The Mystery of a Modern Avatar— His First Sixteen Years

(BY DR. T. NALLAINATHAN)

In my essays on "Dakshinamurthi and his teachings" (now available in your Press in book form). I stated categorically that he prayed to no-one, and yet shewed mankind by his acts the omnipotence, omnipresence and omniscience of God. The oft quoted dictum that the former avatars prayed in order to set an example to their followers is indeed unacceptable to the modern mind. Satya Sai Baba himself writes out Kirtans from his school days and participates in them only to inspire his devotees. He tells out plainly and unequivocally that he does not worship. When he was a brat of twelve he went out with a group of his admirers to an ancient Sivan temple situated a few miles away from his home. Outside the temple precincts was a San'yasin who advised them to cherish the divine attributes of this boy, since he found in this group drawn from the adjoining villages some who were there only out of curiosity. However, Satya Sai Baba stood in the outermost court-yard (வெளிப்பிரகாரம்) leaning against the parapet wall, while all the others went in. During the hour of worship and Arathi to their great bewilderment they found in the place of Shivalingam Satya Sai Baba. His elder brother, who then didn't accept his divinity, dashed out to see if he was still in the outer courtyard; and to his consternation Satya was still there in the same place gazing at the sky. His leelas while a boy, remind us of Krishna. He takes on an evening his devotees to the neighbouring hills adjoining the river Chittravathi, and shews himself as a pillar of dazzling white light with the brilliance of a

crore of suns; some faint, while the rest worship the light. The boys will see a great and powerful light emanating from his forehead (Ajna Chakra) between the two eyebrows as a sun; at other times they see a white halo of light around his head. He will now and then take them to the top of a hill where there is a tamarind tree; from some branches they would pluck apples, from others mangoes and from still others oranges. Practically all the delicious fruits are there. He has brought to our very door Kalpatru (கற்புட அருகம்). We have read of the Kalpatru in Vasishtha's Ashram, when Visvamitra and his hungry retinue called on him, though Valmiki makes Vasishtha's cow, the Kalpatru! Poetic imagination in keeping with the ancient traditions is different from what we now call scientific facts. Most of those who had this rare privilege of eating those fruits (and this miracle was repeated quite a few times) are still living. He will take sand and convert it into holy ash or sugar or sugarcandy or other sweets. At other times he will hold his outstretched right hand with the palm facing downwards, move it circularly a couple of times and bring out all sorts of wonderful articles from his hand. They include holy ash, golden ornaments in-laid with precious stones, photos of himself or of other ishtadevas, articles lost by a devotee some years ago elsewhere, medicines of all kinds, rare flowers from Kailas and green herbs from the Himalayas. While at school he was regarded as the astrologer par excellence. All who have lost their articles would be at his door in the evenings. He would

give the first and last letters of the thieves concerned. A teacher of his once lost his expensive fountain pen and came to Satya who pointed at his servant (cook) as the thief. The teacher wouldn't hear anything of it since he considered his servant as hundred percent honest. Luckily the illiterate servant had a son studying in another village. Satya adopted the C. I. D. method of writing to the son enquiring as to how the pen was writing. The son innocently replied that the pen was wonderful thanking the father once more. Satya shewed this letter to his teacher.

He was so popular that people would invite him to join caravan trips. He would get down from the cart and pretending to go near by would disappear amidst the hills. This in the writer's opinion, was due to the impious and worldly emanations from the auras of his friends and admirers. They were unbearable to this divine child. The entire caravan would be held up a few hours before he could be found. Later in the trip he transformed himself by his maya into a young woman and joined the first cart which took only women. After some time this woman was found missing. Then only they realised after a lengthy vain search for her, that the woman intruder was no other than Satya himself.

