skanda Varodaya. May his soul rest in peace!

#### New Era

We hope that the proposals for a national system of education will usher in a new era of educational, cultural and economic progress for our country. The new proposals envisage a long term plan for the achievement of the long-felt needs of this country. The abolition of the Assisted School System in 1960 has eliminated the dual control of education. Under a national system of education under state control, it will be easier to plan and co-ordinate education with the national policy of economic development. Education must subserve national needs and objectives. The private sector may not command the resources to provide for adequate facilities for the kind of education that the national plan may require.

One important feature in the proposals is the introduction of work experience. This is highly welcoming. Many progressive countries have productive labour in their curricula. It breaks up the age old tradition in schools of looking down upon physical labour. The combination of education with productive labour is essential to give employment to large numbers of boys and girls. This work experience forms an essential part of the common core of the school curriculum at all stages.

Another striking feature in the proposals for a National System of Education is adequate planning and provision for Technical Education. A National System of Tech-

### Nallur Festivals— The True Picture

Sir,—It is with regret that we note the letter from Mr. Raveendran of Changkanai on the Nallur Festivals, appearing in the columns of the Daily Mirror of the 10th inst. Mr. Raveendran appears to be disappointed in not hearing the shouts of Haro Hara everywhere and continuously. He has evidently seen the crowds moving about the approach roads to the temple and the Veedis which form part of two major highways. He has apparently not seen the fervour shown by the devotees inside the temple which rises to a crescendo of shouts of Haro Hara when Poojabs are done, the men rolling round the veedis both inner and outer and the women following with their genuflexions. Hindu forms of worship are unique and distinct from the forms of worship of other religions. They are more or less individual and according to each person's temperament. They should not be compared with the regimented services of the Christians.

The Fun fair atmosphere is unavoidable where large crowds congregate and the Nallur temple situated in the heart of the Municipal area cannot possibly exclude from its veedis which are also public highways the polyglot crowd composed of Christians, Muslims and possibly thugs in addition. Quite a few of them are out for amusement only while many are for business. The Inner Veedis are different and would represent the true picture of the festivals.

There were a few foreign visitors and I had the pleasure of getting the opinion of Madam Rabani, a much travelled dignitary of the Bahai movement. She visited the temple during the festival and was all

## An Analysis of the TIRUMANTIRAM

(By A Science Graduate)

Siva Darsanam சிவதரிசனம் or vision of God (Section XIX) and Siva Soroopa Darsanam சிவசோரூப தரிசனம் or vision of God's true Form (section XX) are subjects previously dealt with in various contexts. They seem to be re-introduced and briefly touched on here to re-emphasise their importance.

2853 There is no difference between God and the heart (which forms His temple). God dwells in the hearts of devotees capable of realizing Him, free from bewilderment. He manifests Himself in their hearts.

2859 I opened my inner eye that had got enlightened and looked. Then the peerless effulgent Blessed Lord possessed of beautiful Form and entangled Locks graciously looked at me from within me.

The next two sections entitled XXI Mukti Nilai முத்தி நிலை or state of emancipation (from bondage) and XXII Karma Nirvanam கருமநிர்வாணம், literally freedom from action (or actionlessness), refer practically to one and the same subject.

(What is called) emancipation ensues thus: In the state of Turiyam where no difference is perceived between the soul, God and Divine Grace, the intrinsic nature of the soul becomes identified with the nature of God. This indeed is the dawn of faultless freedom from action.

Devotees who attain the Supreme Truth grasped by those who renounce all other grasps, the Frontal-eyed Lord worshipped by those who attain mental calmness through learning, the Divine Light surrounded in worship by ascetics who get rid of all worldly surroundings,—they indeed cease from all fruitless talk (and action).

Here we come to a long section clothed in mystic language entitled (XXIII) Sooniya Sambashanai சூனிய சம்பாஷனை, literally non-apparent talk or discourse in hidden language. The word சூனியம், as we explained earlier, is generally taken as denoting total emptiness or vacuity, absolute non-existence or nothing, a cypher or zero. But here it denotes non-luminosity, something concealed or hidden from view, mystic or possessed of a secret meaning not easily understandable. There are 70 verses in this section. We shall quote a few only here by way of example and try to elucidate them:

verse with any first-hand knowledge. We can only say that the verse refers to the part played by Tiro-tana Sakti திரோதான சக்தி the hiding Power of the Lord in making the body and bodily faculties to function and the soul to eat the fruits of its good and bad deeds.

I dug up the soil and sowed some brinjal seeds, they sprouted as bitter-gourd plants and (the buds they produced in course of time) blossomed as pumpkin flowers. The garden occupants (got alarmed and ran away praying (to their favourite deities). The fruits cropped were all plantain fruits.

This refers to the developments that ensue in the course of the practice of Yoga Sadana. Cf. the Siddhiyar verse commencing with the words கட்டுவ இயம் தானும் quoted earlier. Vide notes under v rse No. 2529 in section XXI of the Eighth Ta tiram.

We are told that in the technical phraseology of Siddha ascetics (சிக்தகர் பிரபாகஷ) the words வழக்கில் வித்திடல் (literally sowing brinjal seeds) refer to Yoga Sadana. The bitter-gourd plants are identified as Vairakkiyam வைராக்கியம் or desirelessness. Digging of the soil refers to deliberation as to the true nature of the Tatwas. The pumpkin flower refers to the blooming heart-lotus. The garden occupants are the sense-savages and other evil tendencies that afflict the soul. And the plantain fruits represent the enjoyment of Godly Bliss. The esoteric meaning of the verse is :
