Singhai Pararaja Sekaram (1478-1519) A Prophecy

We have already mentioned the prophecy of the Sage Subaditta, regarding the future rulers of Ceylon. There seems to have been a similar prophecy in a Venba verse, which contained the substance of that prophecy - which is found engraved in one of the columns of the temple in Fort Frederick at Trincomalee. The words that are discernible today are as follows:—

These words were completed by the late Pandit N. V. Chelliah of Vannarpannai.

The verse, sung by Vaidyapuri Ayer who was a sage is as follows:—

Queyroz says that the translation of the verse was:—

"Manu Raja Emperor of this Lanka erected this temple to the God Vidia Malmunda in the year (equal to 1300 B. C.). There is a nation called Francos who will destroy it, and there will be no king who will rebuild it once more."

Pandit N. V. Chelliah has composed his "Venba" to tally with the above, excepting the word "Kulakoddan" who is really the son of Mana Niti Kanda Cholan or Manu Vantan.

Constantine de Sa. who gave orders for the destruction of Kovasar temple writes as follows.—

"When I went there to make this Fort, I found

this written on the pagoda among many writings which were there, one of which ran thus:—

.....has caused the pagoda to be built. Nevertheless the time shall come when the nation of the Frangis shall destroy it, and there shall be no king in the island of Ceylon who shall rebuild it anew."

Codrington and Rasanayagam give the following translation of the Tamil inscriptions at the entrance of the Fort.

"O King! the Portuguese shall later break down the holy edifice built by Kulakoddan in ancient times, and it shall not be built nor will future kings think of doing so."

The word "Vadugan" says Dr. Balendra does not mean Telugus. It means it will thrive again Codrington (R. A. S. Vol. XXX in 1927 translates this rock inscription as follows:—

"O King Harken, after a rat's eyed one, the red eyed one, and the smoke eyed one have gone the figure will be that of the Northerner.

Some of the bronze statues of Siva which were in Trincomalee temple appeared in 1950. In February 1952 a hastily built shrine inside Fort Frederick at the summit of Swamy Rock was ready to house the statues. The Commandant of the Fort and the British garrison were ready to welcome the pilgrims, when suddenly King George VI passed away peacefully in his sleep and when the statues were enshrined on the auspicious date 23rd February 1952 there was no king in the Island of Ceylon. Ceylon India and Malaysia must Fight Communist Threat

The President of the Malaysian Indian Congress Singapore, Mr. John Jacob, made a powerful plea during the weekend for United States' aid to democratic nations like India, Ceylon, Tibet (Tibetans in exile) and Malaysia to fight Communism.

He was speaking at a dinner given by himself in honour of a leading member of President Johnson's national Citizens' Committee for Community Relations, Mr. Elmer Winter, during the latter's three-day visit to Singapore in course of a business tour of this region.

Mr. Winter who is also the President and Co-founder of Manpower, Inc., world's largest and most comprehensive manpower bureau with 350 offices throughout the five continents, was accompanied by his wife.

Also present were the Vice Chancellor of the University of Singapore, Professor Lim Tay Boh, the Director of the U.S.I.S in Singapore, Mr. Howard Stingle, and many leading local businessmen, besides journalists.

During discussions, Mr. Jacob acquainted Mr. Winter with the political situation in this region and particularly the Communist menaces which he described as quite serious. He pointed out that, had Mr. Dudley Senanayake and his party not won the recent general elections in Ceylon, Communist China would have used that Island as another base for

aggression against India. Mr. Jacob therefore told Mr. Winter that the American Government must help the Senanayake Government in every possible way.

Mr. Jacob also pleaded the cause of the Tibetans: "If the United Nations does not help the Tibetans to regain their land from Communist China then this world organisation the UNO will suffer the same fate as the old League of Nations," he said.

Mr. Winter expressed visible surprise when told by Mr Jacob that when Chiang Kai-shek dies, Taiwan will turn Communist and its Chinese population will clamour for reunion with their "motherland."

The Singapore MIC leader also expressed the view that Pakistan's border agreement with China is definitely detrimental to the safety and security of India. He declared that India as the largest democracy in the world, deserves the maximum help from the United States and all other democratic nations to preserve her democracy from Communist China. They must also ignore a theocratic nation like Pakistan which by collaborating with Communist China has become a grave danger to peace in this area.

Referring to Malaysia, Mr. Jacob said he was distressed to find the United States haggling over interest rates for the loan which Malaysia had asked from her for fighting Indonesian aggression. Malaysia is a democratic country and the United States should give every aid possible to Malaysia to help repel Indonesian aggression. The U. S. should not charge any interest at all, said Mr. Jacob. He also warned that the Indonesian confrontation is a serious matter as it is backed by the Communists.

SIGNIFICANCE OF SECTION 29 OF THE CONSTITUTION

The trend of the debate on the motion of the Leader of the House of Representatives to appoint a Select Committee to report on the revision of the Constitution was as amusing as it was annoying. The vagaries of the weather of political parties that exist merely for snatching power have become clearly visible. That the Leaders of the L. S. S. P. and C. P. should have taken pains to stretch a point in favour of the minorities has added to the mockery these parties are, of late, making of politics. However one significant note of the debate was the value of the entrenched clause in the Constitution that is Section 29. The Soulbury Commissioners who could not accede to the demands of the All Ceylon Tamil Congress however included a Section as a safe-guard against discriminative and hasty legislation.

The Member for Jaffna whose presentation of the demands of the Tamil speaking people to the Soulbury Commission was able to secure a small measure of safe-guard for the minorities in the form of section 29 rightly pointed out during the debate that a chapter on fundamental rights should be included in the new Constitution as had been done in the Indian Constitution.

The Leftist leaders owe a clear explanation to the Tamil speaking people why they have suddenly become the most uncompromising of anti-Tamil Communalists. The slogans that are so gleefully mouthed by these Marxist Communalists may well be the burden of the swan

Builder of Nallur

Pararajasekan completed the plans of his father Kanagasuriya Singai Ariyan, who erected royal streets, palaces, and had places assigned for his horse-forces, and elephant forces, pleasure gardens, and streets for various trades and vocations. There were streets for the carpenters, blacksmiths, artists, goldsmiths, gemmologists, poets, musicians, mansions for the merchant princes, special quarters for the Brahmins, astrologers physicians and farmers. Nallur literally means a "good city." The work began so well by the father was we may well conclude successfully completed by the son Singai Pararajasekaran VI.

Administration

Singhai Pararajasekaran divided his kingdom into thirty two divisions which had thirty two supervising officers, who exercised power over these divisions. The king formed "Panchayats" or Village Committees consisting of five members for each village. He strengthened the army and the navy. He established an inn or a "Choultry" for the free distribution of rice, to pilgrims in the city and his brother Sekarajasekaran established a similar one at Rameshwaram.