He was very fond of the drama. His teachers used to request him to write out plays. He accepted their invitations and produced plays in one of which he castigated severely the conduct of those teachers whose example was very different from their precepts. There was great furor in the school and the day after the drama the boy refused to attend school on the ground that the teachers teach them one thing but behave in just the opposite way. The parents had to get down his teachers including the Head-teacher, who accepted Satya's attitude as correct and promised henceforth to practise what they preached. He used to take part in the

OUR MOTHER EARTH

The earth is one of the planets of our Solar system with the sun as its centre. The earth rotates on its own axis once in twenty four hours exposing itself to the rays of the sun to provide light and warmth to its inhabitants. The regular periodicity with which day and night succeed each other is due to the idea of time. The earth seems to be continuously moving to the east so that the sun and other heavenly objects appear to rise in the East and set in the West. The moon goes round the earth once a month, when sun, moon and earth are in one line we find the moon is not visible owing to its presence near the sun but when the moon, earth and sun are in one line with moon further away from the sun we see the moon full. The moon shows different phases and is in different places in its daily passage in the heavens and we make use of the moon to locate other objects in the heavens. Apart from the planets that go round the sun there are other stars who do not seem to move and appear fixed. Apart from its

rotation on its axis the earth also goes round the sun in one year so doing the earth appears to have different stars at the Eastern horizon and the zenith over head. These stars are so far away that it takes many light years for their light, to reach the earth. These stars are also suns and about 27 twenty seven of them form a belt of light zodiacal belt in the outskirts of our vast universe. The ancients have divided this belt into 12 parts or zodiacal houses. When the sun appears to rise in each house the period that it takes to move to the other house is a month and we call the month by the name of the zodiacal house e. g. When the sun appears to rise in mesha it is called Mesha Rasi, in Rishava, Rishava Rasi etc. and when the moon becomes full in the opposite house we call the lunar month by the name of the star in which the full moon occurs e. g. Chitra masa, Vaikasi masa etc. The earth in addition appears to have its poles nearer or further away from the sun owing to its axis being at an angle. When the North pole is nearest to the sun we have the summer solstice and furthest away we have the winter solstice; from winter solstice to summer solstice we have uttarayana with the days longer than the nights and from summer solstice to winter solstice we have Dakshinayana with nights longer than the days. When the sun crosses the earth's equator in the uttarayana we have vernal equinox with day and night of equal length. Similarly when the sun crosses the equator in the Dakshinayana we have autumnal equinox. The diathermal effects of the seasons help to promote life on earth. The question arises whether the universe was designed to promote life on earth and other planets.



Joint Parliamentary Committee and Round Table Conferences

The suggestion for holding round-table-conferences in order to arrive at solutions for some of our national problems is sound. Immediately on the inauguration of the Soulbury Constitution eighteen years ago when there were differences of opinion between the Sinhalese and Tamil communities on certain matters identical suggestion was made by me during the time of the late Mr. D. S. Senansyake for the purpose of arriving at some satisfactory arrangement. Subsequently also the suggestion was repeated from various quarters and by me. It is gratifying that the proposal is again made.

It is trusted that if round-table-conferences are held it would not be confined to Parliamentarians and politicians alone. It is desirable to invite members of the Sangha, other religious dignitaries and leaders, educationists, representatives of Trade, Commerce and Industry, Agriculture Retired Government Officers, professional spokesmen and other leaders of thought and national activity. So far as the Tamil people are concerned, it desirable that they hold round-table-conferences of their own as a preliminary step and try to arrive if possible, at some agreed proposals which could be submitted to the bigger round-table-conference with leaders of the Sinhales and other Ceylonese communities. Such a preliminary step would facilitate the work of the bigger round-table-conferences.

It is also desirable and necessary that the work

of mankind has maintained during his life-time. The Chinese and the Pakistanis also belong to the world that pays sincere homage to Nehruji. It is for these two neighbours of India to uphold the values of the Nehru view of peaceful co-existence and to work for the easing of the tension on the Indian borders as part of their tribute to one who had during his life-time served the world from rain.

of these round-table-conferences be taken in hand without delay so that when representations before the Select Joint Parliamentary Committee on Constitutional Reforms are made, there would be less disagreement and differences of opinion. The round-table-conferences could do the spade work necessary and vital for the work of the Parliamentary Select Committee. It would also expedite the ushering of Constitutional Reforms, the solution of communal and sectional differences and the consolidation of national unity which is so essential for the happiness and prosperity of the country as well as for its immunity from external interference in these days of international stress and conflict of interests and ideology between the nations, specially the Big Powers.

Round-Table-Conferences themselves could turn out to be successful if preceded by several personal and private exploratory talks between leaders, and not otherwise. Even as the ground for the work of the Joint Parliamentary Committee requires preparation, the ground for the work of the Round-Table conferences also requires earlier preparation.
