Some admirers of his had come to him from Kamalapuram. He asked them if they liked to hear Sri Krishna's flute. They jumped at the idea. He invited each of them one by one to put their ears to his heart. Lo! they heard the melody of Sri Krishna's flute not only in their ears, but also in their own hearts. Artists and poets had expatiated on the exoteric flute in the past, but here is a Master who not only made them hear exoterically with their ears but also esoterically in their own hearts. In Yoga it is described as Anababa Natham which the Yogi alone can hear. It may take any one of ten forms of sound and the melody of the flute is one of them. Thiagaraja Bhavatar looks upon music as a sure means to God. Oh! how lovely were those pilgrims from Kamalapuram to have been given this new kind of initiation unknown and undescribed in the Shastras!!! only a Sri Krishna could do it; and Satya was still a minor! It is said that when Kundalini Shakti ascends to the Visudhi Chakra in the throat the Yogi blows the natham of the conch (சங்குநாதம்) which takes him to the Aina Chakra situated between the two eye-brows. her home) a coconut and rupees fifteen kept in a tray (தாயிலாசை). She held the tray with both hands and called on Palani Andavar to accept it. U.S. Debate on Viet Nam Policy Professors Differ

Washington witnessed an extraordinary event to-day when over 1,500 members of the academic community from across the nation engaged in a serious public debate before an audience of over 4,000 of the Viet Nam policy of the United States.

The inter-university community for a public hearing on Viet Nam as the sponsors of the conference called it was the culmination of a similar series of debates in the great colleges and campuses of this nation where there has been an intellectual ferment against the U. S.'s Viet Nam policy since March.

The event today, was to have been a public confrontation between critics of Government policy and policy makers in the Johnson administration. After a series of public challenges, Mr. McGeorge Bundy, who is President Johnson's closest adviser and an architect of the present U. S. Viet Nam policy (and himself a former Dean of Harvard) had agreed to engage in an open debate with the dissenting professors some of them America's top authorities on Chinese and Soviet affairs. But at the very last moment today, Mr. Bundy failed to appear pleading urgent official duties.

The professors thought that Mr. Johnson had advised him to stay away but they were polite enough not to say so publicly. The Government position was nevertheless defended by an able team of top academicians including historian Arthur Schlesinger jr. former presidential assistant. The dissenters' view as outlined by such eminent personalities as Dr. Hans Morgenthau and Mr. Isaac Deutscher was that the U. S. had no right to be in Viet Nam working against the mainstream of Asian nationalism and that it was in

gross violation of the Geneva accord.

Policy Errors

They also held that the present policy of trying to find military solution to the ills of Asia would inevitably lead to war with China. They believed that the U. S. presence in Viet Nam was based on a series of wrong premises and policy errors dating back to the end of the last war. Their greatest concern was that the U. S. policy would have the effect of proving Peking's hard line right and muting Moscow's moderate voice in Communist and world councils.

Supporters of Government position among the academicians seemed to be in a minority but they nevertheless marshalled equally convincing facts to prove that it was erroneous to consider the Viet Cong as nationalist. President Ho Chi Minh of North Viet Nam they believed would never emerge as another Tito. If the U. S. withdrew from Viet Nam as their opponents urged then China would start other "liberation wars" in other places.

They differed among themselves about some basic tenets of Government thinking. They were convinced that neither escalation nor U. S. withdrawal would be a solution. They supported Mr. Johnson's policy which was a mixture of force as well as willingness to negotiate and pointed out that it was the Communists and not U. S. which had spurned the non-aligned nations appeal.

Constructive Solutions

In the course of the debate both sides also advanced what they thought were constructive solutions for the Viet Nam crisis. Significantly both sides admitted there was considerable merit in the non-aligned (Continued on page 2)

PARTY POLITICS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE

Despite the great strides that have been made in the sphere of political advancement it is regrettable to note that evil tendencies have also appeared particularly in the affairs of the Public Service. It is axiomatically a truism that the Public Service must be maintained at a lofty level beyond the borders of isolated groups that are formed on the basis of party, race, religion or any similar label. Whether at the top or at the bottom, the Public Service must distinguish itself as devoted to duty and duty alone uninfluenced by any other consideration. The success of administration in any country has been due to the efficiency of the Public Service and this capacity for work can be acquired only by the Public Service being so instituted as not to be guided by the fluctuating fortunes of political parties.

The history of the Public Service of this country has been influenced at different stages by different set of circumstances. The constitutional changes had a direct effect on the Public Service. But with the growth of Party system there have been disconcerting changes even in the political outlook, tending towards indirect domination of the Public Service. And today we find that political quarrels are more in the Public Service than among others. Evidently the allegiance to political parties has been religiously maintained making distinctive groups differently functioning. Here lies the danger of the concept of democracy getting distorted and the ideal of duty losing its attraction. The

nations' appeal in general and in President Radha Krishnan's proposals for an Afro-Asian police force to supervise a cease fire in Viet Nam.
