## SRI SATYA SAI BABA

### Avatar's Grace (அருள்)

What a wonderful philanthropist Baba is! Once when he was in a group of devotees by the bank of Chitravathi river he noticed a lady crestfallen with sorrow. On enquiry he found that it was due to the loss of her spectacles. He immediately put his hand into the sand and got for her a replica of the glasses she had lost! There was an old devotee of Sri Krishna. His eyes were too presbyopic to read the Bhagavad Gita. Satya simply put his hand into the sand and procured a Gita with big bold types!! A D. Sc. who didn't know Sanskrit was sorry he couldn't study the Gita. Baba in a similar way got a Gita in Telugu!! It is a common sight to see barren couples coming to him for progeny. He just gives them a fruit or coconut and requests them to partake of it each half a fruit.

Once he was discussing with an anthropologist about the relationship of man to monkey. Baba held that the tailless ape living on trees was nearer man than that which lives on the ground. The anthropologist was wondering as to the exact shape of the monkey Baba referred to; when suddenly Baba created and gave an exact replica of that ape in wood!! Baba explained to the Sadhus of Sivananda Ashram that he creates all these in exactly the same way as we do, but in his case the time required is only a fraction of a second. His mere Sankalpa creates the object. We shall give another instance to show the new method he adopts in these creations. This took place when he was only fourteen just when he refused to go to school and said goodbye to his relations, i.e. when he decided to

give his whole time in service to us. He was staying in the garden of an excise inspector, who had deeply felt the divine mission of this boy; Satya was surrounded not only by his college mates and teachers, but by many members of the public. A photographer came on the scene and before taking a 'snap' wanted Satya to remove a big stone that was lying just in front of him. He refused and in the photograph the form of Sai Baba of Shirdi (near Bombay) replaced the stone. What does this show? Satya by his mano-sakti created the form of Sai Baba, but just stopped short of bringing his creation down to the physical, for no one could see Sai Baba's form on the physical plane. Does this not, dear reader, impress on you that his creation is done by his mere wish (will or Sankalpa)?

He has acted not only as a mother (அம்மா) but as an accoucheur in cases of child birth. It is a common experience with mothers who were ill with a wrong lie (position) of the baby delaying the birth to get well with his help. Satya would go in his Sukshma Sarika and without the immediate knowledge of the patient correct the lie of the baby. There was an instance when a mother was ill in hospital with high fever for five days without the placenta and cord (after-birth) having come out. This is a very serious condition since the placenta would have decayed inside the womb causing septicaemic fever. Satya went in his Sukshma Sarika and waited (invisibly) till the placenta and cord came out in full. In such serious instances, Satya shows his presence

by materialising holy ash. When an obstetrician removes such a decayed placenta he can do so only in pieces and in an unsatisfactory way, since tiny pieces stick to the womb. A hot medicated intra-utrine douche has to be given to remove these tiny bits; but in this case the placenta in its entirety had come out and the fever went down and recovery was extremely quick.

He had operated on a case of duodenal ulcer successfully, but invisibly. An X-Ray was not necessary to prove the cure, since the patient could take any food as any normal person without distress. He has a knack of taking on a disease himself. A doctor near Madurai suddenly complained of bleeding from his ear and severe pain. Baba experienced a little bleeding and a little pain at the same time. The doctor wrote to Baba the time of the illness and the mysterious way in which the whole matter cleared up. In this way Baba had taken on himself typhoid fever, mumps, diarrhoea, colic and even hemiplegia. This is a common feature in Baba's life and therefore the diseases he elects to take upon himself is legion. He cures himself easily. There was a case of stroke (a stroke results in Hemiplegia) which he attended out of the body; in fact the daughter and son-in-law of the patient were at Puttaparthi for Dasaratha Festival. Since more than one telegram had come that he was very serious Baba had created holy ash and sent it through the son-in-law by train. Since later Baba found that the train would not go in time he went out of the body and gave the holy ash to the patient and the cure was quick. It is interesting to note that the holy ash sent through the son-in-law was the one which Baba had mysteriously taken away from him without his knowledge and given to the patient.

**No thief can steal Baba's creations. They come back to Baba mysteriously**

A devotee, while returning to Hyderabad from Puttaparthi, discovered that her trunk had been stolen at night near Mahbubnagar. She reported to the Railway Police. Two days later she was called upon to identify the trunk and verify its contents since the thief was apprehended with the trunk. Every article was intact except the Japamala that Baba had created for her! A wire was sent to Baba who informed her that it had returned to him!! He later sent it to her. We have read that articles created by lesser beings dematerialise and go back to the elements out of which they (articles) were created; but never this. Doesn't this alone reveal the unique divinity of Baba. This is only one out of many cases. Another devotee [N. C. P.] was given a talisman created by Baba.
